## RATES OF POSTAGE.

LETTERS not exceeding 1-2 ounce in weight, to any part of the United States, not over 3000 miles, 3 cents. If over 3000 miles, 10 cents. (California and Oregon, 10 cents.) Letters weighing over 1-2 ounce, and not over 1 ounce, double these rates. *Must be prepaid in all cases.*

**DROP LETTERS,** 1 cent. May be prepaid or not.

**ADVERTISED LETTERS,** 1 cent, in addition to the regular rates.

**VALUABLE LETTERS** may be registered by application at the office of mailing, and the payment of a registration fee of 5 cents.

TO CANADA and other British North American Provinces, when not over 3000 miles, 10 cents for each 1-2 ounce. When over 3000 miles, 15 cents. Prepayment optional.

TO GREAT BRITAIN or Ireland, 24 cents; but if sent to or from California or Oregon, 29 cents. Prepayment optional.

TO FRANCE, 15 cents for each 1-4 ounce. Prepayment optional.

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**NEWSPAPERS, Periodicals, Unsealed Circulars,** or other articles of printed matter (except books), when sent to any part of the United States, and weighing not over 3 ounces, 1 cent, and for every additional ounce, or part thereof, 1 cent. If within the State, and not weighing over 1 1-2 ounces, 1-2 cent.

**WEEKLY NEWSPAPERS** (one copy only) sent to actual Subscribers within the County where printed and published, FREE.

**PRINTED BOOKS,** bound or unbound, not weighing over 4 lbs., for any distance under 3000 miles, 1 cent per oz.; over 3000 miles, 2 cents per oz. The above must be prepaid.

**DIAGUERROTYPES** will be charged with letter postage by weight.

**NO PACKAGE** will be forwarded (except books) which weighs over 3 pounds.

The two daily tides may occur either during the same morning, or during the same afternoon. In the tide columns of these papers the asterisk (\*) denotes the second morning tide, and the oblique (/) the first afternoon tide of the day when so occurring. Finally, the larger tide of the day is distinguished by the letter (L), and the smaller by (s).

marched to Amanale about  
four miles from Alexandria -  
Here we encamped about  
about 5 P.M. and pitched  
our tent. I had with my  
jaccavates, but a good  
supper and taking possession  
of desert here

THURSDAY 28

First night in camp -  
order to march in -  
immediately as morning was  
new - order commenced

SUNDAY 31

Arrived at the height and got  
in battle array - then took the  
position right at a distance  
which exploded - named very  
loud at times - no battle  
order in sight but heard command  
to withdraw with possession of good  
desert ground about where we  
encamped



MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 1862.

On my way to a creek expecting  
to find some occurrences - but  
no Rebels were seen. I went  
to the bridge with my horse  
trying to get to a good place  
to cross it, but a terrible storm  
set in about 5 which prevented  
any crossing. I was then  
driven to the other side. At  
we started for Danville. The road  
is very bad but will hold out.

TUESDAY 2

at 5 am we started on horse  
back about 2 miles from Danville  
the army at this  
time was about 7000. Light  
mist and fog - I started  
on horse back - I was  
in the morning found a  
creek - I then started  
for the road - the rear  
guard was about 10 miles  
behind me. I saw  
a few Rebels in the  
woods - at 11 pm we  
were near the  
Cemetery in Alexandria.

WEDNESDAY 3

Here we encamped

Stood at Camp near Barnston  
had. Was in battle array expected  
but nothing appeared to me  
and - started this afternoon

after the Rebels had

very cold night -

Started at 5 1/2 AM  
Engaged Rebels on Blue Ridge Mt  
above - Terrible slaughter on  
Rebels side - Lost 200 boys  
prisoners - On Ref. Lost 10  
Killed 745 wounded - The  
battle was a terrific one  
resulting in the death  
of the Rebels who lost a battery

MONDAY 15

Was detailed to remain in  
the hospital with Dr. Johnson  
at Valley, N. Warren - Mo - all day  
to drive 70 patients - The  
Rebels came again this  
morning - Marched with  
me to Middleway.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 1862.

Our patient are doing very  
well. Amputated arm  
arrived for Capt. Elkhart of  
16<sup>th</sup> Regt. Successes very well  
and patient doing well -  
Went over the battle field  
and saw many dead Rebels

This morning the <sup>General</sup> came and the <sup>Staff</sup> ~~Staff~~ returned to cheer us up after the past three dreadful days. Passed a very restless night the ground being perfectly saturated with the recent rains.

SATURDAY 22

This morning the Sun came forth in all his glory - The weather is quite warm and on to Richmond is again heard throughout the land.

SUNDAY 23

Here at Staffs Civil House the weather has been and cold. This morning I ordered mess in camp. It was present ~~by~~ by the hands and several officers. It was a very imposing scene.
