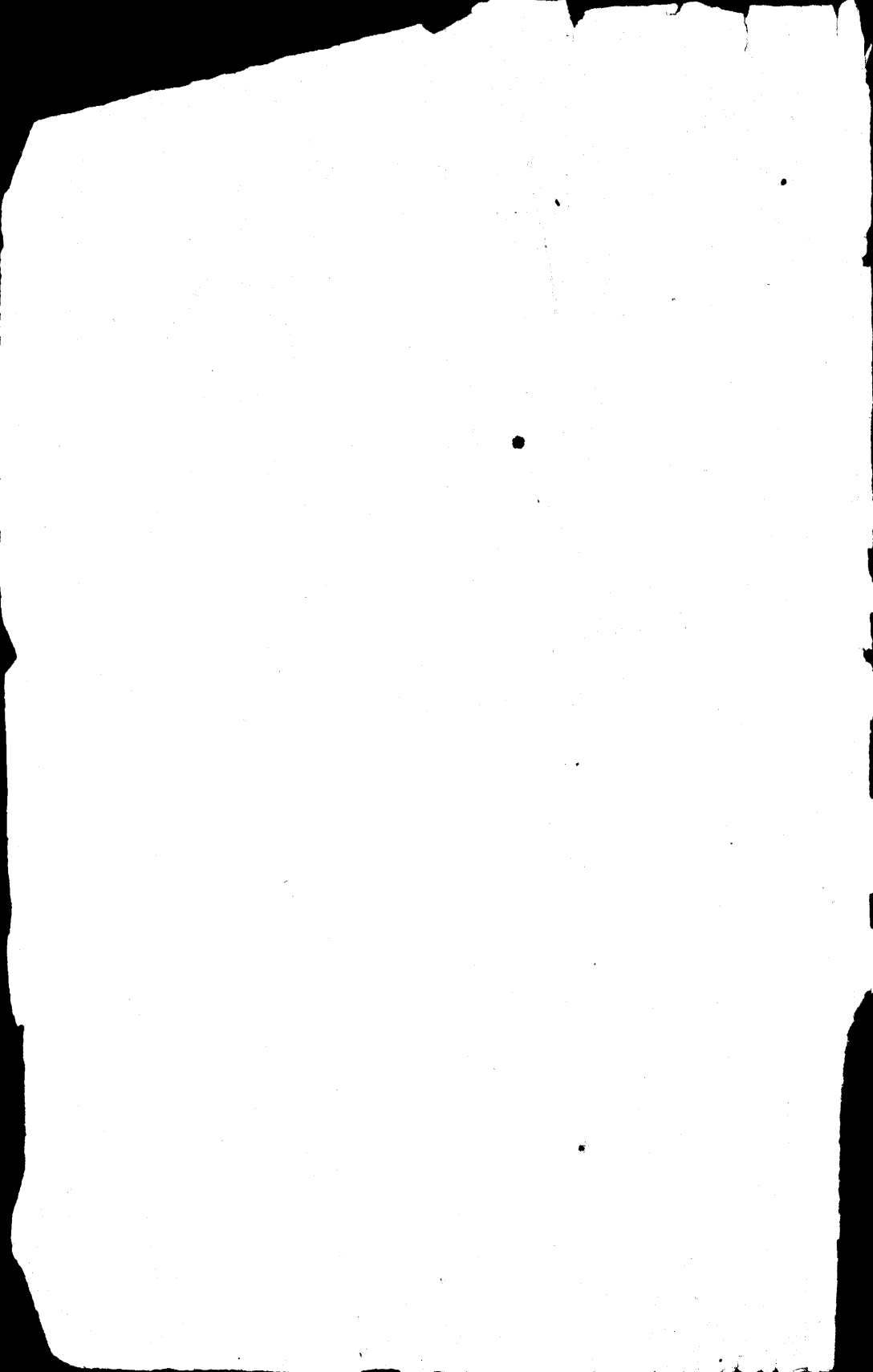

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REPORT.

To his Excellency E. D. MORGAN,
Commander-in-Chief of the military forces of the State of N. Y.:

Sir: Pursuant to the provisions of the law of Congress, "establishing a uniform militia throughout the United States," I have the honor to submit the following

REPORT:

The organized portion of the militia of the State has, during the past year, made marked improvement in discipline and military information.

When compared with its condition during and prior to the year 1857, it is certainly entitled to much praise for its present attitude, and for the evidences of zeal which pervades its ranks.

Notwithstanding that the relief which the present defective law affords has always been greatly inadequate to meet the heavy pecuniary demands upon the force, and that the general regulations have recently largely increased these demands, the militia has passed through the trying year of 1858 with honor and credit.

To one interested in the development of our militia, and aware of the additional burthens in time and money which these regulations have heaped upon it, this intelligence cannot be otherwise than gratifying, betokening as it does a degree of military ardor throughout the State, hopeful in the extreme.

It must be confessed, that when the general regulations were promulgated, it was greatly to be feared that they would fall much short of the mark sought to be attained by them,—not that they were not a proper compilation of sufficiently exact and effective rules, based upon the present advanced state of military science, but because the militia, for whose government they were intended, assimilated but slightly with that kind of force requiring the most stringent rules to preserve it in anything like a state of effectiveness, and these regulations partook somewhat of the character of such rules.

However, great reliance was to be placed upon the native intelligence and enlightenment of the citizens comprising the militia, and upon the fact that a force pervaded by the sentiment that it is as honorable to *obey* as it

is to *command*, would surely appreciate the necessity of exact discipline in the control of any military body whatsoever.

Still, there was another fear, more serious if anything than that to be apprehended in the paradox of sovereignty controlled and yet being sovereign, namely: the fear that these regulations had imposed duties of a sedentary character in the various grades of the force quite beyond the possibility of accomplishment by men whose daily avocations were diverse from the pursuit of arms; but the experience of the past year has demonstrated that these fears were in the main groundless.

Indeed, it may be safely averred that the general regulations have met with a hearty welcome from the force, and that, if the improvement which they already have inaugurated, be a harbinger of the future, the militia cannot but prove a grand school for the cultivation of the citizen soldier in the arts of war, and that the State, while having at hand the means for the instant suppression of her own disorders, will be ever ready with her quota of instructed men to respond to the Union's call for volunteers.

To achieve this in a land where, from the genius of its institutions a large standing army is impossible, is surely wise and commendable, and the exertions now being put forth to direct the militia towards this end seem to be worthy of something more at the hands of the State, than the trifling encouragement they have hitherto received.

The Mexican campaign has happily demonstrated the practicability of the employment of volunteers to fight the battles of the nation; and further, that with such troops, if properly officered, there need be no apprehension for liberty though combined Europe were the foe. Is it not advisable, then, in the absence of any other feasible mode, so to organize, instruct, and maintain the militia, that when the necessity is at our doors, *officers*, as well as the *muscle* of war, will be equally at hand?

It should be remembered that European armies are no less remarkable for their huge proportions than they are distinguished for their discipline, the perfection of their engineering of war, and for their thorough knowledge of its science, constituting a foe altogether different from that which strove to defend against our arms the halls of the Montezumas.

To successfully contend in the present day against an army such as coalesced Europe could send to our shores, a force of at least 600,000 would be no less the instant necessity than that such force be under the lead and management of accomplished and skillful officers. But where, at a moment's call, are these officers to be found, if not in the ranks of the militia? Bounty acts and land warrants may supply the rank and file of an army of whatever proportions the exigency may demand; but they are powerless to produce officers having accomplishments requisite for battle against European troops.

It is true that we are not without some relief in our noble Military Academy at West Point, which, however, though it stands unparalleled throughout the world, in the extent and method of its instruction, and in the brilliant results it has achieved through its *élèves*, furnishes no more

than the officers yearly needed to supply the vacancies of the regular force, and could not in years produce the 30,000 officers requisite for such an army had the contingency arrived for its formation.

The truth is, the militia is the real army of the land, and it is from its ranks that this great addition of officers must be derived. Then, is it not apparent to every one, that Congress and the States of the Union should be aroused to the necessity of establishing the militia upon such a basis that it may afford the proper bulwark of defense?

Happily, however, the contingency of war is so remote, that it may perhaps be considered somewhat premature to call attention to the need of a proper militia; yet, whether it be remote or near, it does seem to be wise to maintain the militia upon such a footing that, in the way of *officers*, at least, we shall be more nearly on a par with the European world.

To attain this end, a large and cumbrous militia in each State, is a gross absurdity. No one will pretend, in the present day, that, for the purposes of a mobile force, the militia, as such, will ever be drafted into the service of the United States. If required at all in war, its services will only be demanded to meet contingencies for which it was impossible in other ways to provide, while doubtless the main dependence will be placed upon volunteers and enlisted troops. Besides, a large militia is by far too great a tax in time and money upon the people of any State, and invariably proves an ignorant and unwieldy mass, into which it is as difficult to infuse zeal as it is impossible to impart military knowledge.

In every State there are large numbers of citizens who, from pure military zeal alone, are willing to abstract from their vocations time enough to devote to the acquirement of military information, and from a thousand motives other than a desire to don the insignia of command, or to swell the ranks of a quasi military and a quasi social body, are ready to assume the real duties of the soldier, with the patriotic view of being ready to suppress the disorders of a time of peace, and to maintain the public liberties in a time of war.

Experience has shown that, in our State, at least, there are large numbers of such men, who, in obedience to this spirit, will organize into military bodies, whether pursuant to, or independent of the law; and the State has wisely recognized the existence of this spirit.

By the act of 1846, it swept from its statute books laws which sought to foster what had been proved an impossible militia, and addressed itself to the development of a militia, based upon the predilection of the individual. By this act it inaugurated a system which, if properly sustained by the State, will accomplish the great purposes of a citizen military.

Already in lieu of divisions upon divisions, brigades upon brigades, and regiments upon regiments of a tatterdemalion militia, we have a condensed and mobile body of uniformed troops, comprising eight divisions, twenty-six brigades and sixty-two regiments, armed, equipped, and passibly well disciplined for service.

Numerous and conflicting statutes have given place to a codified law,

and the ignorance of other days has, to a degree, been dissipated by the distribution of books of manœuvre for the various arms, while a complete system of general regulations serves to correct that wherein the law and tactics prove deficient.

In all this the State of New York, it must be confessed, has set for the sister States an example worthy of all commendation. Still there remains much to be done both by the State and the force itself, if our militia is to realize the hopes now entertained for its accomplishment.

With regard to the law, the *commutation system* it enacts, has, after a patient and faithful trial, proved the merest sham, whether from the cumbersome machinery which is employed in its collection, or from the people's disgust at a per capita tax, it is impossible to say; but one thing is certain, that where thousands were expected, hundreds only have been reaped, and these hundreds have brought with them so much of odium, that it were better by far to sacrifice the system than to jeopardize the present organization of the force.

So also with regard to the *pay system* of the law, which, while it excites hopes, happily impossible of realization, and gives rise to unjust suspicions of corruption in the management of the military fund, opens wide the door to mercenaries, and is in a variety of ways uncompromisingly hostile to the growth of an honorable and enlightened militia.

However, while the repeal of these systems is earnestly recommended, it is not to be desired that the State, with regard to her militia, should utterly refrain from performing her share of loyalty to the Union. Let her testify her sense of its value in other ways than by the exercise of sovereignty in the simple passage of a militia law which would have but little vitality were it not for the patriotism of the people. Let her, as an integral portion of the Union, acknowledging the utter impotency of the land, come forward, even at this late day, when America is no longer a light under a bushel, and vigorously do her part toward preparing for the common defense; let her at once determine to share with the militia a part of the heavy burthens of its existence by assuming to pay the ordinary necessary expenses of her regiments, such as for armory rent, fuel, light, music, and the printing of their orders. Let her for this purpose direct the supervisors of counties to levy such a tax upon property as will realize for the troops within their bounds the sum of 1,500 dollars per regiment, and by a rigid system of accounting, secure for it a proper disbursement.

Another means towards perfecting our present system, and which seems to be no less just than desirable, would be an amendment to the law whereby succession to command shall be based upon military fitness, and shall have its origin in promotion from the ranks. To supply vacancies in the non-commissioned grade there might be annually an examination by the company officers, of such members of their respective commands as may present themselves as candidates for promotion. Those who may have been found most proficient in a knowledge of their duties in reference to

the *school of the soldier*, and *company formations* might be at once warranted to the extent of the vacancies to be supplied.

In cases where more shall have passed examination than there were vacancies to fill, a list of such should be preserved, graduated as to proficiency, and from which all future vacancies should first be supplied.

So, also, with regard to company officers; the field officers of the regiment might assemble annually for the examination of such as might present themselves for promotion to these posts. Those evincing the greatest proficiency in a knowledge of *company formations* and *battalion manœuvres* might be returned to the brigadiers as proper persons to fill the company vacancies of the regiment, while such as remain over might be graduated upon a list for future promotion to the respective grades to which they had aspired.

With equal propriety this system could be extended to the rank of field officers, the examining officers being the major and the brigadier generals of the district, and the knowledge requisite, that of *battalion manœuvres*, and of the *evolutions of the line*, reserving the vacancies in the grade of general officers to be supplied by the Commander-in-Chief, by appointment from the rank of senior colonels, who being already in position by virtue of proficiency, would doubtless possess the proper qualifications for these high and honorable grades.

In regard to the staff, however, this system would admit of some variation. In the Adjutant General's Department, division and brigade inspectors might be examined with field officers, and adjutants along with captains. But in the pay and quartermasters' department, in lieu of examination, the requisite might be that the appointee had already passed an examination for some post in the line, while for the medical department the applicant should be in the enjoyment of a proper professional reputation.

The grades of regimental paymaster and engineer might be *safely* abolished, and the brigade, as well as the division engineers, be required to submit to an examination before the board instituted by the law of 1858. Then, if the heads of departments were selected from their respective department, or, where appropriate, from the colonels of the line, the system would be complete, which it may not be hazarding too much to say, if coupled with the annual bonus of \$1,500 per regiment, would place the militia of the State of New York in a position equal to any demand which could be legitimately made upon it.

By the report from this department for the year 1857, submitted in January of the year 1858, the militia was graduated at

For the year 1858 the militia is graduated at

and as comprising in the aggregate 18,107 officers and men, classified in the various arms, as follows :

Of artillery, (all light, horse and foot,) 126 companies and 5,760 officers and men.

By a comparison of the above statements, it will be discovered that, notwithstanding a disbandment of two brigades and five regiments, the force has been increased sixteen hundred and seventy-three men.

It will be observed, also, that there is apparently a large increase in the artillery arm. This, however, is only apparent. Last year the various arms of service were classified with reference to the actual arm in which the troops did service. This year pains have been taken to classify by the arm of organization.

Out of one hundred and twenty-six companies, organized as artillery, there are sixty-two actually doing duty as infantry, or light infantry, and should be fairly considered as infantry companies.

For a knowledge of the various arms and accoutrements in the hands of the troops, reference is made to the table annexed, marked (A.) The tables marked respectively (B and C) show the amount of commutation collected in the various counties of the State, and the mode and extent of its disbursement by the military. The quota of arms due the State from the general government for the year 1858, amounting in the equivalent of muskets at \$13 each, to

and was drawn in long range rifle muskets, calibre 69 hundredths of an inch, to the extent of 1,323 muskets, at the rate of \$14.865 per musket. Prior to the year 1857 it had been the practice of the government of the United States to transmit to this State, on its quotas, either the flint lock musket, or those altered from the flint to the percussion principle, but during that year, upon representations from this office, the present able head of the Ordnance Department, Colonel H. K. Craig, of the United States Army, hampered as he was by laws and *red tape* regulations of the most *ante-Crimean* type, had the good sense to discover that, after all, there was latitude enough in the rules governing his department to admit of his transmitting to the State other than worthless weapons, and to *urge* upon the Secretary of War the propriety of issuing to the militia arms of a more improved pattern than those which served the exigencies of the government in the war of 1812. In this endeavor Colonel Craig was eminently successful, as the muskets of the quota of 1858 most fully attest. Besides this quota, there have been received of the United States government 1,000 Minie muskets—calibre 58 hundredths—of the model of 1855, together with 1,000 sets of accoutrements, in exchange for property of an equal value, which had hitherto been received from the general government. Of the sum of thirteen thousand dollars received from the general government, and appropriated by the Legislature for military purposes, there remained, at the date of the last annual report from this department, a balance of,..... \$3,926 62 and which has been expended as follows, under the direction of this department:

In addition to the sum specified in this account as expended for Tactics, there was also a further sum of \$600 provided by the supply bill, disbursed in the purchase of these works, making a sum of \$1,654, which procured for distribution,

These Tactics, together with 2,800 copies of the General Regulations, have been distributed to the militia, as also have the drums mentioned in the account.

One of the best evidences of the improvement which has taken place in the forces, is to be found in the increased number of inspection returns which have been transmitted to this office for the year 1858, indicating thereby somewhat of the zeal which animates the present organization.

While there were *sixteen* delinquent inspectors for the year 1857, there have been only *four* for the year 1858.

The names of the latter are as follows :

Major Anson H. Holmes, of the 17th brigade, whereof Brig. Gen. George E. Danforth is commandant.

Major Samuel P. Russell, of the 19th brigade, whereof Brig. Gen. Zadock T. Bentley is commandant.

Major William Emerson, of the 29th brigade, whereof Brig. Gen. Silas M. Burroughs is commandant, and the 31st brigade, whereof Brig. Gen. Gustavus A. Scroggs is commandant, of which the inspector's office is vacant.

The returns of these inspections will be found consolidated in the table annexed, marked (D).

From the reports accompanying the returns of the inspecting officers, pursuant to paragraph 532 of the General Regulations, it is apparent that there has been a marked advance over former years in the discipline and effectiveness of the service, to be ascribed mainly to the operation of these Regulations. Several of the more detailed of these reports are hereto annexed, marked (E, F, G, H, I, J, and K,) to which especial attention is directed. From these reports there is also gathered a fact long known to this office, that the muskets in the hands of the troops are chiefly of the most unserviceable description. During the years 1857 and 1858 there were drawn from the general government, of small arms 1,000 cadet muskets, 100 long range rifles, with sword bayonets, 960 long range rifle muskets, with the Maynard priming attachment, and 1,323 long range rifle muskets, (of model of 1840,) in all 3,383 arms of all descriptions, to which if there be added the quota of 1859, namely : 830 long range rifle muskets, calibre 58 hundredths of an inch, with Maynard's attachment, model of 1855, 400 long range rifles with sword bayonets, and 100 cadet muskets, drawn some years since, and 1,500 original percussion muskets, purchased during the year 1855, and 1,000 long range rifle muskets, calibre 58, obtained from the United States Government, in exchange for other military property, returned last year, it will appear that the whole number of *really* serviceable arms in the hands of the troops, amounts to 7,213 arms, which only effectively arms but a small part of 18,000 troops.

Pursuant to paragraph 527 of the general regulations, several reports have been received from the Brigadier Generals. Where so much has been accomplished by inspecting and regimental officers, it appears as strange as

it is regretable, that more of these valuable reports had not been received from officers of this grade.

There have been organized during the past year fifty-four companies :

- 27 of the infantry arm,
- 8 of the rifle arm,
- 17 of the artillery arm, and
- 2 of the cavalry arm,

as will appear more fully from the statement annexed, marked (L.)

The year 1858, like its predecessor, has not passed without the troops of the first division having been called into special service to suppress disturbances. On the 7th day of September last, the Commander-in-Chief, Governor John A. King, pursuant to a proclamation issued by him, called into service 250 officers and men of this division, and directed them to proceed to the Quarantine station, Staten Island, and there to defend the property of the State against the further incendiary attempts of a lawless mob.

The detachment which had the honor first to respond to division orders, was from the 8th regiment, and was commanded by Colonel George Lyons, the commandant of the regiment.

This detachment, on the 12th day of September, in the midst of a drenching rain, took up in admirable order its line of march for the Quarantine, accompanied by Captain Varian's troop, belonging to the regiment, in charge of two 12 pound howitzers, and encamped on a site prepared for it just outside of and adjacent to the Quarantine enclosure. It here remained to the 27th of September, and was relieved by a similar detachment from the 6th regiment, under Colonel Joseph C. Pinckney, in person, which in turn was relieved after a service of ten days, on the 6th of October, by a detachment from the 71st, under Colonel Abram S. Vosburgh, in person, who, in turn, after thirteen days service, was similarly relieved on the 18th of October by a detachment from the 69th, Colonel James R. Ryan commanding, which, in fifteen days' time, was succeeded, November 1st, by a detachment of 125 officers and men of the 55th, under Col. Eugene LeGal, who, after fifteen days in camp, was relieved on the 15th of November by a detachment of the 5th, Colonel Schwarzwald, which was again followed, after a service of fifteen days, on the 29th of October, by Colonel Henry Robinson, with a detachment of the 2d regiment; and it again, on the 15th of December, after a seventeen days tour, by one from the 11th, commanded by Colonel Homer Bostwick, who was succeeded, after twenty days' service, on the 3d of January, 1859, by a detachment of the 7th regiment, under Colonel Abram Duryea. This officer, after a few hours' sojourn at

Quarantine, returned to the city of New York, in obedience to division orders issued pursuant to orders from the general head-quarters, terminating the special service at Quarantine.

During the three months and twenty-two days of this special service, the troops employed in the performance of it were subjected to the privations inseparable from a soldier's life, unrelieved by the excitement and hopes which the achievements of an active campaign afford. But it must be said, to their praise, that they took to the field like men enured to other hardships than those which have already given the troops of the 1st division a military preëminence in the State, and have gained for them so much of honor.

For this service, so admirably performed, and for that rendered frequently upon other occasions, these reliable men—the troops of the 1st division—are entitled to the respect and confidence of every lover of order and good government in the land.

This service has not been performed without considerable expense to the State. The pay of the troops alone will reach the sum of \$33,000, while the other incidental expenses it is certain will not fall much short of a similar amount.

The proclamation of the Governor, and the orders for the service and discharge of the troops, are hereto annexed, marked (M, N, O.)

All of which, together with the annexed annual report of the Judge Advocate General, is respectfully submitted.

First Regiment, Cavalry.—This regiment having allowed the time to expire, within which they had the privilege of adopting a new uniform, were obliged to conform to the State regulation, which is essentially the U. S. Dragoon uniform, to which they are now fast changing. Under Lt. Colonel Smith (Col. Ryer being on furlough) the regiment is rapidly improving in drill and discipline.

On inspection day they performed several manœuvres very creditably, Capt. Murphy's troop being most worthy of mention.

Second Regiment, Infantry.—Is largely reduced in numbers from last year, owing to the change in uniform, heavy drafts and transfers of rifle companies to the 11th regiment, and defection of the old Scotch companies. As has already been stated, they have adopted a new uniform, which is tasteful and becoming, and which has vastly improved the soldier-like appearance of the regiment.

They have just returned from the camp at Quarantine, where they have been stationed for the last two weeks, and where they performed their duties with credit to the State, and with satisfaction and improvement to themselves.

Upon inspection they performed the battalion movements required in general orders, though in a somewhat slovenly manner, and they appeared in their old uniform. Col. Robinson, however, promises great improvement by the next annual inspection.

Third Regiment, (Hussars).—This regiment is also greatly reduced in numbers since last year, and there appears to be an entire absence of unity and military spirit among the officers.

Although, as may be seen by the return, the field and staff are entirely full, not one of these officers, with the single exception of Lt. Col. Menck, appeared upon the ground on inspection day; and he was forced to take Capt. Hencken (a very good officer) from his company to act as Adjutant in the formation of the regiment. * * * * *

Seventy-first Regiment, Light Infantry.—This regiment was inspected while doing camp duty at Quarantine, Staten Island. They did not per-

form all the movements required of them, from the fact that they had but lately commenced drilling in light infantry (Hardee's) tactics, and the Light Guard (Company A) having been recently transferred to them, was even less intimately acquainted with the drill than the remainder of the regiment. The movements gone through with, however, were performed accurately and promptly.

The members of the regiment are entitled to much credit for the gentlemanly, as well as soldier-like manner, in which they performed their duties in camp, by which they gained the esteem of the law-abiding residents of Staten Island, as well as the respect of their brother soldiers of the division.

Under their efficient and pains-taking colonel, they are fast improving in discipline, and more especially in battalion drill, as well as in numbers.

The regiment is now fully equipped in a regimental uniform, with the exception of the new State button.

Seventy-third Regiment, Infantry.—Is attached to this brigade, and is composed entirely of residents of Richmond county, (Staten Island.)

On inspection day but four companies paraded, but they performed the movements required of them with precision and accuracy.

General FREDERICK TOWNSEND, *Adj. Gen. N. Y. S. M.*:

SIR—With this I have the honor to enclose inspection returns of the 4th, 5th and 6th regiments, composing the Second Brigade N. Y. S. M.

Brigadier General Yates and staff were inspected with the 4th Regiment—the general and members of the staff all present, fully uniformed and equipped according to the new regulations.

The 4th was inspected on Hamilton square, October 4. The regiment made a good appearance, and executed the evolutions required of them in a creditable manner. I can report the condition of the harness, &c., of this regiment, in no better language than that used by the colonel in the following letter, enclosed with his inspection returns, all of which I fully endorse.

He says: “In presenting the returns of the 4th Regiment, I must call your attention to the wretched condition of the harness. But six sets are fit to be used, and even these are not supplied with leading toggles. In fact, the entire harness of the battery should be replaced. The little that is in good order is of the old style, and has so much leather in it that the horse is loaded with useless leather, and has but little power left to be exerted on the carriage. If new harness is obtained, it should be constructed in accordance with the improved state of things; all the leather that is necessary to give the requisite strength should be there, but not an ounce more. In all our breakdowns (and they are many, on every parade), the leather has not given way, but the *sewing and ironwork*.

The omnibus harness is the model for light artillery. It is strong and simple, and will cost about one-half the amount of the present style.

The work done by the omnibus harness is as heavy as could be done by the present artillery harness; the actual working portion is *heavier*, but those parts which only *suspend* the working parts are much lighter. If the regiment is to improve on its present condition, it must have greater facilities afforded it for exercise with harness.

The brigade and division parades use up all its funds, and thus none is left for drills.

The result is, that the regiment is impoverished by *show* parades. More guns, better and more harness, and more room are needed now, and before the companies can improve in number or drill, they must be had.”

The 5th Regiment was inspected on Hamilton square, 11th October, at 10 A. M.

This regiment, as at present organized, consists of nine (9) companies, seven musket and two rifles. All but company D. have adopted the musket.

This regiment is much smaller in number than last year, owing to many having left on account of the change in uniform; but show *decided* improvement in drill and discipline.

Their performance of the evolutions prescribed in General Order No. was deserving of much praise, and even equalled any seen by the inspector during his inspections this fall. Still the different companies show the want of company drill.

This regiment has adopted a new uniform, and have all procured the new cap, except company D, who still retain the old cap, and are unwilling to change their uniform.

The officers expect to recruit rapidly after they have the new uniform, and without doubt will have regained the number lost during the past year, by the fall inspection of 1859. The uniforms and arms are in a bad condition, but I refrain from reporting particularly, as they are now changing their uniforms, and expect to receive new arms from the State.

For the purpose of showing the relative strength of the several companies, I give the number present and absent in each.

Company A, Captain D. Westfall.—Present 41, absent 21—total 62. Have adopted the new uniform, and are equipping. Have lost some members on account of change, but are now recruiting. Require drilling.

Company B, Captain H. Heitman.—Present 28, absent 24—total 52. Have adopted the new uniform, and are equipping. A well drilled and disciplined company.

Company C, Captain C. Finke.—Present 20, absent 16—total 36. Have adopted the new uniform. Are much in need of company drill.

Company D, Captain F. Grote.—Present 38, absent 19—total 57. A good company, with an excellent captain; well drilled. Have not adopted the new uniform, and now object to change either the uniform or rifles.

Company E, Lieutenant M. Cook.—Present 27, absent 12—total 39. Have adopted the uniform. Are in a bad state of drill and discipline.

Company F, Captain F. Heppenheimer.—Present 39, absent 15—total 54. One of the best captains and companies in the regiment. Have adopted the uniform, and are recruiting; well drilled.

Company G, Captain John Hingslaye.—Present 32, absent 1—total 33. Have adopted the uniform, and are in need of company drills very much. Company H, Captain F. Holster.—Present 27, absent 11—total 38. Officers and men all require drilling. Have adopted the new uniform.

Company I, Captain Frederick Krutina.—Present 14, absent 4—total 18. This company is the late engineer corps of the 5th. Have lost a

large part of the company by their being made a line company and changing the uniform, but what are left of them appeared in their new uniform, and are deserving of credit for their drill and discipline, and for the energy displayed in procuring the uniform so quickly; are recruiting.

The 6th Regiment was inspected at Camp Washington, Staten Island, 5th October, and was reviewed by the Commander-in-Chief, Inspector General, and Brig. Gen. Yates.

In consequence of so many reviews, it was impossible to execute all the evolutions prescribed by General Order No. 59, but those which were executed were done in so excellent a manner as to show conclusively, that the officers of this regiment have attended to the drilling of their commands during the past year.

The field officers are particularly entitled to commendation for their energy and attention to their duties. This regiment is small, but is second to none in efficiency and promptness in obeying orders, which has been shown by their action in changing their uniforms, and the performance of their duties at Camp Washington. The latter would have been creditable to a regiment in the regular service.

Company A is a recent organization, not quite a year old—consequently is deficient in company pride, drill and discipline. Much difficulty has existed in this company in regard to officers, it having had three lieutenants besides those now in commission. These changes have retarded its progress. It will doubtless improve rapidly hereafter, and it is composed of good men.

Company B is vacant, the men being transferred to other companies.

Company C is rather deficient in spirit, though fairly drilled, except in the loadings and firings; its members are limited, and its recruiting by no means rapid. It is at present without lieutenants.

Company D is increasing in strength rapidly, after a serious difficulty arising from a change of captains. Its improvement in drill, discipline and company pride, has been very great within the last half year—greater, indeed, than any other company in the regiment.

Company E, for the last two years, has been very badly officered. Its late captain was incompetent and insubordinate. At present, the company is without officers, and in a bad condition. Most of the men are ordinary, and disorderly. There are some, however, of a better class, who are desirous of organizing the company on a better basis.

Company F is equal to any company in regimental pride, and since its change of arm and uniform, is rapidly improving in drill and discipline. It is also recruiting.

Company G, recently transferred to the regiment, is in good condition. It is well disciplined, and very fairly drilled, except in the loadings and firings. Much of its former strength was lost by its change of regiment and uniform, but this will soon be regained.

Company H is at present the best company in the regiment. It is

efficient, strong and spirited, and determined, if possible, to hold its pre-eminence.

The recent encampment at Staten Island produced great improvement in the entire regiment, especially in its discipline and steadiness. As a whole, the 2d brigade has improved during the past year in discipline and drill; and, although smaller in number than at the last inspection, is in a more efficient state.

The change in uniform in the 5th and 6th regiment has induced many to resign, whose term of service had expired, but who would have served longer had they not been called upon to procure new uniforms. The different companies are now recruiting rapidly, and will soon recover what they have lost.

The inspector of the second brigade has the honor to report, that the several regiments composing this brigade, have made all the parades during the year, required of them by law.

The Brigadier General has also had the drills called for by the law, as well as paragraph 535 of the general regulations.

At the drill of the brigade, held on Hamilton Square, June 21st, the following evolutions were executed, viz :

1. Line of battle north side Hamilton Square.
2. By company right wheel.
3. Forward into line.
4. By the right of companies to the rear into column.
5. Into line, faced to the rear.
6. Change front forward on 3d battalion.
7. Change front to the rear on 3d battalion.
8. Close column by division, on 4th division 3d battalion, right in front, into column.
9. By battalion in mass, on 3d battalion deploy column.
10. On 1st division, 2d battalion, deploy masses.
11. By company right wheel.
12. On headmost company 2d battalion, forward into line.
13. By the right of companies to the rear into column.
14. On the headmost company 2d battalion, into line, faced to the rear.
15. Close column by division, on 1st division, 1st battalion, right in front, into column.
16. By battalion in mass, on the 1st battalion, deploy column.
17. By battalion in mass, on 2d battalion, right in front, into column.
18. By battalion in mass on the 3d battalion deploy column.
19. Battalion in mass on 2d battalion, left in front into column.

20. Line of battle on the 1st battalion, by battalion in mass, on the 2d battalion deploy column.

21. By battalion in mass on the 3d battalion, right in front into column.

22. Line of battle on 2d battalion, by battalion in mass, on the 1st battalion deploy column.

23. On the 4th division 2d battalion, deploy masses.

After an hours' rest the drill was resumed, when several ployments and deployments by battalion in mass, and by division, were executed. Nos. 11, 12, 13 and 14 (above) were repeated.

March in line of battle, change front forward on 3d battalion, &c., when the drill was interrupted by a severe thunder storm, which rendered it impossible to continue the drill.

At the brigade drill, 28th October, the following evolutions were executed :

1. Line of battle.
2. Break to the right to march to the left, on right into line.
3. Break to the left to march to the right.
4. On left into line.
5. No. 1 repeated.
6. No. 2 do
7. No. 3 do

12. Into line faced to the rear.
13. March by battalion in echellon, and retire in

17. By battalion in mass, on 2d battalion left in front into column.
18. Line of battle, on 3d battalion, by battalion in mass, on 2d battalion deploy column.
19. By battalion in mass on 2d battalion, left in front into column.
20. Line of battle on 1st battalion, by battalion in mass on 1st battalion deploy column.
21. On 1st division 2d battalion deploy masses.
22. By company right wheel.
23. On headmost company 2d battalion forward into line.
24. By right of companies to the rear into column.
25. On headmost company 2d battalion into line faced to the rear.

ABSTRACT G.

NEW YORK, *November 23, 1858.*

To the Adjutant General:

In compliance with paragraph 532 of the General Regulations, and in obedience to General Orders No. 64, calling attention to the same, the undersigned submits the following report of the operations of the 4th brigade, consisting of the 10th, 11th, 12th and 69th regiments.

The 10th regiment, commanded by Colonel Wm. Halsey, consists of five battalion companies and a full staff, the total strength of which is about 250 men, 205 of which were present at inspection. Of course, this includes the field, staff and band.

The regiment has made seven parades, inclusive of the brigade and division, and some four drills at the armory, during the year.

On the 20th of October I inspected this regiment at Camp Washington. Having formed its line in New York, it did not reform it on the ground selected for the review and inspection, but at once proceeded to go through with the movements of the programme, as directed in General Orders No. 59, which were executed with promptness and precision, company I, Brevet Col. Raynor commanding, excelling in the execution of them. Captain Kubin, of company H, gave satisfactory evidence of much ability, and the company of careful instruction in the manual, a want of which manifested itself in companies B, C and E.

The accoutrements of this regiment are private property, while their arms (muskets) belong to the State, and a poorer property I never saw; indeed they are unsafe, and deserve to be condemned.

This regiment has not yet adopted a uniform, the commandant preferring the law should take its course with regard to its adoption.

The field and staff are uniformed and equipped according to regulation, except in one or two cases, and in those a promise has been given to the undersigned of an immediate conformity thereto.

If allowed, I most respectfully suggest that permission be given this regiment to adopt a grey uniform, conforming in almost every particular to that worn by company I, Brevet Col. Raynor commanding.

The 11th regiment, since its reorganization into a rifle regiment, has become quite a feature in the 1st division, and particularly of the 4th brigade. It consists of eight battalion companies and one cavalry—rather, horse company of lancers, and has a total strength of 300 men, although 213 was the number present at inspection, which was held on Hamilton Square

the 14th of October last. On this occasion the order of procedure at the parades for the annual inspection as directed in General Orders No. 65, under date of July 29, was strictly observed, as well by the undersigned as the commandant of the 11th, who, on this occasion, gave evidence of a careful study and preparation for the ceremony.

Before proceeding to narrate the operations of this regiment since its reorganization, I here wish to express my approbation of the rapid progress this officer has made since his election to the command of this regiment, of which he was, at the annual inspection in 1857, the Lieut. Colonel, in a knowledge of battalion movements, which has exceeded my most sanguine expectations.

On the 14th of October, as above observed, I inspected this regiment. The line was promptly formed as at dress parade, was then reviewed, which was correctly given by Colonel Bostwick and his efficient assistants, the Lieut. Colonel and Major, after which all the movements, as prescribed in General Order No. 59, were performed. Only one error was made in the course, and that in movement No. 11; after correctly breaking to the right and marching to the left and halting the column, instead of giving a general direction to the guides by the commands, "guides cover in file," he gave the command "color and general guides on the line," the bearers of which came out and were placed, when I corrected the colonel, and the movement was subsequently rightly made. I mention this, not because of a desire to bring to your notice faults, but because they were so few that the mention of one error will show a state of efficiency rarely met with, when the time for preparation is taken into consideration, and the fact that the colonel had had only one battalion drill for practice in the school of the battalion up to this time, and since his election to the command of it.

I find it is impossible to particularize in the conduct of the line officers and their commands, as each was attentive and performed his duties with promptness. I cannot, however, permit the opportunity to pass without doing justice to Captains Heitkamp, company E, and Lux, company G, who certainly are good officers, and on this occasion exhibited their usual familiarity with duty, and did it without precipitation but with much promptness.

Lieut. Klug, of company D, who was compelled to assume command of his company, owing to the absence of its captain (Collomb), who was detained by the sudden death of his father, did remarkably well, and deserves commendation.

The arms of this regiment are in a bad condition, indeed they are un-serviceable for military purposes, and I recommend an immediate issue of an arm that will assimilate the musket.

The service of the 11th has been as follows since its reorganization: May 20, a battalion drill in the rain of three hours; May 27, a drill of officers at a brigade officer drill; June 1, parade for a brigade drill in evolutions of the line, five hours; July 5, division parade; September 1, division parade (Cable celebration), five hours; October 14, regimental

parade for inspection on Hamilton square, four hours ; October 27, officers (brigade) drill ; November 1, regimental parade to receive 69th regiment ; November 9, brigade parade for evolutions of the line.

In connection with the inspection of the 11th regiment I would just mention, that Captain Begg did not inspect, nor was any of his company on the ground, since which it has been disbanded.

The 12th regiment has remained in about the same numerical condition as at the last inspection. It is composed of seven companies, one of which being recently organized, and having no uniform, were excused from attendance at inspection. The total strength present on that occasion being 136, with the absent gives a total strength of 201.

This regiment is under excellent discipline and drill, and performed all the movements in the course for this year at inspection with accuracy and steadiness. The formation, as at dress parade, was well done, and the review was given correctly. I was happily surprised at this exhibition of the qualifications of Lieut. Colonel Weeks, who was the only field officer present, and throughout the performance of the movements was self-reliant. The Lieut. Colonel was ably assisted by the Adjutant, Capt. Ward (W. G.), who gives promise of becoming an excellent officer. The line officers of this regiment are well skilled in their duties, and on this occasion, inspection, which took place on Hamilton Square, October 14, corroborated the opinion heretofore expressed, of efficiency and a knowledge of their duties. Only two mistakes occurred in the execution of the movements ; they were trivial, it is true, but were made by two veteran officers, Captains Boyle, of company G, and Huson, of company B, owing, as I learned from the captains themselves, from not hearing the order, a reason, I am satisfied, that was correct, for two better soldiers are not in the State military service. The arms of this regiment are apparently new, although I am satisfied they are old muskets, with a new lock, having "Ward's primer." The muskets are already condemned by the men, because of their irregularity in size and weight, the slight construction of the cap to primer, which, from almost every other one has fallen off, leaving the coil of primer exposed. I respectfully suggest the propriety of calling these muskets in, and issuing those that are safe and reliable.

The following has been the amount of duty performed by this regiment : April 28, battalion drill ; May 24, battalion drill, five hours ; May 26, officers' (brigade) drill ; June 1, brigade parade for evolutions of the line, six hours ; July 5, division parade, four hours ; September 1, division parade (Cable celebration) ; October 14, inspection ; November 9, brigade parade for evolutions of the line.

I inspected the 69th regiment on the 20th of October at Camp Washington, where it was doing a tour of duty for the protection of the State property at Quarantine. This regiment consists of six infantry, one rifle, and one company of the poorest looking cavalry I ever saw, since detached.

This is truly a serviceable regiment, and under command of its present colonel (Ryan) would be found reliable on any occasion. The total strength

inspected was 275 ; the absentees numbered 136, making an aggregate of 411. The evolutions of this regiment, performed on this occasion, were in the highest degree creditable, and I cannot report an exception to this remark. What I might say of Captain Corcoran, commanding company A, concerning his military knowledge, and the marked ability with which he handled his company on this occasion, would not add to his already well-known reputation as the best, if not the very best, infantry officer in the 4th brigade, therefore I shall only say he did his duty well, and so did the other officers of this regiment. The staff are efficient in their several stations, and are now well organized.

The duty this regiment has performed during the past year is great—five battalion drills at the armory ; January 15 and 26, February 22, March 17, April 27, May 19, June 16, September 30, and October 20 were regimental parades ; June 1 and November 9, brigade parades for evolutions of the line ; July 5 and September 1, division parades.

The arms that are ordinarily used by the 69th regiment are worthless, and I solicit for it an immediate supply of the most approved musket.

Before closing this report, I respectfully suggest the propriety of an amendment to the law in relation to inspection ; that the time for it be extended to the entire month of October, and that the operations of the military year end with that month ; also, if the duties required, as at present, are not lessened, that the military be paid for their services. All of which is most respectfully submitted.

ABSTRACT H.

BROOKLYN, *November 13, 1858.*

To Adjutant General F. TOWNSEND :

With this I hand you inspection returns of the Fifth Brigade, and in addition beg leave to report : The order of procedure laid down in General Orders No. 65, was strictly carried out at the inspection of the different Regiments of this Brigade, and in accordance therewith, and with paragraph 532 of the General Regulations, I make the following report :

13th Regiment Artillery, (doing infantry duty,) Col. Abel Smith, was inspected October 13, 1858. The day was very stormy, and on that account the attendance was not large. Line was formed at 11 o'clock, A. M., and the manœuvres prescribed in orders No. 59 were gone through with in a very creditable manner. The companies all seemed familiar with the movements, and went through with them correctly, and without delay. This Regiment adopted, in February last, a new gray uniform, in which, according to orders No. 18, they were to have been fully equipped on the first day of July last. They have complied with this order, with the exception of the full dress coat, which they have not got, and they were inspected in overcoats. Owing to the disbandment of several companies, not having the requisite number of men, the number of line companies has been reduced to five, with two flank rifle companies. There seems to be a better feeling existing in this Regiment than ever before, and their prospects for recruiting are good. I would recommend that an order should be at once issued, making this either an infantry or light infantry regiment, as although organized as artillery, they have never done duty in that arm, but always as infantry.

14th Regiment, Infantry, Col. A. M. Wood. Inspected October 18th. This regiment has, I regret to say, deteriorated both in numbers and discipline during the past year. Owing to a difference of opinion regarding a change of uniform, a feeling has been engendered that has been most unfortunate in its results.

The manœuvres prescribed in orders No. 59 were gone through with as far as time would permit, but owing to the constant repetition of many of them, (which was absolutely necessary,) it was impossible to go through with all. Co. R, commanded by Capt. Burnett, is deserving of special mention for the promptness and accuracy of its movements. Co. C., Capt. Saal, although parading by far the largest number of men of any company in the regiment, showed a lamentable ignorance of the most simple move-

ments, and that their compahy drills had been much neglected. Co. E, Capt. Jordan, and Co. H, Capt. Fowler, although organized in March last, have not yet equipped.

The great difficulty in this regiment was the want of attention on the part of the guides, who seemed, with few exceptions, to be almost entirely ignorant of their duties. So much depends upon them for the prompt and correct execution of the different movements, that too much stress cannot be laid upon the necessity of having them not only properly drilled, but care should be taken in the selection of competent men to fill the positions.

72d Regiment Infantry, Col. M. Bennett. Inspected October 14th. This regiment has both increased in numbers and improved in drill during the past year. During the past two years they have changed their uniform from green to blue, and from a handful of undisciplined men, have become a well ordered and prosperous regiment. This is mainly owing to the untiring exertions and energy of the field officers, of whom the regiment may well be proud. The movements laid down in orders No. 59 were all gone through with, and in a manner that showed plainly that their battalion drills had been carefully attended to during the past year. The same difficulty appears here as in the 14th regiment, viz: the ignorance of their duties by the sergeants of companies,

70th Regiment Artillery, Col. Samuel Graham. Inspected October 19th. In this regiment we have one which I think cannot be surpassed, in numbers and appearance, by any of the same arm, in the State. This regiment has been constantly improving for several years past, and although all the companies are not yet equipped according to the State regulations for artillery regiments, they are gradually adopting the uniform, and I have no doubt will be fully equipped in a short time.

Co. R, Capt. E. D. Taft, is not only thoroughly drilled, and prepared for active duty, but ready, on all occasions, and at the shortest notice. Capt. Taft is one of our oldest and most experienced officers, and either in the drill-room, or on the field, second to none in the performance of his duty. Co. A, Capt. Casper Urban, is well drilled, and can always be relied on for the prompt performance of any duty assigned them. Co. B. Capt. J. Timmis. This is one of the most prosperous companies in the regiment; only organized about one year since, they inspected 67, rank and file, fully uniformed and equipped. Co. E, Capt. Cropsey, is also in fine condition, well drilled, and doing well. To the careful management of Col. Graham is this regiment indebted for its present position. By careful and constant attention to its internal economy, he has promoted a confidence between officers and men, which has been productive of the greatest good, and the results are seen in a regiment second to none.

The regiments of this brigade are, at present, free from debt, and, with one exception, in a prosperous condition. We have now nearly completed a new city armory, four stories in height, fifty by one hundred feet, divided into company drill rooms. This, with the large room in the State arsenal,

for regimental drills, gives us ample accommodation, which we have never before had.

That portion of the regulations requiring the adoption of a uniform button and cap ornament, has been generally complied with by the field officers, but by few of the line officers, and privates. In Co's R, Capt. Taft, and B, Capt. Timmis, of the 70th Regiment, both officers and privates, are fully equipped in both the button and cap ornament.

ABSTRACT I.

COLD SPRING, N. Y., Nov. 6, 1858.

To Gen. FREDERICK TOWNSEND, *Adj. Gen. N. Y. S. M.*:

In compliance with the requirements of paragraph No. 670 of the General regulations, I have the honor to report that the Seventeenth, Eighteenth and Nineteenth regiments, composing the Seventh Brigade, assembled at Newburgh, pursuant to brigade orders, on the 7th day of October last, for instruction, inspection and review.

The day proved very stormy, but notwithstanding, the whole command was inspected by me, and reviewed by the brigadier general of the brigade, and afterwards by the major general of the Second Division.

At the conclusion of the review, Major Gen. Duryea assumed the command, for the purpose of exercising the brigade in the manœuvres prescribed by General Order No. 59. A portion only of these were executed, the storm becoming so violent that it was deemed advisable to dismiss the troops.

The prescribed manœuvres had, however, all been performed by the regiments separately, at their previous regimental parades, which were held as follows: That of the Seventeenth regiment at Haverstraw, in Rockland county, on the 6th day of October; that of the Eighteenth at Peekskill, on the 27th of August; and for the Nineteenth, on the 6th of October at Newburgh, and on the 8th of October at Port Jervis.

The parade of the Eighteenth was attended by Major Gen. Duryea, and by Col. Churchill, the division inspector, who acted as instructor. The different manœuvres were generally performed with accuracy and promptness, and are now, I think, well understood by the entire brigade. Accompanying this will be found the inspection return, which is believed to be correct, though the company returns are in some cases very imperfect.

To the Adjutant General of the State of New York :

General—In compliance with my duty, I have the honor to render my inspection returns for 1858, of the 8th brigade N. Y. S. M., Brigadier General Henry A. Samson.

The inspection took place on the first day of September last, at Camp Clinton, near this village, in the presence of Inspector Gen'l B. F. Bruce, who, himself, took an active part in the inspection.

The 8th brigade, consisting of the 20th regiment light infantry, and the 21st regiment artillery, was ordered in camp for three days by its commander. The camp, itself, was styled "*Camp Clinton*."

Both the regiments entered it on the 31st day of August last. The 20th regiment left it on the 3d September, having been four days in encampment, and the 21st left it on the 2d September, making three days encampment.

The effective number of the whole brigade stands comparatively with former years, as follows :

This speaks well of the commandants, both of the brigade and the two regiments. Extraordinary efforts only can make a corps popular; they have not spared them, and the result, although encouraging, is still progressive.

The 20th needs only one more company to complete it ; and while there is no doubt that this one company will be found, it is quite certain that the other nine companies will gain in numbers before the next annual parade in 1859. As to the 21st, three more companies are already organized, (companies C, D and F) but they are not yet completely equipped.

Col. Wright assures me, however, that they will be by next spring. If he be successful, his regiment will then number eight companies. It is also expected that the 21st will adopt the regulation uniform, and I hope it may ; for when a battalion appears in the line, with coats of two or three different colors, it strikes the eye unfavorably ; while either of them, if worn exclusively, gives it a true military aspect, and has a moral tendency to fraternity, union, harmony and emulation.

The brigade passed through the manual of arms, and then through the manœuvres ; the 20th went through the light infantry manœuvres, as directed in General Order No. 64 of the Commander-in-Chief ; performed consecutively twice sections 1 to 19, inclusive, 20 and 23 accidentally omitted, and 24, 25 and 28 before the Inspector General.

The right wing of the 20th, companies A, G, E, and F, marched particularly well ; so did companies H and B of the left wing.

In all the manœuvres the companies of Capts. Flynn, Sharp and Lieut. Metzger (F, B and H) were noticeable for their general accuracy of execution.

In file firing, company H, Lieut. Metzger, was first best, and company B, Capt. Sharp, was next best.

I remark a decided improvement in the battalion drill of both the regiments, and good attention is now paid to the guides.

A more complete uniformity in dress than the 20th regiment exhibits, extending even to the musicians and the band, could not be easily attainable.

A few of the officers had not fully complied with the regulation in regard to the numbers upon the epaulets, and proper swords. I am assured, however, that this will not occur again.

Both regiments were somewhat inconvenienced in consequence of the limited supply of tents.

I believe that arms of the companies are kept in armories, which, however restricted, are still guarded with due regard to the security of the State property. These armories are maintained at considerable private expense to the commanders.

The field music is confined to snare drums and trumpets. Several of the drum corps, of both regiments, although but recently instructed, showed a good proficiency in the *call* and *beats*. In the ensemble the corps did well.

I notice company R, of the 21st, very good appearance, but few in numbers.

Company A, of same regiment, has very poor black belts ; they should be replaced, as well as their muskets.

Company B all good.

Company E all good ; muskets poor.

Company L all good.

There were four six pounders, with carriages, implements and limbers, on the field.

1st. One belonging to the 21st regiment.

2d. One, No. 168, do 20th do

3d. One, No. 48, do 20th do

4th. One, No. 49, do 20th do

The two latter belonged formerly to the 28th regiment, Lexington artillery, which, to-day, forms a part of the 20th regiment. All of which are the property of the State, and are in good order. Forty-eight and forty-nine, however, want painting, and one of the wheels a new spoke.

Sir—I have the honor to report that the 54th regiment, belonging to this brigade, executed all the manœuvres laid down in General Orders No. 59, with the exception of numbers 22 and 24, in my presence, in a manner generally creditable to officers and men.

This regiment has paraded but twice during the season, each parade occupying but half a day, and of course sufficient time has not been had to so practice the evolutions as to attain the desirable degree of perfection in their execution. At the general review Company A made its first appearance in battalion line, and gave evidence of having made good progress during the short time they have been organized. Companies B, D, and C, are all well drilled in the school of the company, executing orders with promptness and precision, and if not so perfect in battalion movements, show a capacity and a determination to become so. The same disposition is manifested by Company A. Company R paraded in good numbers, and executed light artillery movements with celerity and accuracy. Company L, with good horses, and generally well ridden, exhibited a flattering commentary upon the efficiency of its commandant.

The review drew forth the commendations of the Brigadier General, particularly on account of the steadiness which officers manifested, both in the line and upon the march, and I was pleased to see in each company a commendable rivalry, not only to excel as an individual corps, but to preserve and advance the reputation of the regiment.

The 59th regiment paraded but once this year. The manœuvres executed in my presence were numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 16, and 20.

The companies comprising this regiment are located so far apart that it is difficult to have a regimental parade oftener than once a year, and encampments are too expensive to be held every season, unless boards of supervisors and assessors are more energetic and faithful in levying the commutation tax. The officers and men, however, manifested a quickness of conception that abundantly showed nothing to be wanting but practice to make this regiment one of the best in the service. Such movements as were gone through with were creditably executed, time only preventing the

completion of the list. The men were well in line, and stood firm, and to the front during the review, marching quite steadily when in column.

The several commands showed themselves well drilled in company movements, but particular mention should be made of Company L, which appeared to be thoroughly instructed in the school of the soldier, and of the company, executing all orders with promptness and precision, exhibiting a soldierly bearing and discipline creditable to their commandant and honorable to themselves. As much could not be expected of the remaining companies, (one of which, D, is young,) as they are so situated as not to be able to have frequent drills.

Company C was not present, but was subsequently inspected at Geneva. It is a new company, and has not made much advancement. Both regiments exhibited good proficiency in the manual of arms.

The 59th requires and deserves new stands of arms throughout, and the 54th 40 stands of the cadet pattern, that all the companies may be armed alike. Company A has the altered musket.

ABSTRACT M.

Proclamation issued by the Governor, declaring the County of Richmond in a state of insurrection, and that a military force shall be detailed and stationed at Quarantine, &c., Sept. 7, 1858.

STATE OF NEW YORK,
EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, ALBANY, Sept. 7th, 1858. }

Proclamation by JOHN A. KING, Governor of the State of New York:

The deliberate and wanton destruction, on the nights of the 1st and 2d of September, by a large mob of armed men, of the buildings, dwelling houses and hospitals at the Quarantine Station, in the county of Richmond, the property of the people of this State; the cruel and inhuman dragging forth of the sick and disabled patients from the hospitals, respected always, even in war; their barbarous exposure, without shelter, throughout an inclement night; the general concurrence in, and approval of these violent acts by the people of the county of Richmond, and especially by those who reside in the neighborhood of the Quarantine grounds; the undisguised and determined manner in which all these outrages were committed, evincing a total disregard and contempt of the laws, and of all their obligations and duties as citizens and men—all combined, present, in my judgment, a case, which, standing alone in its enormity and violence, appeals directly to the discretion of the Chief Magistrate of the State, whose duty it is to see that the laws are faithfully executed, to assert and maintain the dignity of the State, and the authority of those laws so contemptuously and barbarously defied and trodden under foot.

Now, therefore, acting upon the high responsibility of my office, and desirous to vindicate the supremacy of the laws, I denounce these acts of arson and outrage, as crimes of the highest infamy; and for the purpose of bringing the people of the county of Richmond to a just sense of the enormity of these crimes, which they have permitted to be perpetrated without any attempt to interfere with, or to punish the well known actors in all these terrible scenes of violence, burnings and bloodshed; and to guard against the threats which are yet made, that the ships lying at Quarantine should be fired, and the buildings for the accommodation of the sick, who are now houseless, as well as for those who may arrive from infected

southern ports, should be destroyed as soon as erected ; and for the security of the cities of New York and Brooklyn against contagion and pestilence, I issue this proclamation, and call upon all the civil authorities of the county of Richmond, and upon each and all its inhabitants, instantly and zealously to co-operate in restoring the outraged peace and order of the Island, and in bringing to condign punishment the well-known, bold and principal actors and abettors in these acts of arson and murder ; and I declare that by reason of the acts and proceedings herein referred to, and the refusal of the sheriff of the county of Richmond, although respectfully notified that threats had been made to destroy the public property at the Quarantine, to take any steps to prevent the consummation of those threats ; and the absolute necessity for an adequate force to protect the buildings to be erected for the sick, on the very site where they stood, until provision shall be made by law for their removal to some other place ; and to release the large police force withdrawn from the general service of the cities of New York and Brooklyn, and now stationed at Quarantine ; that the county of Richmond is in a state of insurrection—and in order to assist in preserving the peace, and to protect the property of the State, and the lives of the sick, that a military force of sufficient strength shall be detailed and stationed at the Quarantine, until the returning sense of the people of Richmond county to their duties and obligations as peaceful citizens, shall render its presence unnecessary, or until the Legislature shall otherwise direct.

Special Orders, No. 156.

Pursuant to the proclamation of the Governor of the State, issued by him this day, and having reference to the gross outrages which have recently occurred at the Quarantine, in the county of Richmond, a force of 250 officers and men, including one section of artillery, will be detailed from the troops of the first division, resident in the city of New York, and dispatched to Richmond county, where it will take position immediately adjacent to the Quarantine grounds, but not within the Quarantine enclosure, and sufficiently near to the property of the State, and to the buildings to be erected for the accommodation of the sick, to be able at all times, instantly and effectively, to defend the same, and the lives of the sick, against all violence.

To this end, Major General Sandford, commanding the first division, will, on the receipt of these orders, immediately detach a regiment, or part of a regiment, for this special duty; or he may assemble company detachments from the several regiments of his division, and assign to the command of the force some field-officer of known discretion and firmness, and who is at present in active commission in the division. An efficient Quartermaster, from among the regimental Quartermasters of the division in active commission, and a regimental surgeon, will also be assigned to the detachment.

The commandant of the force, after its assembling, will, without delay, proceed with the same to Richmond county, and, on arrival at the Quarantine grounds, will select for its accommodation for barrack purposes, some suitable building or buildings immediately adjacent to such grounds, but not within the enclosure. Should there be no buildings near at hand possessing the proper requisites, then he will select some elevated, dry site, possessing these requisites, and thereupon encamp his force.

The commandant of the force will have, for the purpose of defense, the entire military control of the Quarantine grounds belonging to the State. He will not interfere, however, with the Health Officer (or other civil officers acting under his orders,) in his or their discharge of the usual duties of the station. He will avail himself of all the necessary means to place himself in a defensible position, and will take all the usual precautions against sur-

prise, and will conform generally to the requirements of the general regulations.

He will each day report direct to the general head-quarters, giving a detail of his doings, for the information of the Commander-in-Chief, who enjoins upon him the utmost vigilance in the discharge of the very delicate duties imposed upon him by this order.

The Commissary General, on the requisition of the commandant of the force, will supply all the camp equipage, and the ammunition necessary for the force.

IV. The Commander-in-Chief is pleased to recognize the valuable services which the troops of the 1st division have performed so satisfactorily at Quarantine.

In every vicissitude they have borne all the exposures and privations incident to the soldier's life, without a murmur, and have fully proved that the confidence so generally reposed in them, has not been misplaced.

REPORT OF JUDGE-ADVOCATE GENERAL.

To his Excellency, JOHN A. KING,

*Commander-in-Chief of the Military Forces
of the State of New York:*

Sir—I have the honor to submit, in compliance with section 841 of article XLI of the General Regulations, as my report for the year ending December 15, 1858,

First, That no courts-martial have been ordered and held within the State, at which I have acted as Judge-Advocate.

Second, Three reports, and no more, have been received by me from other members of this department, which reports are hereto annexed and form a part of this my report.

Third, That I have no suggestions or recommendations to make in regard to the nature and character of the proceedings of courts-martial, nor do I think that any legislation or further regulation is necessary to a full and fair administration of justice. The forms and mode of procedure prescribed by the General Regulations for the guidance of this department of the staff, are sufficiently full and explicit to enable the most inexperienced to discharge the duties of the law officer of a court-martial, and to acquaint the other members of such courts with the nature of their duties and the extent of their authority, and do not, in my opinion, require either modification or amendment.

Dear Sir—Pursuant to an order of Major General S. S. Burnside, commanding officer of 5th Division New York State Militia, a court-martial was held at the house of Major John Wright, in the town of Worcester, in said Division, on the 4th, 5th and 6th days of November, 1858, for the

trial of Major James Steward, Aid-de-Camp of the Major-General of said Division, on the following charge and specification, viz :

Charge—Disobedience of orders.

Specification 1st. In this, that Major James Steward, Aid-de-Camp of the Major-General of the 5th Division New York State Militia, disobeyed the orders of Major General S. S. Burnside, of said Division, in not appearing at the Annual Parade and Review of the 12th Brigade, 5th Division New York State Militia, at Unadilla, Otsego county, on the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th days of October, 1858.

The board was composed of Colonel J. N. Northrop, of the 5th Division, president ; Colonel Denton Salisbury and Lieutenant-Colonel Wm. Burch, of said Division, members ; Captain D. W. Graff, of the 39th Regiment, marshal ; and Colonel Wm. H. Chase, of 5th Division, Judge-Advocate.

The court found the charge and specification sustained as to accused's non-attendance of parade, but found, by evidence, that at the time of parade, he was sick and confined to his home, and therefore excused him, which decision of the court has been approved by the officer ordering the court.
