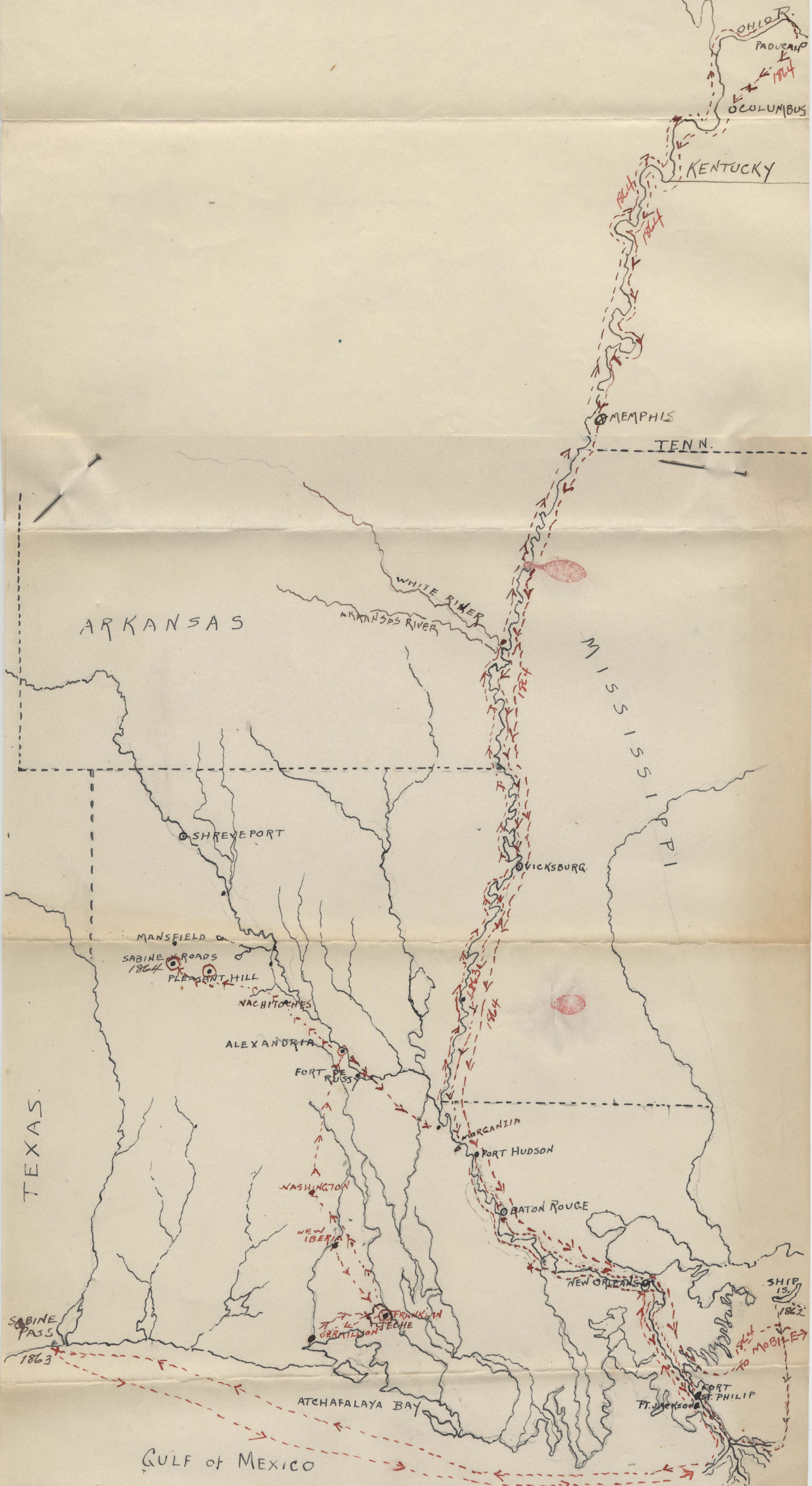

1862

To Fairfax, Va. Then to Alexandria; to Fredericksburg; to Orange Court House; to Fredericksburg; to Culpepper Court House, Va. Then detailed on recruiting service at Elmira, N. Y. Discharged for promotion to Adjutant 161st N. Y. which was organized at Elmira, Then to New York City. November 1862 camped where the Post Office now stands. Then to Long Island. Then in November, on board the Steamer Northern Light, to New Orleans, La.

Landed at Baton Rouge, La. Then to Port Hudson, via Plain's Store. Down the Mississippi River to Donaldsonville. Then to Cox's Plantation; to Donaldsonville; to Sabine River, Texas, by steamer. Then to Morganza, La. on Mississippi River; to New Iberia; back to Franklin, La. for camp winter 1863 - 1864

By way of Alexandria to Sabine Cross Roads, La. Back to Mississippi River via Alexandria to Morganza. Then to Vicksburg; to mouth of Mobile Bay to aid Farragut; to Paducah, Ky.; to Columbus, Ky.; Then to Memphis, Tenn; to island at mouth of White River, Ark.; to New Orleans; to Mobile Bay and to Spanish Fort and Blakeley. Then had the honor of being the first at the head of brigade to occupy the city of Mobile: Then to Barrancas, Fla.; to Appalachicola, Fla.; back to Barrancas and Pensacola; to Tallahassee; to Jacksonville, Fla.
