

## REPORT.

GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS, STATE OF NEW YORK, ADJUTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE,

To His Excellency J. T. HOFFMAN,

Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

 $S_{IR}$ .—I have the honor to make the following report from this department for the year ending December 31st, 1869:

Finding that, generally, the condition of the National Guard was efficient and satisfactory, I have endeavored to pursue a course that would maintain the excellent organization which had been established by my predecessors; and, for the present, only looked to a reduction of the force as the most important object to be accomplished. With that view the Legislature, at its last session, provided for the reduction of the aggregate number of non-commissioned officers, musicians, and privates, from thirty thousand to twenty thousand; and that requirement has been already so far carried out that the present number is only twenty-two thousand five hundred and thirty-eight (22,538).

In appearing before the Military and Finance Committees of the Legislature, I took the ground that twenty thousand (20,000) was a sufficient number for the aggregate force of the National Guard, and that, for aiding in its support, two hundred thousand dollars should be appropriated annually, to be paid out of the General Fund of the State. In urging these views, I called attention to the fact that, for all the purposes that a standing army could be required by the State, the National Guard answered perfectly well, and that the expense to the State of only ten dollars per man yearly, was certainly very moderate. Of course, the whole cost of supporting the organization is much more in money alone, but the members of it contribute the balance as well as give their time and services gratuitously. And in this connection, I would remark, that I cannot see how the propriety

of exempting them from taxation to a moderate amount, and also from jury duty, can be questioned; for surely it is small compensation for the services they render. The unanimity with which the Legislature and its committees acted upon these matters thus presented to them, leads me to believe that if the National Guard will always do justice to itself, there will be no difficulty in keeping up the organization on its present basis, and obtaining from the General Fund of the State, two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) annually to aid in its support.

It seems to me that the necessity, as well as importance, of maintaining the National Guard, for reason of the physical and moral support which it gives to the civil authorities, is so evident, that it is unnecessary to repeat the argument which has been so often made on this ground, in its favor; and when, in addition to that, the benefit which was derived from the organization in furnishing volunteers during the late war of the rebellion is considered, it surely must be admitted by all that it should receive the fostering aid of the State.

The National Guard, at present, comprises three (3) regiments, one (1) battalion, and four (4) separate troops of cavalry; three (3) battalions, and eight (8) separate batteries of artillery; and forty-seven (47) regiments, and three (3) battalions of infantry.

For reason of the sparseness of population in the districts where some of the regiments are located, which renders it impracticable to keep up a regimental organization, there are a number of the regiments which should be reduced to battalions; and I am decidedly of the opinion that it is unnecessary to have either regiments or battalions of cavalry or artillery, and that the organizations of those arms of the service should be confined to separate troops or batteries attached to brigades or divisions. With respect to the artillery, I am convinced that most of the batteries should be armed with the light twelve-pounder howitzer, called mountain howitzer, with which a few of the batteries are now armed, because it is a weapon that is not only exceedingly well adapted for service in cases of riot and like disturbances, but as the guns are so light that they can be readily drawn by the men, the use of horses is dispensed with, and much expense saved thereby. If a satisfactory price could be obtained for the Parrott and Delafield guns which the State owns and with which most of the batteries are armed, I should recommend that the change be made at once, but as no such price can be obtained at present, it should be made gradually, as the condition of the military fund will warrant.

### STATE ARSENALS.

As the State does not need for the storage of its military property, more than three arsenals, it is desirable that all the arsenals and armories other than those located in the cities of New York, Albany and Buffalo, should be turned over to the county authorities of the localities in which they are situated, and that the boards of supervisors of those several counties should be charged with the care of them. Such change would save the State from considerable expense, and would be doing no injustice to those localities, but, to the contrary, those counties would still have the advantage over most of the other counties of the State in having armories thus provided without any expense to them for building or renting.

Last winter my attention having been called by the municipal authorities of the city of New York, to the dangerous condition of the east wall of the State arsenal building in that city, and also those same authorities having required that the ammunition stored therein should be no longer kept there, as it was not safe, under your instructions, I laid the matter before the Committee of Ways and Means, and a law was passed by the Legislature, making an appropriation of \$30,000 to pay for repairing the said building and constructing a magazine therein, and also providing for obtaining what additional land might be required for the purposes of said arsenal. The repairing of the building, and the construction of the magazine have been completed, and proceedings to take the additional land required, by the right of eminent domain, have been instituted and are progressing. That any additional land was required was owing to the fact that the building encroached several inches upon the adjacent lot, which does not belong to the State; and it was deemed advisable to obtain more than those several inches, for the purpose of securing the east wall of the arsenal building from injury by the blasting of the rock which underlies it and extends upon the adjacent lot, and which blasting the owner of that lot has a right to do, to a certain depth, for his own purposes, and without rendering himself liable for damage to his neighbor's building. The additional land to be thus taken measures eight feet, four inches, on Thirtyfifth street, and the same in the rear, and is ninety-eight feet, nine inches deep; and when it has been obtained, the State arsenal property will form a parallelogram of 208 feet, four inches, on Thirtyfifth street, and ninety-eight feet, nine inches, on Seventh avenue.

### BUREAU OF MILITARY STATISTICS.

The Bureau of Military Statistics is at present located and well accommodated in a building near the Capitol, for which rent at the rate of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) per annum is paid. An assistant, Miss L. Dempsey, a capable and efficient person, who has been connected with this bureau for several years, is especially charged with its care, and she manages it with satisfaction to this department, and to the public visiting the institution.

Although it has been proposed that a distinct building should be erected for this bureau, and a considerable sum of money has been contributed by the people in the several counties of the State, and a lot has been tendered by the city of Albany for the purpose, the necessity of carrying out the project cannot be perceived, when it is taken into consideration that the bureau can be perfectly well accommodated in the new Capitol, in some of the rooms which, in the plan of that building, are provided for the use of the military department; and that the construction of a distinct building would involve an expenditure from the treasury of the State of many thousands of Before dismissing this subject, I would call attention to the very objectionable practice of loaning the flags and trophies deposited This loaning can only be done by joint resolution of in this bureau. the Legislature; nevertheless, it has already been done so repeatedly that the articles, which are in a frail condition, have been much injured by handling and moving, and would be destroyed ere long if the practice were continued.

### STATE MILITARY AGENCIES.

The military agencies having been turned over to this department during the year 1868, I found, on entering upon the discharge of my duties on the first of January, 1869, United States Paymaster's checks, pension certificates and Treasurer's certificates, amounting to ten thousand two hundred and six dollars and twenty-three cents (\$10,206.23), and since that date there have been received like checks and certificates amounting to fourteen thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine dollars and twenty-two cents (\$14,829.22), making altogether the sum of twenty-five thousand and thirty-five dollars and forty-five cents (\$25,035.45). Of these there have been delivered to the claimants entitled to them checks and certificates to the amount of twenty-three thousand one hundred and fifteen dollars and thirty-one cents (\$23,115.31), and there still remain in my possession like

checks and certificates to the amount of one thousand nine hundred and twenty dollars and fourteen cents (\$1,920.14), to be delivered to the claimants for whom they were issued as soon as they can be found.

### SOLDIERS OF THE WAR OF 1812.

The Legislature, at its last session, having passed an act making an appropriation of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to be distributed pro-rata in redeeming certain certificates which had been issued under prior laws to soldiers of the war of 1812, and requiring that those certificates should be sent in to the Adjutant-General previous to a certain date, some twenty-six hundred and thirty-one (2.631) of such certificates and affidavits relating thereto, as came within the purview of the act, were filed and entered in a book of record; which book of record, and all the certificates and accompanying papers, were deposited in the Comptroller's office on the fifteenth day of September last. In accordance with the provisions of the said act, the Comptroller, the Adjutant-General, and the Inspector-General examined such certificates and proofs, and apportioned, pro-rata, upon the certificates so presented and proven, the said fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000). The aggregate amount of the principal of those certificates being one hundred and thirty-five thousand, seven hundred and ninety-one, ninety-three one-hundredths dollars (\$135,791. $\frac{9}{100}$ ); the *pro-rata* was only thirty-six dollars and eighty-two thirty-seven one hundredth cents (\$36.82 $\frac{37}{100}$ ) on the hundred dollars. Up to the first of January, inst., the payments had been made by the Comptroller on twenty-four hundred and fifty-five (2,455) of the certificates, leaving at that date only one hundred and eighty-six (186) unpaid. Accomplishing all this in the short period in which it had to be done, greatly increased the labor of this office, for in addition to the usual daily business, which of course had to be kept up, there were received, indorsed, and entered, nearly four thousand letters relating to this matter.

#### CLAIMS AGAINST THE UNITED STATES.

During the early part of the first year of the war of the rebellion, a large amount of money was expended by the State in fitting out regiments of volunteers, in expectation of the United States reimbursing the State for the same. Shortly thereafter, a special tax was laid upon the several States by Congress, and each State was allowed to offset the same, to the extent that it could present proper vouchers

for expenditures made in fitting out volunteers. The amount of such tax against this State was two million, two hundred and thirteen thousand, three hundred and thirty-two eighty-six one-hundredth dollars (\$2,213,332 $\frac{3}{1000}$ ), and the Treasury Department claims that there is still due from the State on this account, nine hundred and thirty-four thousand, two hundred and seventy-four sixty-four one-hundredth dollars (\$934,274 $\frac{64}{1000}$ ). Under your instructions, the Assistant Adjutant-General was charged with the care and prosecution of this business, and from his report upon the matter, a copy of which will be found in the appendix, it will be seen that there is a fair prospect of getting a sufficient amount of the claims of the State allowed to offset the balance due from the State for the special tax.

Breech-Loaders.

Now that, with the use of metallic cartridges, the mechanism of breech-loaders has been so perfected that the superiority of a musket loading at the breech over one loading at the muzzle is no longer questioned, it is very desirable that the infantry of the National Guard should be armed with them. The State owns a large number of Springfield rifle muskets, of the latest models, loading at the muzzle, and most of the regiments and battalions of infantry are armed with them. To make the change in the most economical manner would be to have these muzzle loaders altered to breech-loaders; and, notwithstanding the late administration decided that they should be altered on the "Roberts" plan at an expense of seven dollars a piece, I would recommend that, when the change is made, they be altered on the plan adopted by the War Department, and on which the rifle muskets now in use by the United States troops were altered. reasons for making this recommendation are, that altering them in this manner, which probably you could have done at the Springfield armory, would cost much less money, would be converting them into a weapon which has been thoroughly tested in service for a length of time and found to be entirely satisfactory, and that there would be the further advantage to be derived from having the National Guard armed in the same manner as the United States troops, and using the same kind of ammunition and the same tactics.

What, in my opinion, would be still better, would be to get the War Department to exchange them for the "Springfield Breech Loading Rifle Musket," model of 1868, which is the model of 1863 altered for loading at the breech, with the barrel reduced in calibre

to .50 and in length to thirty-six inches, and having a new back sight for aiming at distances ranging up to one thousand yards, and also an improved ramrod. This model of 1868 was got up at the Springfield armory year before last under the direction of Brevet-Col. J. G. Benton, major of ordnance, and commanding officer of that armory, and it seems to me to be the perfection of an altered rifle musket. Including all that it is necessary to do in altering rifle muskets of the model of 1863 to that of 1868, the cost is less than seven dollars apiece, and therefore I think it would be best to make the exchange above indicated as soon as it can be brought about, and the appropriations for military purposes will warrant it.

I do not deem it necessary to recite here what occurred with respect to a certain arrangement which the late Commissary-General of Ordnance made with the "Roberts Breech Loading Arms Co." for the alteration of ten thousand Springfield rifle muskets belonging to the State to breech loaders, for that matter was reported to the Senate last winter in response to a resolution of that body calling upon the Adjutant-General for information relating thereto, and a copy of that report, as well as a copy of Brevet Major-General James McQuade, Inspector-General's report, on the same subject, will be found in the appendix; but, I would recommend that legal proceedings be taken to recover from that company those arms (or like ones or their value in money) which were delivered by the late Commissary-General of Ordnance to the "Roberts Breech Loading Arms Co.," and which the said company still retain, notwithstanding the demand I made for them, under your direction, in January last.

### THE MILITARY CODE.

Believing that great benefit would be derived from a re-enactment of the Military Code, incorporating all that is desirable in the present one, and also all the desirable amendments that have been made thereto, I have drawn a bill for such purpose, to be submitted to the Legislature at its ensuing session. In preparing this bill I took great pains to obtain from superior and experienced officers of the National Guard their views upon the matter, and a great many of those favored me with valuable suggestions, and evinced an interest in the subject that was most gratifying. The enactment of this new Code would make but few radical changes in existing laws, and of these the principal one is the mode of uniforming the non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates. With

respect to this change, there is great, and indeed, I may say, almost entire unanimity of opinion. Nevertheless, to arrive at a satisfactory conclusion in my own mind upon this subject, was attended with no little solicitude. The present law requires that the State shall furnish to each non-commissioned officer and private two suits of uniforms during the term of enlistment; and as the regiments generally adopt a uniform with the approval of the Commander-in-Chief, that is more costly than the regulation uniform, the practice has grown up to apply the money value of the Quartermaster-General's order to pay, in part, for the uniforms they get. To simplify all this, and to save expense, the plan proposed in the new Code provides that there shall be paid annually by the Comptroller to the county treasurers, to be held in trust by the latter for the regiments, battalions, separate troops or batteries in their counties, a sum equal to five dollars for each non-commissioned officer, musician and private of such organization, who paraded at least seven times during the preceding year; which sum is to be used exclusively to aid the non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates of those organizations in procuring their uniforms, and can only be paid out for that purpose on the order of the board of auditors of the organization, accompanied by the vouchers or bills for the uniforms, approved by the Adjutant-General. An important feature of this plan, besides its simplicity and economy, is that which regulates the benefit which each organization will receive by the number of its men who do To guard against the loss or misapplication of this money, or of any other public money appropriated for military purposes, the new Code contains a provision declaring it to be a felony for any officer, civil or military, who is charged with any duty by its provisions, to embezzle, misapply, or retain in his possession without anthority, any such money.

So much difficulty has been experienced, for reason of the election of incompetent and otherwise unfit persons to office in the National Guard, that the practice has grown up in some of the brigades, of requiring persons so elected to be examined by an examining board, appointed by the Brigadier-General, to enable him to act understandingly in approving or disapproving of the election in transmitting the return thereof. This practice is a very good one, but as there appears to be no authority of law for such proceedings, there has been incorporated in the new Code, a provision for the same.

With respect to the matter of exemption from taxation, I have

deemed it best to treat all the members of the National Guard alike, and, therefore, have incorporated a provision relating thereto, which gives to each member, from the highest to the lowest, an exemption from taxation to the extent of eight hundred dollars (\$800) of the value of his taxable property, during his time of service.

### CONCLUSION.

It would be doing great injustice to mine own feelings were I to close this report without speaking of the encouragement and pleasure I have derived in the discharge of my duties, from finding that every member of the National Guard with whom I came in contact was filled with the greatest interest in the organization; and, appreciating the responsibilities and cares of my position, seemed actuated only by a desire to aid me in every respect. If any improvements have been made, a large share of the credit for the same is due to their hearty co-operation.

Still more do I feel myself indebted to Colonel J. B. Stone-house, Assistant Adjutant-General, and to Major Alfred Taylor, Chief Clerk, and the other clerks and messengers in this office, for the relief which they have afforded me by the untiring industry and faithfulness with which they have always discharged their duties.

The appendix accompanying this report is referred to for further information in detail.

### REPLY OF THE ADJUTANT-GENERAL

TO

RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE, CALLING FOR INFORMATION IN RELATION TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COMMISSARY-GENERAL OF ORDNANCE AND THE ROBERTS BREECH-LOADING ARMS COMPANY.

GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS—STATE OF NEW YORK, ADJUTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE, ALBANY, January 24, 1869.

To the Hon. ALLEN C. BEACH,

Lieut.-Governor and President of the Senate:

Sir.—In response to the resolution of the Senate, passed on the 26th inst., and which reads as follows:

STATE OF NEW YORK, SENATE CHAMBER, ALBANY, January 26, 1869.

"Resolved, That the Adjutant-General is respectfully requested to report to the Senate, if he has any official knowledge of any contract with any person or persons in the State of Rhode Island, or elsewhere, for the altering of any muskets, the property of this State; and if so, that he give the date thereof; the State official by whom the same was made; the other parties; the terms and amount thereof; the provisions of law under which the same was made, if any, and other information in relation thereto, which he may deem of importance to the Senate."

I have the honor to report that whilst in the city of New York, during the latter part of last week, I learned casually that some sort of arrangement had been made last September, for the alteration of ten thousand (10,000) Springfield rifled muskets (belonging to the State) to breech-loaders, and I was shown by the chief clerk, in the office of the Commissary-General of Ordnance, a paper relating thereto, a copy of which is annexed. Knowing of no law authorizing a con-

tract for such purpose, and believing that no necessity existed for incurring expense on that account, I reported the matter to the Governor immediately upon my return to these head-quarters, and under his instruction, on Monday, the 25th inst., I addressed a communication to the "Roberts Breech-loading Arms Co.," as follows:

GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS—STATE OF NEW YORK, ADJUTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE, ALBANY, January 25, 1869.

To the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Co., No. 179 Broadway, New York:

I am directed by Governor Hoffman to notify you that he will not recognize in any way, shape or manner, the contract which it is said you claim to have with the State of New York, for the alteration of rifled muskets to breech-loaders. Inspector General McQuade (Brigadier-General James McQuade) has been ordered to go to your factory and receive all the arms belonging to the State which have been sent to you, and, therefore, you will please deliver them to him.

Under the further instructions of His Excellency, Brigadier-General James McQuade, Inspector-General, was dispatched to the factory of the "Roberts Breech-loading Arms Co.," to stop work (if it had been commenced) upon the arms of the State, which had been delivered to them—some two thousand and twenty (2020), and to reclaim the same, and forward them to the New York Arsenal.

AGREEMENT RELATIVE TO CONTRACT FOR REPAIRING TEN THOUSAND MUSKETS.

This agreement, made and entered into, this fourteenth day of September, 1868, by and between Brigadier-General George W. Palmer, Commissary-General of Ordnance of the State of New York, on behalf and for the people of the State of New York, party of the first part, and the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, State of New York, party of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the said Commissary-General of Ordnance of the State of New York, for and on behalf of the people of the State of New York, and the said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, have covenanted and agreed, and by these presents do mutually covenant and agree, to and with each other, as hereinafter follows:

First. That the said General George W. Palmer, Commissary-General of Ordnance of the State of New York, shall deliver to the said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, party of the second part, at the New York State Arsenal, located in the city of New York, ten thousand serviceable Springfield muskets, caliber .58 boxed for shipment, the same being the property of and belonging to the people of the State of New York, party of the first part, on or before the first day of January, 1869, in lots of five hundred muskets each, or more, beginning on the first day of October next, for the purpose of conversion into breech-loaders on the Roberts' system, upon the terms and conditions as hereinafter set forth.

Second. That the said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, party of the second part, shall receive said ten thousand muskets, and shall transform and alter the same into breech-loading arms, on the plan known as the Roberts' system of conversion, in the report of the New York State Board for examination of breech-loading military small arms, with certain improvements, according to new model, as follows: With the receiver lengthened and the shoulder on the breech plug reversed and working on a center, confined by a pin, which admits of removing, and replacing the breech plug, and exposing the breech without dismounting the gun, as hitherto; and shall have the said ten thousand muskets, so altered and transformed, cleaned, repaired and delivered at the State Arsenal in the city of New York, on or before the first day of May, 1869: Provided, however, and it is hereby understood, by the parties to these presents, that, in case the said General George W. Palmer, Commissary-General of Ordnance of the State of New York, should fail to deliver any or all of the said ten thousand muskets within the time above specified, to the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, for the purposes hereinbefore stated, then, and in that event, the said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company shall have an extension of time for the return of said muskets, not to exceed three months after the first day of May, 1869, except in case the said Commissary-General of Ordnance of the State of New York should fail to deliver any or all of said muskets to said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company before the said first day of May, 1869; in which event, the said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company shall have three months subsequent to the time of the last delivery of any of said muskets by said Commissary-General of Ordnance of the State of New York, to the said Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, for the purposes above mentioned, within which to return said muskets at the State Arsenal in the city of New York.

And upon the delivery of said muskets by the party of the second part to the party of the first part, said muskets shall be accompanied by the certificate of a United States Ordnance Inspector, selected by the Commissary-General of Ordnance, for the number returned on each delivery.

Third. And it is further agreed by and between the parties to these presents, that in consideration of the faithful performance of the above conditions and stipulations, that the people of the State of New York, party of the first part, upon the delivery of said muskets so transformed and altered in the manner and at the time above specified, will and hereby covenant and agree to pay unto the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, party of the second part, through their treasury at the office of the Commissary-General of Ordnance, of the State of New York, in the city of New York, the sum of seven dollars for each and every gun so transformed and altered.

And it is agreed and conditioned that the payment of the sum for alteration, repairs and transportation of the above mentioned 10,000 arms, or any portion thereof, shall not be made from any appropriation now existing, but by provisions hereafter to be made by authority of law.

Fourth. And it is further stipulated and agreed that the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company shall deliver in good, serviceable condition, cleaned and repaired, boxed in good condition for shipment, all of the arms they shall receive from the said General George W. Palmer, Commissary-General of Ordnance, in lots of 500, or larger, as soon as the same may be altered, cleaned and repaired, at the New York State Arsenal, in the city of New York.

And it is further conditioned that the party of the second part shall commence the work of alteration of said arms, and prosecute same diligently, as soon as they receive any portion of the quota of arms above mentioned; and in no case shall a longer period than three months intervene between the reception of the guns from the party of the first part, and a return of same to said party at the New York State Arsenal, in the city of New York.

And it is further agreed that for the faithful performance of this

contract and a return of all the guns which, from time to time, may be entrusted to them, the party of the second part shall execute a bond, with two good and sufficient sureties, in the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars, which bond shall be approved by the Adjutant-General of the State, and delivered to the Commissary-General of Ordnance, prior to the delivery by him of any guns for alteration and repairs.

### REPORT OF INSPECTOR-GENERAL

TN

RELATION TO SPRINGFIELD RIFLE MUSKETS, SENT FOR ALTERATION TO BREECH-LOADERS, TO THE ROBERTS BREECH-LOADING ARMS COMPANY, BY GENERAL GEORGE W. PALMER, LATE COMMISSARY-GENERAL OF ORDNANCE.

GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS, STATE OF NEW YORK, INSPECTOR-GENERAL'S OFFICE, ALBANY, February 1st, 1869.

Brigadier-General Franklin Townsend,

Adjutant-General, State of New York:

GENERAL.—In obedience to S. O. No. 6 (c. s.), I proceeded to New York for the purpose of making inquiries concerning the arms mentioned in said order, and thence to Providence, R. I., where I found the arms in possession of the Providence Tool Company, of that city.

A contract for changing these arms into breech-loaders was entered into on the fourteenth day of September, 1868, between Brigadier-General George W. Palmer, Commissary-General of Ordnance (with the approval of his Excellency, Reuben E. Fenton, Governor and Commander-in-Chief), assuming to act on behalf and for the State of New York, of the first part, and the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, a corporation doing business in the city of New York, of the second part. A copy of this contract (on file in the office of the Commissary-General of Ordnance) has been furnished heretofore.

Prior to the first day of January last, General Palmer, Commissary-General of Ordnance, delivered to the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, 2,020 Springfield muskets, caliber .58, to be converted into breech-loaders, on the Roberts system, in accordance with the terms of said contract. By order of his Excellency, John T. Hoffman, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, no delivery of arms under this contract has been made since the first day of January.

The arms in question are now in the workshops of the Providence Tool Company, which company has been employed by the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company to change them to breech-loaders. They are in the following condition: The barrels have been removed from the stocks, and cut off about one inch in front of the cone, preparatory to their insertion in the breech-frames of the "Roberts breech-loading attachment." Nothing else has been done to the arms. I ascertained, however, that the Providence Tool Company is now engaged in forging breech-frames for the 10,000 muskets mentioned in the contract; and I was informed, at the workshops, that some parts have been completed for that number, and that materials have been provided sufficient to complete the whole work.

I could find no officer or agent of the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company in Providence, nor any person authorized to receive a communication from me regarding the arms. I had no power to communicate with the Providence Tool Company, in whose possession the arms were found. I, therefore, returned to New York city, and served the acting secretary of the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company, at the office of the company, No. 179 Broadway, with a copy of S. O. No. 6, upon which I made the following indorsement:

"New York, January 30, 1869.

"Sir.—You will please deliver the arms mentioned in the within order to Brigadier-General W. H. Morris, Commissary-General of Ordnance.

I have the honor to report that the order was disregarded, and that no arms have been delivered by the Roberts Breech-loading Arms Company to me, or to General Morris, who, as custodian of the arms and ordnance stores of the State, I designated to receive them, pursuant to the order of his Excellency, the Commander-in-Chief.

I have the honor to report, further, that the superintendent of the Providence Tool Company informed me that the company would hold the 2,020 muskets already delivered as security for the payment of its claim, not only for work done on these arms, but for labor performed,

and materials furnished, under the contract for the whole number; and that the arms would be sold to satisfy this claim, if it were not acquitted otherwise.

In their present condition, with the work of conversion commenced by the shortening of the barrel, these muskets are worthless. They can be made valuable now only by conversion into breech-loading arms.

## REPORT OF ASSISTANT ADJUTANT-GENERAL

AS

TO CONDITION OF CLAIMS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK AGAINST THE UNITED STATES FOR WAR EXPENDITURES.

Adjutant-General's Office, Albany, December 28, 1869.

To Major-General Franklin Townsend,

Adjutant-General:

General.—In accordance with instructions from His Excellency, the Governor, directing me to proceed to Washington, and confer with the Secretary of the Treasury, with a view to a speedy settlement of the claim of the State of New York against the United States for war expenditures, I have the honor to report, that I arrived in that city on the 16th inst., and at once entered upon the business with which I was entrusted.

The records of the Treasury Department show that the amount of claims of the State of New York against the United States on file at this date is \$3,232,235,32.

There is charged against this State \$2,213,332.86, the quota apportioned the State of New York of the direct tax (less fifteen per cent) imposed by act of Congress, passed August 5th, 1861, and from which act the following is an extract:

An Acr to provide increased revenue from imports, to pay interest on the public debt, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted, &c.,

§ 8. And be it further enacted, That a direct tax of twenty millions of dollars be and is hereby annually laid upon the United States, and the same shall be and is hereby apportioned to the States respectively, in manner following:

To the State of New York, two million six hundred and three thousand nine hundred and eighteen and two-third dollars.

§ 53. And be it further enacted, That any State or territory, and the District of Columbia, may lawfully assume, assess, collect, and pay into the Treasury of the United States, the direct tax or its quota thereof, imposed by this act upon the State, territory, or the District of Columbia, in its own way and manner, by and through its own officers, assessors and collectors; that it shall be lawful to use for this purpose the last or any subsequent valuation, list, or appraisal made by State or territorial authority, for the purpose of State or territorial taxation therein, next preceding the date when this act takes effect, to make any laws or regulations for these purposes, to fix or change the compensation to officers, assessors, and collectors; and any such State, Territory, or District which shall give notice, by the Governor or other proper officer thereof, to the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States on or before the second Tuesday of February next, and in each succeeding year thereafter, of its intention to assume and pay, or to assess, collect, and pay into the treasury of the United States, the direct tax imposed by this act, shall be entitled in lieu of the compensation, pay, per diem, and percentage herein prescribed and allowed to assessors, assistant assessors, and collectors of the United States, to a deduction of fifteen per centum on the quota of direct tax apportioned to such State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, levied and collected by said State, Territory, and District of Columbia, through its said officers; provided, however, that the deduction shall only be made to apply to such part or parts of the same as shall have been actually paid into the treasury of the United States, on or before the last day of June, in the year to which such payment relates:

and, provided further, that the amount of direct tax apportioned to any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, shall be liable to be paid and satisfied in whole or in part by the release of such State, Territory, or District, duly executed to the United States, of any liquidated and determined claim of such State, Territory, or District, of equal amount against the United States, provided that in case of such release, such State, Territory, or district shall be allowed the same abatement of the amount of such tax as would be allowed in case of payment of the same in money.

In order to a full understanding of the subject, a statement in detail showing the present condition of these two several accounts (War Claim, and Direct Tax) is given below:

From this statement it will be seen that, even if all the suspended and unadjusted items are finally allowed, there will be a balance due the United States of \$2,141.82.

The item in war claim statement, "balance carried to account of direct tax, \$932,132.82," consists of suspended and unexamined vouchers, and have yet to be passed upon by the accounting officers of the treasury. This sum (\$932,132.82) is the actual amount of unsettled claims now on file in the department, and is placed to the credit of the State on the "direct tax" account, it being necessary to cover the amount due for direct tax with a like amount of claims against the United States, so as to secure the fifteen per cent mentioned in the act above quoted.

One charge in this item of \$131,188.02, interest paid on Comptroller's bonds, I was specially instructed to bring to the notice of

the Secretary of the Treasury, and urge its allowance. At an interview with the Secretary I presented the communication of Hon. W. F. Allen, Comptroller, to the Governor, in which the reasons why this claim should be allowed were clearly and forcibly set forth. After a long conference, and upon consultation with other officers of the department, it was ordered, that this amount, which had been disallowed as not being a legitimate charge against the government, should be placed with the suspended items for further investigation, as shown by the following letter from the second Comptroller:

TREASURY DEPARTMENT, SECOND COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE, December 23, 1869.

Sir.—In reply to your letter of the 22d inst., you are respectfully informed, that, having carefully read the report of the Comptroller of the State of New York, in the matter of interest claimed by that State from the United States, I am of the opinion that that portion of the account of the State may be suspended, subject to future decision.

In previous settlements, such items as were most easily adjusted have naturally been taken up. The remainder will require much labor and perseverance to put them in a shape that will conform to the very stringent requirements of the department.

Captain Butler, who accompanied me to Washington is still there, arranging for a special settlement to be had in the course of a few weeks. I hope soon to obtain an allowance of fully two-thirds of the unexamined and suspended accounts, as well as a considerable amount of the additional claims to be presented.

The following amendments to the "Military Code of the State of New York" are published for the information and guidance of all concerned.

#### CHAP. 778.

An Act to amend an act entitled "An act to provide for the enrollment of the militia, the organization and discipline of the National Guard of the State of New York, and for the public defense," passed April twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, and the several acts amendatory thereof.

Passed May 8, 1869; by a two-third vote.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Sections three, four, five, six, seven, nine, ten, eleven and thirteen of the act passed May the sixth, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to provide for the enrollment of the militia, the organization and discipline of the National Guard of the State of New York, and for the public defense,' passed April twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-two," are hereby repealed; but this repeal shall not affect the assessments already made, or which should have been made, for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, under the said sections; but the same shall be made, levied, collected, and paid into the State treasury, and the collection and payment thereof may be enforced as if the said sections were not repealed.

- $\S$  2. Section twelve of the said act, passed May the sixth, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- § 12. Section twenty-one of the Military Code of the State of New York is hereby amended so as to read: "The organized militia of the State shall be known as the 'National Guard of the State of New York,' and shall consist of such number of

divisions, brigades, regiments, companies and battalions, and such batteries, troops or squadrons, as the Commander-in-Chief shall determine and designate, provided that the aggregate organized force of the National Guard, in time of peace, to be fully armed, and equipped and uniformed, shall not exceed the number of twenty thousand non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates, and which shall be retained from the present organization; but the Commander-in-Chief shall have power, in case of war or insurrection, or imminent danger thereof, to make further drafts of the militia, and to form new regiments, battalions, batteries and troops, and to organize the same, as the exigencies of the service shall require."

- § 3. Section two hundred and eighteen of the act entitled "An act to provide for the enrollment of the militia, the organization and discipline of the National Guard of the State of New York, and for the public defense," passed April twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-two is hereby amended so as to read as follows:
- § 218. Every commissioned officer, and every non-commissioned officer, musician and private shall, on due conviction, be subject for the following offenses, to the fines thereto annexed:
- 1. Every non-commissioned officer, musician and private, for non-appearance, when duly warned or summoned, at a company parade, a fine of two dollars for each day; at a regiment or battalion parade or encampment, not less than three or more than six dollars for each day; and at a place of rendezvous, when called into actual service, a sum not exceeding twelve months' pay, nor less than one months' pay.
- 2. Every commissioned officer, for non-attendance at any parade or encampment, and every such officer, non-commissioned officer, musician and private, neglecting or refusing to obey the orders of his superior officers on any day of parade or encampment, or to perform such military duty or exercise as may be required, or departing from his colors, post or guard, or leaving his place or ranks without permission, a fine not more than one hundred nor less than five dollars.
- 3. For neglecting or refusing to obey any order or warrant to him lawfully given or directed, or to make a proper return thereof, if such return be necessary, or making a false return, or neglecting or refusing, when required, to summon a delinquent before a court-martial, or duly to return such summons, a fine not more than one hundred nor less than five dollars.
- § 4. Sections two and six of the act entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to provide for the enrollment of the militia, the organization and discipline of the National Guard of the State of New York, and for the public defense,' passed April twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, designated as the Military Code of the State of New York," passed April twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, are hereby repealed.
- § 5. The enrollment of persons subject to military duty provided for in sections four, five, six, seven, nine and twelve of the said act, passed April the twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, as amended by the said act passed April the twenty-second, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, shall be made only in every fifth year, commencing with the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one.
- § 6. Section two hundred and three of the said act, passed April the twenty-third eighteen hundred and sixty-two, is hereby amended to read:
- § 203. There shall be allowed and paid out of the treasury, on the certificate of the president and judge-advocate, to each division, brigade and special judge-advocate, and to the president and members of any court of inquiry or court-martial for the trial of officers, a sum equal to one day's pay for field duty, for each day he may be

actually employed in said court, or engaged in the business thereof, or in traveling to and from the court, allowing thirty miles for a day's travel, and to every marshal appointed by any such court, two dollars for every day employed in the execution of the duties required of him. The same to be paid in like manner with other military accounts.

- § 7. Section thirty-nine of the said act, passed April the twenty-third, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, is hereby amended to read:
- § 39. All vouchers and accounts under the last preceding section shall, from time to time, be audited by the Comptroller.
- § 8. The Adjutant-General shall have the rank of Major-General, and hereafter shall be the auditor of military accounts, instead of the Assistant Inspector-General.
- § 9. No person who has been or hereafter shall be regularly and honorably discharged from the army or navy of the United States, including volunteers in the late war, or who is a member of any regularly organized fire company in any city, village or town in this State, or is an exempt fireman, shall be subject to military duty except in cases of war, insurrection or invasion.
- § 10. In case of the election of a supernumerary officer to the command of a regiment, battalion, troop, battery or company, he may be commissioned with rank from the same date as that conferred by his previous commission for like office.
- § 11. The Governor may supply all vacancies in any of the militia offices of this State, that may happen during the recess of the Senate, in any case to which an appointment shall have been made by the Governor with the consent of the Senate, by granting commissions, which shall expire at the end of twenty days from the commencement of the next meeting of the Senate thereafter.
  - § 12. This act shall take effect immediately.

The following opinion of the Attorney-General in relation to the imposition of fines by Courts-Martial and imprisonment of delinquents for their non-payment, is published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

STATE OF NEW YORK,
OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL,
ALBANY, June 16th, 1869.

FRANKLIN TOWNSEND, Adjutant-General:

SIR.—The papers referred to me from your office have been examined.

From the papers presented, it appears the constitutionality of those provisions of

the military code, which authorize the imposition of fines by Courts-Martial and imprisonment of delinquents for their non-payment have been questioned.

It is suggested that the State laws establishing the summary jurisdiction of these courts to try and punish delinquents without presentment of a grand jury or trial before a petit jury, are violations of the provisions of the Constitution of the United States, contained in the several amendments of that instrument proposed at the first session of Congress after its adoption.

These amendments are not restrictions upon the powers of the States. They are restrictions upon the powers of the Government of the United States, intended to control the proceedings of the federal courts in the trial of offenses for crimes committed against the federal laws. Each State is at liberty, through the exercise of its legislative power, to prescribe for the punishment of all crimes and delinquencies on the part of its citizens, against the laws of the State, subject only to restrictions contained in its own Constitution.

The provisions of the military code for the imposition and collection of fines, and imprisonment of delinquents for their non-payment, are not in conflict with the State Constitution.

It is ordained by section one, of article two of the Constitution, that "The militia of this State shall, at all times hereafter, be armed and disciplined and ready for service."

From the provision contained in section six, of article one of the Constitution, usually denominated the Bill of Rights, declaring that no person shall be held to answer for crime unless on presentment or indictment of a grand jury, there are expressly excepted cases, arising in the militia, which this State may keep, with the consent of Congress, in time of peace.

All the powers of legislation necessary to give full effect to the requirement, that the militia shall at all times be armed and disciplined and ready for service, are conferred upon the Legislature.

If there be any department of the Government in which this authority is vitally essential, it is in the organization of our military force, on which we rest our ultimate dependence for the preservation of the public order, the enforcement of the laws, and our common security, whether in peace or war.

The National Guard is organized and disciplined with the consent of Congress.

The further provisions in the bill of rights of the State Constitution for trial by jury, in all cases in which it has heretofore been used, and declaring that no person shall be deprived of life, liberty and property without due process of law, are inapplicable to the police regulations and laws passed to give effect to the mandate of the Constitution that the militia shall be disciplined, armed and ready for service.

The exception of cases arising in the militia is contained in the same article in which these provisions are found, and in the same section in which is contained the injunction that no person shall be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law.

A fine for a military delinquency is imposed and imprisonment for its non-payment is inflicted by due process of law, by the judgment of a Court-Martial, if the laws are constitutional which create the court and confer upon it such jurisdiction.

I am of opinion, as before stated, these laws are constitutionally enacted. It has been held that when the Constitution speaks of a person not being held to answer for a capital or otherwise infamous crime, unless on presentment or indictment of a grand jury, it means to answer in a case of criminal proceedings, to answer crimin-

aliter with a view to punishment under the criminal law, and has no reference whatever to those collateral or incidental proceedings which are disciplinary in their character, or have exclusive regard to some special character or relation which belongs to the individual.

In the matter of Smith, 10 Wendell, page 449, the provision in the Constitution of the United States, in relation to the trial by jury, as we have seen, applies only to the federal courts; and our State Constitution secures the right in all cases in which it has heretofore been used.

It was never in use before or since the adoption of the Constitution, in cases like this.

Courts-Martial were in use as a means of enforcing discipline in the militia, by summary punishment of delinquents, long before the adoption of the Constitution. The provision applies only to cases of trials of issues of fact in civil or criminal proceedings in the courts of justice.

The general form of the warrant for the collection of fines, promulgated by General Orders No. 8, is sufficient and in compliance with the law. When such warrant recites the facts of the real accusation with certainty as to time and place, and the nature of the delinquency, within the law, such warrant is valid for the execution of the judgment of the Court-Martial, when such court is regularly and legally held.

The following opinion of the Attorney-General, in relation to exemptions from taxation of members of the National Guard, is published for the information of all concerned:

STATE OF NEW YORK,
OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL,
ALBANY, July 22d, 1869.

To his Excellency, John T. Hoffman, Governor:

SIR.—The question submitted by recent communications from the Executive Department and Adjutant-General's office, involving the inquiry whether certain exemptions from taxation of members of the National Guard are repealed, has been duly considered.

By section 146, of chapter 334, of the Laws of 1864, these exemptions were somewhat enlarged from those declared by previous enactments.

All officers, musicians and privates of the military forces of the State were declared to be exempt from jury duty during the time they performed military service, and from the payment of highway taxes, not exceeding six days in any one year.

Such persons not assessed for highway taxes were entitled to a deduction in the assessment of real or personal property to the amount of five hundred dollars.

Every person who served seven years, and was honorably discharged, was forever after, so long as he remained a citizen of the State, entitled to an exemption of six days' highway taxes in each year. And, if a resident of any city (where not liable for highway taxes), he was forever entitled to a deduction in the assessment of his real and personal property of five hundred dollars.

Section 146, of chapter 612, of the Laws of 1865, repealed all these exemptions, except from jury duty during the time such persons should perform military service.

By section 146, of chapter 502, of the Laws of 1867, these exemptions were re-enacted and considerably extended.

By this section all officers, musicians and privates were exempt from jury duty during the time they performed military service. They were entitled to a deduction in the assessment of their real and personal property to the amount of five hundred dollars, except that cavalrymen, artillerymen and mounted officers were entitled to a deduction of one thousand dollars on all classes of taxes.

It will be noticed that exemption from highway taxes, as such, is omitted in this provision; and that the exemption upon property is extended from five hundred to one thousand dollars to cavalrymen, artillerymen and mounted officers.

The following is the provision incorporated in the general appropriation act of the present year, which, it is claimed, repeals these exemptions:

"Section 146, of chapter three hundred and thirty-four, Laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, which exempts members of the National Guard from the payment of highway taxes, and which entitles them to a deduction in the assessment of real and personal property to the amount of five hundred dollars, is hereby repealed."

This attempted repeal, it is obvious, is directed at the wrong statute.

At the time of its passage the members of the National Guard did not derive the exemptions from section 146, of chapter 334, of the Laws of 1864, but such exemptions were given by the provisions contained in the Law of 1867, above cited.

It has been suggested, that although the wrong statute is named in the repealing clause, that there is enough in the reference to the subject-matter of the provision to effect the repeal.

The subject-matter recited is as variant from the exemption declared by the Law of 1867 as it is from the description of the statute.

There is no exemption from highway taxes, as such, provided in the enactment of 1867. There is a six days exemption declared in the act of 1864.

The provision in the paragraph of the appropriation bill, which declares that "Section 146, of chapter 334, of the Laws of 1864, which exempts members of the National Guard from the payment of highway taxes," clearly identifies the provision of the section and chapter specified by the subject-matter referred to as the one intended to be repealed, as no such exemption is contained in the act of 1867.

Again, this paragraph provides further, "and which entitles them to a deduction in the assessment of real and personal property to the amount of five hundred dollars, is hereby repealed."

By the act of 1864, the exemption of property allowed was fixed, in all cases, at five hundred dollars.

By the act of 1867, such exemption, when allowed, is fixed at five hundred dollars each to all officers, musicians and privates, except cavalrymen, artillerymen and mounted officers, who were each entitled to an exemption of one thousand dollars,

From this comparison it is obvious that the subject-matter referred to is the exemptions contained in the act of 1864, and not those contained in the act of 1867. It is difficult to conceive of the reasons for repealing the lesser exemption to a portion of the members of the National Guard, which would not operate equally to influence the Legislature to repeal the greater exemption of one thousand dollars, given by the act of 1867 to the other members.

It follows that the above clause, in the appropriation bill of 1869, does not at all touch the exemptions declared by the law of 1867, but that the provisions of that statute remain in full force, because its language as to the number of the chapter of the law, and its reference to the subject-matter, is expressly confined to the act of 1864.

It is suggested that the paragraph in question shows a clear intention in the Legislature to abolish these exemptions. If this had been their intention, why was not the repeal directed against the statute under which such exemptions were claimed?

Exemptions from highway taxes were given by the act of 1864, which were not given by the law of 1867.

The Legislature may have thought it prudent to repeal them, and also the exemption of the five hundred dollars of property, expressly, for greater certainty, although such exemptions had, in effect, been already repealed.

If it is argued it was the intention of the Legislature to repeal these exemptions, the short answer is, it has not done so. (The People v. Bell, 38 N. Y. Reports, p. 386.)

It is a rule, fundamental and universal, in the construction of statutes, that a repeal by implication is not favored, and the earlier statute remains in force unless the later is manifestly inconsistent with it, or unless the latter act take some notice of the former, plainly indicating an intention to abrogate it, and that a construction which repeals another statute should be very clear, especially when the repeal is of a part of a statute, and it seriously mars the harmony of a system.

I am of opinion that all the exemptions to members of the National Guard, declared by section 146, of chapter 502, of the Laws of 1867, still exist in full force, and are unrepealed.

In conformity to the provisions of chapter 778, of the Laws of 1869, requiring a reduction of the force of the National Guard, and to carry out in part contemplated changes in the organization of the 1st Division thereof, it is hereby ordered:

I. That the 4th Brigade be disbanded, and the staff officers thereof rendered supernumerary, and that the several regiments composing the same be disposed of as follows, namely: The 4th Regiment, Infantry, will be disbanded, the companies mustered out, and all the officers rendered supernumerary; the 11th Regiment, Infantry, will be transferred to the 2d Brigade; and the 22d, 69th and 79th Regiments, Infantry, will be transferred to the 1st Brigade.

II. That the 1st Regiment, Infantry, be transferred from the 3d Brigade to the 1st Brigade.

III. That the 1st Regiment, Artillery, be disbanded, and the field and staff thereof rendered supernumerary, and that the several batteries composing the same be disposed of as follows, namely: Batteries "B" and "K" will be retained in the service and remain mounted batteries; battery "C" will be retained in the service and be armed with light twelve-pound mountain howitzers; batteries "A," "D," "F" and "I" will be consolidated with battery "G" after special inspection shall have been made to determine which of their members should be dropped from the rolls for reason of continued neglect of duty, and all such must be dropped, and this consolidated battery "G" will be retained in the service and be armed with light twelvepounder mountain howitzers, and Captain E. M. Le Moyne, supernumerary, will be assigned to command the same until officers are elected and commissioned therefor. All the officers of the said batteries, "A," "D," "F," "I" and "G," will be rendered supernumerary by this consolidation. These several batteries which are retained in the service will report direct to head-quarters of the 1st Division. Battery "H" will be reorganized as a separate troop of Cavalry, and be attached to the 1st Brigade, Cavalry.

IV. That the several troops composing the "Battalion of Washington Greys, Cavalry," be consolidated into one troop, and that all the officers of the said Battalion be rendered supernumerary, and that First Lieutenant Effingham M. Van Buren be assigned to command the said consolidated troop until officers are elected and commissioned therefor.

V. That the 2d Regiment, Infantry, be disbanded, and that the companies be mustered out and all the officers rendered supernumerary.

VI. The provisions of General Orders, No. 14, series of 1868, will be followed and govern in the consolidations, disbandments and mustering out required by this order.

VII. Major-General Alexander Shaler, commanding the 1st Division of the National Guard, is charged with the execution of this order.

#### CIRCULAR.

GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS—STATE OF NEW YORK, ADJUTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE, ALBANY, May 17th, 1869.

The following sections of chapter 651 of the Laws of 1868 have been repealed by chapter 778 of the Laws of 1869; "but this repeal shall not affect the assessments already made, or which should have been made for the year 1868, under the said sections; but the same shall be made, levied, collected and paid into the State treasury, and the collection and payment thereof may be enforced as if the said sections were not repealed:"

- § 3. The assessors chosen in each city, village, town or ward, shall annually, and at the same time they are engaged in taking the assessment or valuation of real and personal property in their respective towns or wards, include in their assessment roll the names of all persons in their respective assessment districts between the ages of eighteen and forty-five years, liable to military duty under the Laws of the United States and the State of New York; they shall prepare an additional column in said roll which shall be headed "Military Roll," and in such column, opposite the name of every person not exempt from military duty, shall insert (one dollar) \$1.00. All of the provisions of this act in reference to the duty of assessors shall apply with equal force to the board of commissioners of taxes and assessments, under the direction of the board of supervisors for the city and county of New York, who shall be governed by and comply with each and every requirement of this law.
- § 4. On the day the assessors meet to review their assessment of real and personal property, they shall also determine who are exempt from military duty, and opposite the name of such persons shall insert "exempt," and to secure such exemption, any person who claims he is exempt from the performance of military duty by any law of this State or of the United States, shall, on or before such day and not thereafter, deliver to either of said assessors an affidavit stating such facts on which he claims to be exempt; such affidavit may be made before any person authorized to administer oaths; or before the assessors, or one of them, either of whom is hereby authorized to administer an oath for that purpose; and the assessors shall cause all such affidavits to be filed in the office of the city or town clerk; and if any person shall swear falsely in such affidavit he shall be guilty of perjury.
- § 5. The said assessors shall then deliver said roll, so embodied in the assessment roll of the town or ward, to the supervisor of the town or ward, except in the city of New York, where it shall be delivered to the clerk of the board of supervisors; and said supervisor or clerk shall deliver the same to the board of supervisors at their next annual meeting, and it shall be called the "military roll" of said town or

- ward. And the clerk of such board of supervisors shall, on or before the first day of January next ensuing, inform the Adjutant-General of the number of persons enrolled in each county; and the assessors and supervisors, in the execution of their duties, as prescribed in this act, shall be governed by the instructions which shall, from time to time, be transmitted to them by the Adjutant-General.
- § 6. The said sum of one dollar against every person who shall appear by the said assessment roll liable to pay the same shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as taxes are collected in each county; and the warrants annexed by the supervisors to the assessment rolls of the several towns and wards shall direct the collectors to collect the amount from every person appearing by the said assessment roll liable to pay the same, in the same manner as taxes are collected, and pay the same to the county treasurer. And when the name of any person between the ages of eighteen and twenty-one years shall appear on the said roll liable to pay the said commutation, the said warrant shall direct the collector to collect the same of the father, master or guardian, with whom such person shall reside, or out of any property such minor may have in the city, village, town or ward, and such collector shall proceed and execute such warrant; and no property now exempt from execution shall be exempt from the payment of such commutation tax.
- § 7. If any person shall neglect or refuse to pay the commutation assessment of one dollar as herein prescribed, and the collector of the town or ward to whom the warrant for the collection thereof shall be given, shall be unable to collect the same, it shall be the duty of such collector to return the names of all such persons to the treasurer of the county, who shall make a list of such delinquents and deliver the same to the board of supervisors at their next annual meeting, and said board shall add such sum to the annual assessment of such delinquents for the next year, the same to be collected and paid to the county treasurer, as provided by the preceding section.
- § 9. If any assessor or collector, or other civil or military officer, charged with any duty under the provisions of this act, shall refuse or neglect to perform any of the duties required of him by this aet, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of not less than fifty, nor more than one hundred dollars, to be recovered in the name of the people of the State of New York; and if such officer shall willfully neglect or refuse to perform such duties as hereby required, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and it shall be the duty of the district attorney of any county in which such delinquent offender resides, upon the complaint of said commissioned officer of the military force of the State, to prosecute the same. Any penalty incurred and paid, or collected under this section, shall be paid into the treasury of the county to the credit of the military fund of the State, and the costs of any such prosecution, if not collected, shall be a charge upon the county.
- § 10. The assessors shall be compensated for their services in making the military assessment rolls, as required by this act, at the same rate and in like manner as they are compensated for making the annual assessments of property; and in all cases where assessors are paid an annual salary for their official services, the board of supervisors shall provide for such additional compensation to said assessors as the duties hereby devolved upon them may require. The treasurer of any county or city, to whom any military taxes, commutation money, or fines shall be paid, may retain therefrom one per cent as his fee for the receipt and transfer of the same, and all collectors or receivers of taxes shall be entitled to add to and collect double the fees

for the military taxes or commutations, as are by law allowed to them for the collection of other taxes.

# REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR-GENERAL.

GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS—STATE OF NEW YORK, INSPECTOR-GENERAL'S OFFICE, ALBANY, Dec. 31, 1869.

Major-General Franklin Townsend, Adjutant-General State of New York:

In accordance with the provisions of section 274 of the Military Code, I have the honor to make the following report, to His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief:

There have been no encampments of the National Guard during the year past.

The returns required by par. 527 and 528, General Regulations, have been received from Major General-Alexander Shaler, commanding 1st Division; Brigadier-General Louis Burger, 2d Brigade; Brigadier-General Brooke Postley, Cavalry Brigade; and Colonel John Ward, commanding 12th Regiment Infantry. With the reports of Generals Burger and Postley were transmitted the returns from the commandants of Regiments in their respective Brigades, as required by General Regulations.

The returns of the following officers were made within the time required by regulations, viz.: Brigadier-General L. Burger, 2d Brigade; Colonel J. W. Mason, 6th Infantry; Colonel J. D. Krehbiel, 96th Infantry; Colonel H. Brinker, 1st Cavalry; Colonel J. H. Budke, 3d Cavalry. The others were not rendered within the time specified in the General Regulations. No returns have been received from any other officers than those named.

I beg leave to report that the 1st Division was paraded, with General Shaler in command, July 5th, October 6th, and November 25th; and the 2d Division, under command of Major-General Woodward, October 7th. The 1st Division was reviewed on the 6th of October, and the 2d Division on the 7th October, by the Commander-in-Chief. The 2d Brigade, under command of Brigadier-General

Louis Burger, was paraded for field drill, at Prospect Park, Brooklyn, on the 3d day of June, and the 11th Brigade, commanded by Brigadier-General J. V. Meserole, at the same place, on the 15th June. The Commander-in-Chief reviewed the 25th Infantry, at Albany, February 22; and the 7th Infantry at Saratoga Springs, on the 23d of July.

## REPORT OF THE PAYMASTER-GENERAL.

STATE OF NEW YORK—PAYMASTER-GENERAL'S OFFICE, ALBANY, December 31st, 1869.

To His Excellency John T. Hoffman, Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

I have the honor to present, in compliance with the requirements of the Legislature, my report showing in detail the operations of this department for the year 1869.

Although the payments made bear no comparison with those made by General Marvin and his predecessors, they show a slight increase over the payments made by General Olcott in 1868, the total payments in the past year being five thousand one hundred dollars (\$5,100), and in 1868 five thousand and forty dollars (\$5,040); the total number of claims paid being seventy-five (75), and the total number of applications being four hundred and thirty (430). Of the large number of claims rejected but two or three were deemed fraudulent, the others being made through misapprehension of the law. As the muster rolls show a large number still entitled to receive payment, I do not concur with the recommendation of my predecessors that the payment of bounties cease, and the funds remaining in this department be turned over to the State; and I very much regret that prior to my appointment to this office my predecessor did turn over to the State Treasurer some of the funds appropriated, and applicable to the payment of bounties under the proclamation of Governor Morgan, and under chapter 184, Laws of 1863.

The duties of this department, though not of an arduous character, require care, diligence and the closest scrutiny that the State may not be defrauded, and that justice may be rendered; and for the faithful performance of all duties I take pleasure in commending my assistant, Col. John B. Leverich.

The Commissioners of Public Accounts have not yet examined my accounts.

The following tables will exhibit in detail the business of the department.
