Granting an increase of pension to William B Kinsey

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to place on the pension roll the name of William B. Kinsey late Lt. Colonel one hundred and Sixty-first regiment New York Volunteer Infantry - and pay him the sum of ~~fifty~~ dollars per month from and after the passage of this act -

He is now on pension roll at rate of fifteen dollars per month, invalid certificate number two hundred and fifty-five thousand nine hundred and twenty one - Reissue act of February 6th - 1907 -

Enlisted May 1861 - 1st Sgt C. A. 23rd New York Regt. - promoted to 1st Lt & Adjutant and Lt. Col of the 161st New York Vols - discharged Sept 1865 - He is unable to do any manual labor by reason of rupture & age disability age 73 yrs -
