The Battalion garrisoned Forts Carroll, Greble, and Snyder from the 4<sup>th</sup> of October 1862 to the 30<sup>th</sup> of May 1863, Companies I. & L. were stationed at Fort Carroll - Company M at Fort Greble, Company K at Fort Snyder, Headquarters of Battalion at Fort Carroll, Capt H. L. Smith, by virtue of rank commanded until Nov 9<sup>th</sup> 1862 when he was relieved by Major G. F. Merriam -

On the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May the battalion marched into Virginia across the Aqueduct Bridge to the Fort near the Red House, now Fort C. F. Smith

Upon the arrival of the battalion a heavy fatigue detail was put to work upon the fort which was unfinished - The armament was shortly after put in - The Red House which stood in the ditch in front of the fort was demolished. During the last days of June the battalion took arms at 3. A. M. and stood at the guns until day - sending a heavy picket - also to the front. which rendered a surprise next to impossible -
