JOHN FREDRICK BISBEE
b.1834 d. 1891
son of Lucien Ira Bisbee & Maria Elizabeth Bower

J.F.B., son of Lucien Ira, was born in Ogdensburg, NY Nov. 22, 1834. Studied at Trinity College, Colubia College and West Point.

He was commissioned First Lieutenant in the 62nd Regiment, N.Y.State Volunteers on Nov. 22, 1834. He was commissioned Captain on May 31, 1862 of Co E., Col Andersons Brooklyn Volunteers (Zouaves) and honorably discharged on Mar. 27, 1863. He fought in the battles of Yorktown, Williamsburg, Seven Pines, Fair Oaks, Malvern Hill, Turkey Bend, Second Bull Run, Antietam, First Fredericksburg, also skirmishes at Warnick Court, Horse Bottoms Bridge, Goldnip Farm and Williamsport. In one of these battles he was shot in the leg but was not aware of the fact until evening came and his colored attendant found his masters boot full of blood. His regiment suffered severely and only thirteen of his company lived through the war.

On Aug 10, 1862, Lt. Bisbee was ordered to inspect the condition of 3 Public Mules by order of Brig. Gen'l Howe. Two of them had distemper and one was so badly cut

on his leg that they had to be shot and them and their equipment buried to prevent contagion. It was noted that they should have had better care.

Capt. Bisbee was a 32nd degree mason and was for some time master of the lodge at Brooklyn, NY. One of the founders of the Phoenix Fire Insurance Co. of Brooklyn.

As Grammie was walking down the street with John one day in June 15, 1891, he dropped dead beside her. He was only 57. The shock turned her hair white overnight. In 1890 J.F.B. and Grammie bought a farm on College Place, Springfield Gardens, LI, N.Y.. Dec. 31, 1905 while she and Rudy and May were in Florida for the winter. The house caught fire and burned to the ground. The home was being occupied by Mr. and Mrs. George Kinsey, her daughter and their 3 year old son John. Also Mr. & Mrs Joseph S Higbie and their 5 year old son, Vinton The house had cost \$12,000.00 to build in 1877. Very expensive for the times.

Gleaned from Title delivered to JF B. "All the certain farm, piece and parcel of land with the buildings and improvements ___ situate at Springfield in the town of Jamaica , Queens County and State of New York. Beginning at a point on the easterly side of the Springfield road distant 183 feet _____ westerly line or along the New York Rockway Rail Road of Long Island. Etc.

Robert A. Bisbee his wife Ethyl Redhead and sister Helen Bisbee lived in their home on the same property and had just gone home from visiting when the fire was discovered. The Springfield Chemical Company and the Springfield Hose both responded but the fire was too far gone to save.

Harriet Lucinda Atwood, "Grammie" met and married John Frederick Bisbee in Ascutney, Vermont, Nov. 30, 1852, when she was 18. He was a widower with four children by his first wife, Eliza O'Brien. They were: John Frederick, Lucien Jarvis, Evelyn, Lillian and an unnamed infant. (One of my notes said he was named Louis.) He and Grammie had eight more: Harriet Atwood, Ethel, Robert Atwood, Herbert Frederick, Helen Adele, Mabel Winifred or May Atwood (b Brooklyn, NY 6/7/1882 and Rudolph Valentine.
