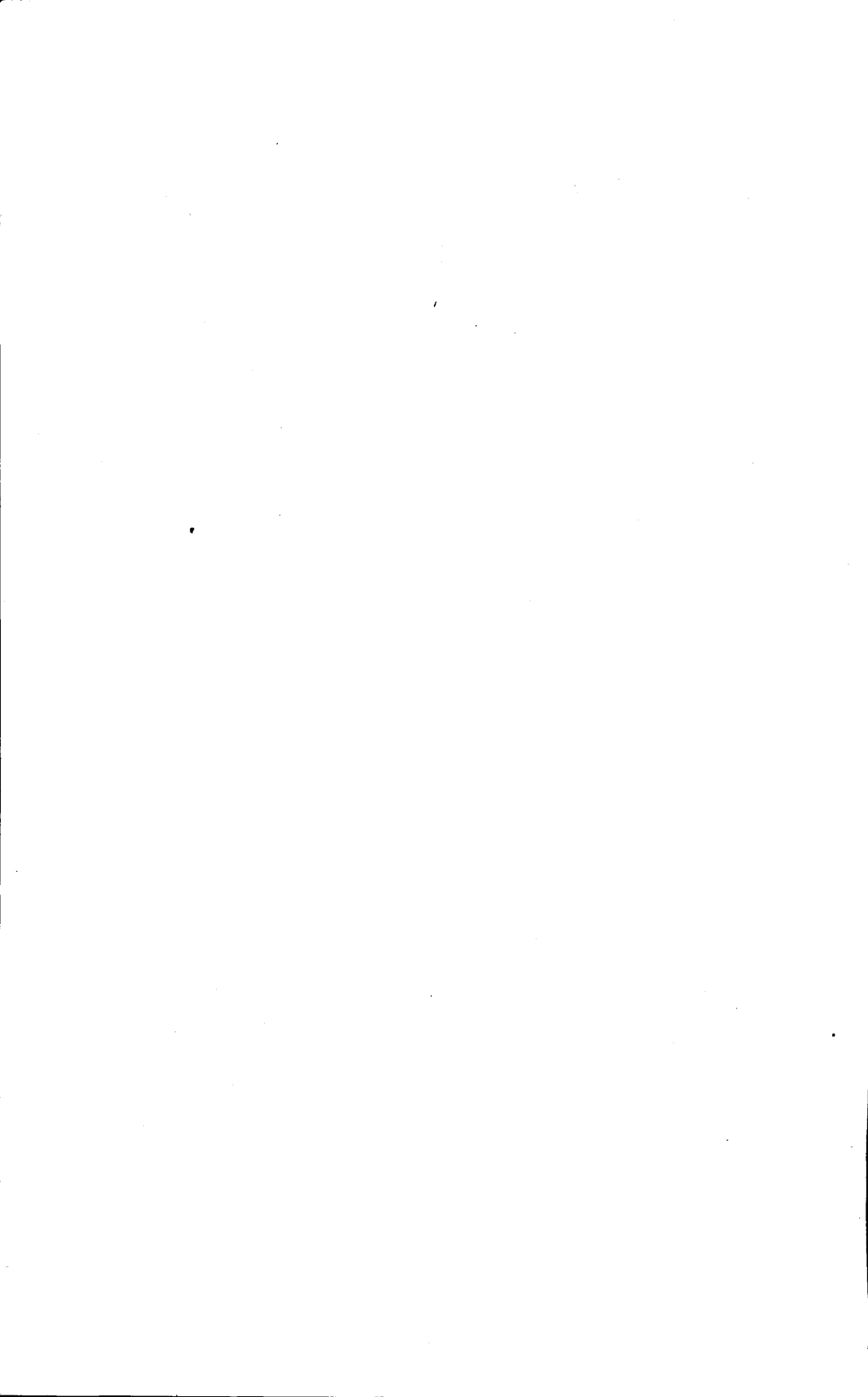

To His Excellency JOHN T. HOFFMAN,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief :

SIR.—I have the honor of making the following report from this department for the year ending with December 31st, 1870.

The efficient and otherwise satisfactory condition of the National Guard, of which I spoke in my last annual report, has continued to characterize the organization during the past year, and in many respects there has been great improvement. Indeed (it may be fairly assumed that), never before, in time of peace at least, has this important branch of the State government enlisted the interest of the people so much as at present; and the result is, that in localities where heretofore little, if any, disposition has existed on the part of either the local authorities or the citizens to aid the National Guard, great interest is now manifested, and liberal appropriations of money have been made. It is a matter of great importance to the State and to the country, that the National Guard should be maintained in such a state of discipline and efficiency as will make it available in case of emergency. To keep it in such condition will require an annual appropriation from the State of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).

The cities and towns in which the various organizations are located, contribute liberally toward their maintenance. The officers and soldiers of the National Guard render voluntary service at very considerable personal sacrifice of time and money, for which the exemption from jury duty and from a trifling amount of taxation, is no compensation. It

is hoped that the Legislature will manifest its interest in this organization by always making the necessary appropriations.

I speak confidently of the present condition of the National Guard because I have gained thorough knowledge of it from personal inspection of most of its organizations during the past year. In addition to your reviews of the First, Second and Third divisions; and of the Twenty-fourth, Twenty-eighth and Thirty-first brigades; and of the Thirty-fifth regiment; which took place in the fall, and in all of which I had the honor of assisting, I reviewed and inspected during the month of June last, the First, Second, Third, Fifth and Eleventh brigades, and the First Brigade of Cavalry. Having been present at so many reviews and inspections, I can speak personally, therefore, of the efficiency of these citizen soldiers in drill and discipline. In some instances, the brigade evolutions were so admirably executed that they would have done credit to regular troops.

ORGANIZATION.

During the past year the following changes have been made in the organization: One brigade and one regiment of cavalry, five regiments of infantry and one battalion of artillery have been disbanded; seven regiments of infantry have been reduced to battalions; and one regiment of infantry and one battery of artillery have been organized. And now the National Guard consists of eight divisions, twenty-four brigades, two regiments, one battalion, and seven separate troops of cavalry; two battalions and eleven separate batteries of artillery; thirty-nine regiments and seven battalions of infantry; and the grand aggregate of the force is twenty-four thousand, two hundred and eighty-five (24,285) officers, non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates.

ENCAMPMENTS AND TARGET PRACTICE.

During the past year there have been several encampments of organizations of the National Guard. I am impressed with the belief that the advantages derived in the short time that can be devoted to these encampments are more than counterbalanced by the great expense to the State which attends them, and the inconvenience occasioned by

the loss of time and consequent injury to business to which the officers and men are subjected by reason of their absence from their regular pursuits for several consecutive days.

Field days for target practice, at which the men might obtain a perfect knowledge of the weapon with which they are armed, and acquire confidence, skill and efficiency in its use, would, in my opinion, be preferable, and inure in a much greater degree to the benefit of the service. The mere routine of camp life will be easily learned when the troops are called to active duty.

UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENTS.

The Military Code, enacted at the last session of the Legislature, changed the mode of furnishing uniforms. Instead of issuing them directly by the State, through the Quartermaster-General's Department, as was done under previous laws, provision is now made for an annual payment to each organization (to be devoted exclusively to the procuring of uniforms) of a sum equal to five dollars for every non-commissioned officer, musician and private, who has, during the year, paraded the number of times required by the Military Code.

To inaugurate this new system fairly, and to place all on an equal footing, the several organizations have been completely uniformed and equipped. To do this required a larger expenditure than was anticipated. I shall, therefore, be compelled to ask the Legislature for an appropriation to supply the deficiency which exists; but I confidently believe that the allowance for such purpose, which can be made hereafter from the annual appropriation of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), will aid the organization so much, if the service required by the Military Code be rendered, that the renewal of uniforms, when necessary, can be readily accomplished.

BREECH-LOADERS.

Now that the superiority of breech-loaders has been so fully demonstrated in actual warfare, it seems to me that there should be no further delay in exchanging the muzzle-loading rifled muskets, with which the infantry of the National Guard is armed, for the most approved arm of the

kind loading at the breech. Referring to what is contained in my last annual report relating to this matter, I would now remark that, although I still hope that there may be recovered from the United States, on account of the war claims, a sufficient sum, in excess of the special tax due from this State, to pay the expense of the proposed exchange of arms, there is so much unavoidable delay in getting those accounts settled, that I would recommend that an appropriation be asked for, to accomplish the object at once.

STATE ARSENALS AND ARMORIES.

The Legislature having declined to adopt the recommendations contained in my last annual report that all the arsenals and armories belonging to the State, other than those located in the cities of New York, Albany and Buffalo, should be turned over to the county authorities of the localities in which they are situated, and that those authorities be required to take care of them, it became necessary during the past year to expend a considerable sum of the money appropriated for military purposes in making the repairs required to preserve the property; and there yet remains much to be done in that way to put the buildings in good condition, and annually thereafter some money will be needed to meet the cost of the repairs indispensable to their preservation. The additional land required for the purposes of the State arsenal in the city of New York, the proceedings for taking which, by the right of eminent domain, had been commenced at the time of making my last annual report, and of which I therein spoke, has been obtained, and all the provisions of the special act relating to that arsenal, passed in 1869, have been complied with.

BUREAU OF MILITARY STATISTICS.

The Bureau of Military Statistics has remained during the past year under the same charge as when I last reported, and continues to give entire satisfaction to this department and to the public. In renewing the lease of the building occupied by this bureau, I obtained a reduction of three hundred dollars (\$300) in the rent, and it is now twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200) per annum.

In connection with the affairs of this bureau I have further to report that, in compliance with the paragraph of the appropriation bill, chapter 281, Laws of 1870, which reads as follows: "The money belonging to the Military Record Fund, on deposit in the Albany City National Bank, and in the Mechanics' and Farmers' Bank in the city of Albany, together with the accrued interest thereon, shall be paid over by the said banks respectively, to the Treasurer of the State, on the order of the Comptroller; and the latter officer shall, from time to time, invest the same, together with the money now in the State treasury belonging to the Military Record Fund, so that at least six per cent interest shall be derived therefrom; and in his discretion he may make such investments in bonds issued by any of the cities of the State. The revenue derived from such investments shall be devoted exclusively to paying the expenses of the Bureau of Military Statistics in the Adjutant-General's Department." The said moneys were withdrawn, and all were so well invested that the income of the Military Record Fund will hereafter meet the annual expenses of the Bureau of Military Statistics so long as they are kept within the three thousand dollars appropriated therefor, and I can see no reason why those expenses should be increased.

STATE MILITARY AGENCIES.

With respect to the business formerly conducted by the State military agencies, and which devolved upon this department on the abolition of those agencies, I have to report as follows:

The amount of United States paymasters' checks, pension certificates, and treasurer's certificates in hand, January 1st, 1870, as stated in my last annual report, was nineteen hundred and twenty dollars and fourteen cents (\$1,920.14); amount received during the year, two thousand two hundred and sixty-four dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$2,264.69); amount delivered during the year, two thousand four hundred and sixty-eight dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$2,468.69); amount remaining to be delivered, one thousand seven hundred and sixteen dollars and fourteen cents (\$1,716.14).

SOLDIERS OF THE WAR OF 1812.

The Legislature having, at its last session, made a further appropriation of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for redeeming certain certificates issued to the soldiers of the war of 1812, a large amount of business relating thereto has been transacted in this office during the past eight months.

WAR CLAIMS AGAINST THE UNITED STATES.

The prosecution of these claims has been pressed with vigor during the past year, and one or more clerks have been constantly engaged on them. Notwithstanding all the difficulties that are met with in obtaining the signatures of

the parties to whom the military property of the State was issued, and also the other evidence required to make the vouchers satisfactory to the treasury department, there have been finally passed and allowed, claims to the amount of six hundred and five thousand and fifty-one dollars and twenty-nine cents (\$605,051.29) which reduces the amount of those suspended at the time of my last annual report to three hundred and twenty-seven thousand and eighty-one dollars and fifty-three cents (\$327,081.53).

There are many equally just claims of a like character, and amounting to several hundred thousand dollars yet to be presented, and I am very confident that not only the whole amount of the special tax against the State will be off-seted, but the United States will be brought in debt to the State for a very large sum. More detailed information with respect to these claims will be found in the report of the Assistant Adjutant-General, contained in the appendix accompanying this report.

CONCLUSION.

After another year's experience in the office which I have the honor to hold, and referring to what I said in concluding my last annual report, I heartily renew the expressions of my feelings with respect to the individual members of the National Guard, therein contained. Their continued and increased interest and exertions have encouraged me in every new step that I have taken, and have materially lightened my labors, which otherwise might have proved burdensome. The credit of the improvement which has been made, is mainly due to their efforts, and it rests with them not only to sustain the high reputation which the organization now enjoys, but also to still further increase its efficiency.

For the active aid and co-operation which Colonel John B. Stonehouse, Assistant Adjutant-General, and Major Alfred H. Taylor, Chief Clerk, and the other clerks and messengers in this office have rendered me, they deserve my warmest thanks; and they are entitled to the fullest commendation for the zeal and diligence with which they have discharged their duties.

The appendix accompanying this report is referred to for further information in detail.

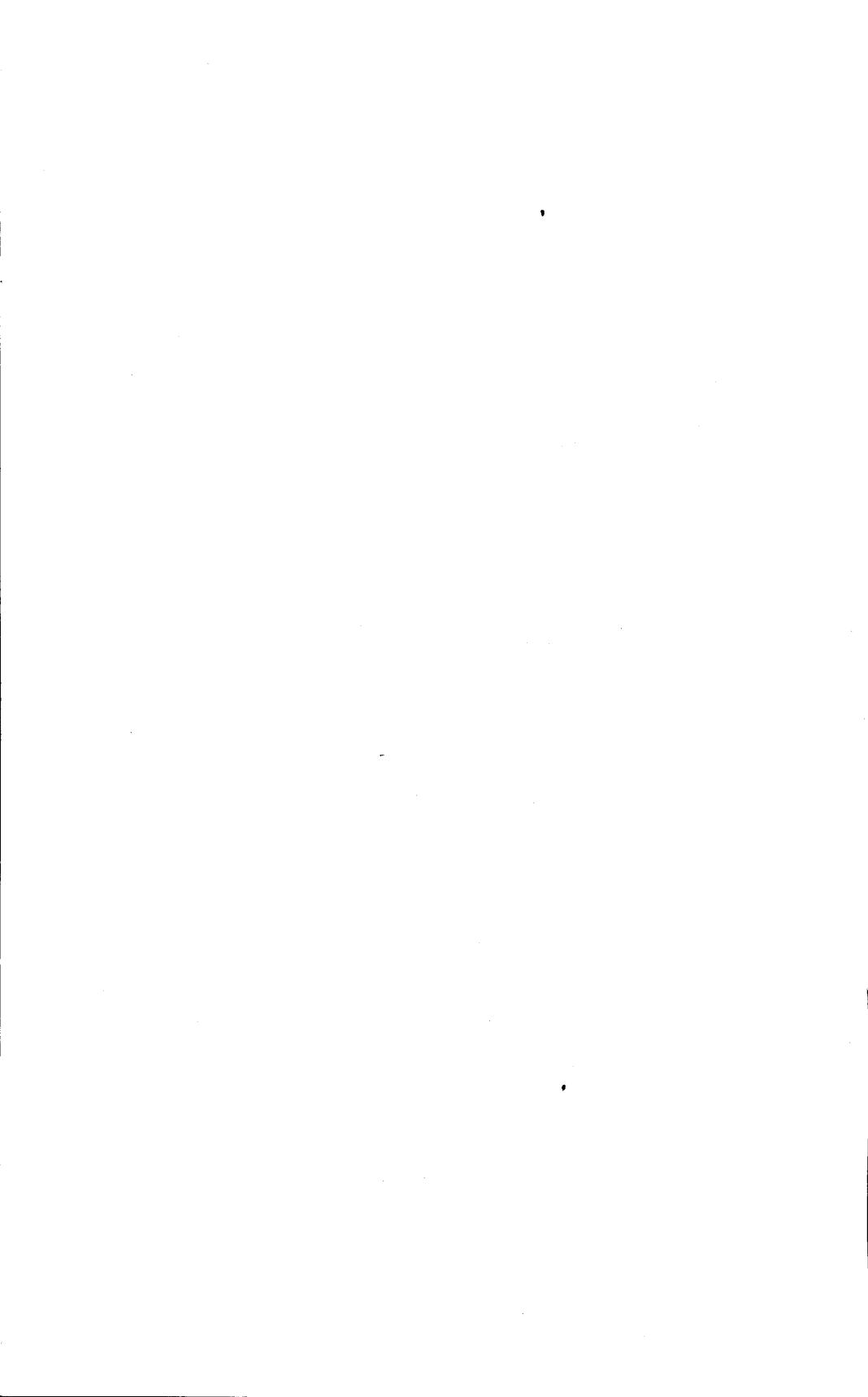

REPORTS OF DIVISION AND BRIGADE COMMANDANTS.

HEAD-QUARTERS FIRST DIVISION, N. G., }
NEW YORK, *December 1, 1870.* }

GENERAL.—In conformity with paragraph 528, General Regulations, I have the honor to make the following report of division parades and meetings, made and held in pursuance of orders from these headquarters during the year ending December 1, 1870 :

July 4th, 1870, division parade.

September 30th, 1870, division parade, Farragut obsequies.

October 26th, 1870, meeting of officers for instruction.

October 28th, 1870, division parade, reviewed by Commander-in-Chief.

I take the occasion of forwarding this report to call your attention to several subjects, some if not all, of which I have discussed verbally with you before.

The artillery attached to this command, consists of two mounted and two foot batteries. The first are all uniformed and equipped with the exception of red blankets, an addition which I consider not only of great importance to their appearance, but a part of their equipment which they could not do without if called into service. I would, therefore, respectfully urge that the proper orders may issue to have both batteries supplied with them or an equivalent, as soon as possible. The foot batteries are in good condition, well manned and officered. There are certain changes in the running gear of both of these which I have heretofore recommended, and which I think of sufficient importance to bring again to your notice in this official way. I would like to suggest that it would be in accord with the progress of the times, if one of these batteries should be armed with the new breech-loader, Gatling patent, or the Mitrailleuse, which has done such effective service in the Franco-Prussian war. Battery "G" has two guns in good order and two in not very good condition. Two of these guns might be transferred to battery "C," thus increasing it.

to a full battery of six guns. The other two might be turned into the ordnance department or retained by battery "G" and its complement made up by the addition of four Mitrailleuse. It would be the better plan, I think, to arm battery "G" entirely with the Mitrailleuse, rather than have two characters of guns in one command. The advantage to be derived from this change will, I consider, be so well appreciated at general head-quarters that I do not think it necessary to enlarge further upon it.

I believe it to be the policy of the State to arm the National Guard with the most approved weapons; and I would therefore strongly recommend that this command be supplied with the most approved pattern of breech-loading muskets. The superiority of this weapon has been so well proven, and the efficiency of the corps would be so much promoted thereby, that I hope the suggestion may meet with the consideration which, in my opinion, it deserves.

The matter of a parade ground for the First Division is a subject which increases in importance every year. There is now no suitable place within the near vicinity of this city sufficiently large to manœuvre the division upon. During the present year several of the brigades have proceeded to Prospect Park, Brooklyn; and once, on the occasion of a review to His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, the whole division was ordered out. By an inspection of the consolidated report forwarded for that review, it will be seen that not over one-half of the strength of the command paraded. The distance being so great, the expense incurred so heavy, and the time occupied in getting there so long, prevented this large number from going. Again, should the whole command have turned out, the space is not large enough to manœuvre them. Therefore, to enable the division to perform any service that the State may require of them, I deem it essential that they should have some place where they can be practiced in field manœuvres, etc., so that they may be ready at any time to perform any duty that may be called for with credit to themselves, the National Guard, and the State.

HEAD-QUARTERS SECOND DIVISION N. G., }
 BROOKLYN, *December 19, 1870.* }

GENERAL.—In compliance with section 528, General Regulations, I have the honor to report that during the year just passed the following division parades and meetings have been ordered:

1. *Division Parade.*—The division was ordered to parade on Friday, the 30th day of September, to participate in the obsequies of the late Admiral Farragut, U. S. N., which took place in the city of New York upon that day. The day proved an exceedingly stormy one; and owing to a provision made by the Grand Marshal, that in case of storm the parade would be postponed, the commanding officer of the Eleventh Brigade dismissed his command, after assuring himself that the storm would continue. The following troops, therefore, only paraded, viz.:

Together with the division commander and his staff. The troops were under the immediate command of Brig.-Gen. Thomas S. Dakin, Fifth Brigade, who was accompanied by a full staff. The several regiments mustered in good strength, and performed their duties in a most commendable manner. I regret to be compelled, however, to report that very great loss was sustained by the troops in damage of uniforms worn.

2. *Division Review.*—The division was reviewed by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, at the Prospect Park parade ground in this city, on the 18th day of October. The entire division was present upon the ground, and the review was conducted as provided for by form 1, article 2, appendix I, of Upton's Infantry Tactics. The several organizations paraded in average strength, and exhibited a great improvement since the review of the previous year, especially in the matter of uniform and equipments, the Thirteenth, Twenty-third, Twenty-eighth and Forty-seventh Regiments of Infantry wearing their newly-adopted full-dress uniforms.

3. *Meetings for Instruction.*—On the evenings of the 7th and 14th October, the commanding officers and adjutants of the several brigades, regiments, batteries and separate troops cavalry were assembled at division head-quarters and instructed in the duties of their several offices, and especially in relation to the forms of review.

4. *Brigade Reviews.*—The Adjutant-General reviewed and inspected the Eleventh Brigade, Brig.-Gen. J. V. Meserole commanding, at the Prospect Park parade ground, on the 9th of June; and upon the 21st of June he reviewed and inspected the Fifth Brigade, Brig.-Gen. Thomas S. Dakin commanding. The division staff paraded on both of these occasions.

5. *Annual Inspections.*—The several organizations in this command were assembled for inspection and muster between the 23d and 31st days of October. The following table shows the number present and absent, and the totals compared with last year's muster:

6. *Muster Out and Disbandments.*—The following changes have been made in this division during the year, in compliance with orders from general head-quarters: The Fifty-sixth Regiment Infantry was disbanded, the officers rendered supernumerary, and the enlisted men to the number of 386 mustered out of service on the 7th day of March. The Second Regiment of Cavalry was disbanded, the field and staff officers and officers of troops E and H rendered supernumerary, the enlisted men of Troops E and H to the number of ninety-eight mustered out of service on the 3d day of March. Troop A, Captain F. H. Kayser, has been attached to the Fifth brigade, and is now designated as "Separate Troop Cavalry, Fifth Brigade." Troop D, Captain John Kreuzer, has been attached to the Eleventh Brigade, and is now designated as "Separate Troop Cavalry, Eleventh Brigade." Troop C, Captain Thomas McCarty, has been attached to these head-quarters, and is now designated as "Separate Troop Cavalry, Second Division." The First Battalion Light Artillery has been disbanded as a battalion organization, the field and staff officers and officers of battery C rendered supernumerary, and battery C, comprising thirty-four enlisted men, mustered out of the service on the 3d day of March. Batteries A and B have been retained, are now attached to these head-quarters, and are designated as "Batteries A and B, Second Division."

7 *Parade Returns from Uniform Fund.*—The returns required

by section 113 of the Military Code, showing number of enlisted men who have made at least seven parades during the year ending December 1st, have been forwarded to the Adjutant-General's office the following number returned as having complied with the law :

GENERAL.—I have the honor to submit the following report of the operations of this division during the current year.

The One Hundred and Third Regiment, Col. Lamb, of the Nineteenth Brigade, went into camp at Norwich, on the 20th of September. Accompanied by my staff I reviewed the regiment on the 23d of September. Gen. Rhodes, the brigade commander, and his

staff were present. Col. Lamb is a veteran officer and a thorough disciplinarian, and his regiment needs only opportunities for drill to become one of the best in the division. It performed the following prescribed movements very creditably: Marching in line of battle, wheeling by fours in march, and advancing in line of battle in opposite directions, doubling column and deployments, forming and reducing square, breaking from line of battle into column by wheels, and by right and left of companies, changes of front, etc., etc. The manual of arms was very fairly executed.

The Eighty-sixth Regiment commanded by Col. Meech and composing part of the Eighth Brigade, commanded by Gen. Geo. Beach, assembled for inspection at Catskill, on the 26th of September. I reviewed the regiment on that day. The drill and discipline of the regiment are not as good as they should be. Many of the officers appeared to be ignorant of their duties, while others were inattentive. The regiment is composed of a splendid body of men, and with a moderate degree of study and energy on the part of the officers, would become a regiment they might well be proud of. Movements similar to those required of the One Hundred and Third Regiment, were executed; some well, others very poorly.

The Twentieth Regiment, Col. Van Rensselaer, also in the Eighth Brigade, paraded at Kingston, on the 27th of September, and was reviewed by me on that day. Many of the officers and men of this regiment are veterans, and the appearance of the battalion was very fine indeed. The execution of the prescribed movements was done with spirit and generally with accuracy.

I reviewed the Twenty-first Regiment, Col. Smith, at Poughkeepsie on the 28th of September. This regiment is also in the Eighth Brigade. Its appearance was unusually fine, and its discipline and drill speak well for the devotion and efficiency of its officers and the intelligence of the rank and file. The battalion movements above mentioned were well executed, as were also a variety of company movements by different companies of the regiment. Dutchess county is fortunate in the possession of so fine a body of citizen soldiery. Gen. Beach and his staff were present at the reviews of the regiments of his brigade.

On the 29th of September, I reviewed the Nineteenth Regiment at Newburgh. This regiment is commanded by Col. Dickey, an intelligent and efficient officer, and shows in its drill and discipline, the fruits of his diligent training. A commission composed of three officers of

my staff, directed to report to me which of the regiments of my division is, in their judgment, entitled to the guidon awarded to the best regiment of each division by the State Military Association, say: "In the comparison of the different regiments, the commission would give the preference to the Twenty-first for discipline and attainments in the school of the soldier and company, and to the Nineteenth for battalion manœuvres. The difference in the attainments of the two regiments was, however, more marked in battalion manœuvres than in their appearance as soldiers and drill in company movements. Upon the whole, therefore, the Nineteenth Regiment would seem to be entitled to the guidon." I concur in the conclusion at which the commission arrived.

On the 30th day of September, I reviewed the Ninety-first Regiment, Col. Wood, at Middletown. The day was exceedingly inclement and but about one hundred men were present. It would not be just to the regiment to indulge in any severe criticisms upon its appearance under the very unfavorable circumstances in which I saw it. I hope to have a better opportunity of forming an opinion of it at the next review.

Both these regiments were in Gen. Wm. R. Brown's brigade, who was present with his staff at the several reviews.

On the 25th of November, the Third Regiment, Col. Fay, made its first battalion parade at Yonkers. Much to my regret I was unable to be present. Colonel Westbrook, my A. A. G., and several other members of my staff, attended and reviewed the regiment. Colonel Westbrook reports to me concerning this regiment, that "its ranks were comparatively (it being a new organization) well filled with men of larger size than ordinary, and of soldierly appearance. The uniforms, which were of grey cloth, were very handsome. The march in review was fair; and a few battalion movements from line to column, and subsequent deployments, were executed with spirit, though from the recent organization of the regiment it could hardly be expected to compete, successfully, for the guidon. The muster and inspection resulted creditably; and the officers of the regiment exhibited satisfactory evidence of ability to forward its drill and discipline. It would seem, however, to be desirable to have no departure from the established uniform of the division." General Ryder, the brigade commander, was present with his staff.

I beg leave to incorporate the following extracts from the report of the commission already referred to :

“In summing up the general attainments of the regiments of this division, it is manifest that opportunities for battalion drills are sadly wanted, and that while many of the officers and men are eminently qualified for the discharge of their duties, many more of the number have shown themselves deficient in theoretical as well as practical instruction.

“In regard to the brigade commandants and staff, it may be observed that from the fact that only isolated regiments have been reviewed this year, sufficient opportunities have not been afforded to observe their drill and discipline. It is proper to remark, however, that they have uniformly presented a fine appearance, and have seemed familiar with the few duties they were required to perform on the field.

“The commission would especially commend the thorough inspection of Gen Brown, by whose inspector every arm was handled, and accoutrements examined, and every name called and present, or absent, marked on the muster-roll. Your commission would observe that, owing, doubtless, to the want of time, this duty was not always thus performed; but, at the same time, they would express the opinion that it should be made imperative at every annual inspection.

“In conclusion, this commission would observe that their opportunities have been quite limited for the proper discharge of the duties intrusted to them; which duties could only be thoroughly discharged in a camp of instruction in this division district, as contemplated by paragraph 157 of article 10 of the Code of 1870.”

In a division district embracing fourteen of the so-called rural counties of the State, with a force of about 2,500 officers and men dispersed through it, the difficulty of frequent battalion drills is manifest. It sometimes takes an entire day to travel from one extreme of a battalion district to another; and men cannot, in such circumstances, meet frequently for drill. Even an annual parade of but one day is almost useless for purposes of drill and discipline. It is in these districts that camps of instruction should be established, or at least the troops should go into camp by brigade for at least five days every autumn.

To the brigade and regimental commanders of my division, I feel under many obligations for their uniform courtesy, and for the cheerful alacrity with which they have complied with all orders from my head-quarters, and for the respectful deference they have invariably shown me.

To the members of my staff, and especially to Col. Westbrook, A. A. G., Col. A. J. Clements, Engineer, Col. R. Loughran, Surgeon, Lt.-Colonel John Denenbacher, Chief of Artillery, Lt.-Col. B. Gage Berry, C. S., and Majors H. D. Laffin and James H. Everett, Aides-de-Camp, I am greatly indebted for the intelligence and industry which they have brought to their several departments.

In a division with a territorial extent of 300 miles in length, by near 200 in breadth, the duties of the staff are not sinecures. None of these officers have traveled less than 600 miles in attending the reviews of the current year; while the distance traveled by some of them, especially by Col. Berry, greatly exceeds that. Yet the loss of time, the fatigue and expense incurred in the discharge of their duties, have been cheerfully borne, while each officer has seemed to maintain a friendly rivalry with his brothers of the staff, for the highest degree of excellence in those qualities which distinguish the officer and gentleman.

REPORT OF EVOLUTIONS

Practiced in the First Brigade, First Division, N. G. S. N. Y., commanded by Brig.-Gen. William G. Ward, for the year ending 1st December, 1870, pursuant to paragraph 527 General Regulations.

Under instructions from division head-quarters a class was formed, consisting of the field officers of the brigade and the brigade staff, for instruction in the sword exercise, during the drill season of 1869 and 1870, which was fairly attended, and to which Capt. Rowland M. Hall, of the brigade staff, was assigned as instructor. Some twelve meetings of the class were held and considerable progress made, as evinced by the more correct and graceful salutes given by the mounted officers of the brigade at the several reviews held during the year.

The field officers and adjutants of regiments and the brigade staff were also assembled for theoretical instruction, on the 30th of May, at the armory of the Twenty-second Infantry, when the proposed evolutions for the brigade field day were thoroughly explained and illustrated.

The brigade was paraded for review by the Adjutant-General, and general instruction, at Prospect park, Brooklyn, on the 10th of June. The weather proved exceedingly inclement, violent showers succeeding each other with but short intermissions during the entire day; despite which, the command turned out in a very satisfactory manner, and, with the section of artillery nine-pounders from Battery K, First Division, under command of First Lieut. Hoelzel, which was detailed to the brigade, performed its duties in true soldierly style. The ground being, as may be imagined, exceedingly wet and slippery, the evolutions intended to be executed were necessarily dispensed with, except the review, the firings, and a few changes of position. About 30,000 blank cartridges for small arms and fifty rounds of blank cannon cartridges were expended. Great steadiness was shown by the entire command, and much improvement was manifested, many of the volleys from the First, Twelfth, Twenty-second and Seventy-first Regiments being perfectly delivered; the file firing, also, being steady and well maintained.

The brigade also paraded with the First Division on the 4th of July, being reviewed by Brig.-Gen. McDowall, U. S. A.; on the 30th of September, the occasion of the Farragut obsequies, when the endurance and spirit of the command was again severely tested by a heavy rain storm; and on the 28th of October, at Prospect park, being there reviewed by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, previous to which the brigade was reviewed in deployed line by Major-Gen. Alexander Shaler, commanding the division.

The books and records of the several regimental head-quarters, and of the company commanders of the brigade, have been twice inspected by Major E. Gilon, of my staff, and much improvement has been shown.

The books and records of the Twelfth, Twenty-second and Seventy-first Regiments are nearly or quite in perfect order, and reflect much credit upon those responsible for their condition.

The inspection of the several regiments comprising the brigade was ordered and executed by regiment, a full report of which has been duly made by Major Gilon.

GENERAL.—In pursuance of paragraph 527, General Regulations, I have the honor to transmit herewith the annual reports of the regimental commandants of the Second Brigade, N. G. S. N. Y. Besides three division parades, this brigade paraded on the 3d day of June, 1870, at Tompkins square, in the city of New York, on which occasion the brigade had the honor to manœuvre in the presence of the Adjutant-General and Inspector-General.

The brigade being formed on three sides of the square, the Fifth and Sixth Regiments facing south, the Eleventh Regiment facing west, and the Ninety-sixth and Eighty-fourth Regiments facing north.

The following evolutions were performed :

- 1st. Opening and closing ranks.
- 2d. Advance in line of battle by different fronts.
- 3d. March by retreat in line of battle.
- 4th. March by the flank in advance and retreat.
- 5th. Column of fours to right into line.
- 6th. By company, right wheel, march in advance, and retreat and halt.
- 7th. Reform line of battle.
- 8th. Column by battalions, at twenty paces on first battalion, right in front.
- 9th. To advance in column of battalion and retreat.
- 10th. Deploy column of battalion.
- 11th. By the right of companies to the rear, with column.
- 12th. To half distance, close column.
- 13th. Form divisions and close in mass, on first division, first battalion.
- 14th. Line of masses on first division, first battalion.
- 15th. Advance and march in retreat in line of masses.
- 16th. Halt and rectify the alignment.
- 17th. Column of masses on second battalion, right in front.
- 18th. Line of masses on third battalion.
- 19th. To form square echelon on third battalion, at thirty paces, right battalions forward.
- 20th. Echelon into line of masses on fourth battalion.

The review and inspection preceded the foregoing evolutions of the line, and was closed with a dress parade as per appendix.

II. Upton's tactics.

A short parade through the city, closed the exercises of the day.

The field officers, the brigade staff and adjutants of the several regiments of this brigade, were assembled for instructions on January 5th and 19th, on February 2d and 16th, on May 27th and 31st, in the manual of the sword, the school of the battalion and brigade.

Brigadier-General Wm. Seebach, Commissary of Subsistence, of the Governor's staff, deceased, having formerly served in this brigade, he was buried with full military honors; the regimental commanders requested a parade of the whole brigade on June 13th, 1870.

This brigade paraded on the 30th of September, to participate in the obsequies of the late Admiral D. G. Farragut, in this city.

By General Orders No. 11, from Division Head-quarters, this brigade paraded on October 28th, for the review by his Excellency John T. Hoffman, Commander-in-Chief, at Prospect Park, Long Island.

By General Orders No. 28, from General Head-quarters, and Division Head-quarters No. 13, the Third Regiment of Cavalry, Col. John H. Budke, was transferred to this brigade, and the colonel has reported for duty to the undersigned.

It will be seen that nearly two-thirds of the amount remaining unsettled in December, 1869, has been allowed and passed to the credit of the State during the year 1870. To accomplish this has been a work of great magnitude. The accounts were complicated to an extraordinary extent by the transfer and retransfer of property from one officer to another; by the partial allowances and suspensions by three different departments of the general government at three different settlements; and by filing a great portion of the original vouchers and statements at Washington, of which neither copies nor duplicates could be found.

The vast number of items in these accounts, and the imperfect manner in which the records of the several State departments were kept in the early part of the war, and the loss of many vouchers during the eight years which have intervened since this claim was first presented, has all tended to make the prosecution of it most difficult and embarrassing.

Some idea of the amount of work which has been necessary in perfecting these accounts may be formed from the fact that the objections raised by the Treasury Department cover nearly 5,000 pages of foolscap paper; that in the preparation of answers to these objections it has been necessary to examine, critically, over 20,000 vouchers and statements, as well as the records of the several military departments of the State, covering the time from the commencement to the close of the war. It has also required persistent personal application to a large number of officers residing in this and neighboring States for

their signature to vouchers and other papers required by the accounting officers of the treasury.

I cannot speak too highly of the persevering industry and ability of Captain F. M. Butler, who has had charge of these accounts at Washington. He has been faithful and efficient, and by his persistent personal effort and good judgment has overcome difficulties which, at one time, seemed almost insurmountable.

The additional claims against the United States for war expenditures, referred to in my last report, amounting to between \$400,000 and \$500,000, I hope to have ready for the action of the authorities at Washington at any early day.

Among the interesting relics of war mementoes added to our collection during the past year are those bearing date of revolutionary times, war of 1812, the Mexican war, and our late civil war.

The volumes added to our library consist of histories of counties and of regiments, military reports and statistical tables; each valuable for the general information given, and as works of reference in our research for the glorious deeds of the past.

Oil paintings, engravings and photographs, of officers and privates, have been added to our portrait gallery; while personal histories have been gathered, diaries and letters copied, to preserve more faithfully the soldier's service in camp or on the battle field.

We have also received general orders from the several military departments of the United States, and county papers from the different counties of New York.

From your careful interest in the greater preservation of the battle-scarred flags gathered here, we have not only realized a saving in their wear, but a saving of time, labor and expense.

The number of visitors to the bureau during the year 1870 has been greater than that of any previous year since its organization, the whole number being about 35,000, ranging from 30 to 320 a day; the total showing an increase over last year of about 5,000. The months giving the largest figures are September and October. The number we find upon our register books is about 9,000. As it is only at the pleasure of the visitor his or her name is recorded, some are indifferent; while many become so interested in the collection, they unintentionally neglect to register their names; for these brief facts are but a faint expression of the people's interest in the memorials of our nation's sacrifices, struggles and triumphs.

The appeal of Captain Asa C. Jones, Co. "I," Fifty-first Regiment, National Guard, S. N. Y., from the proceedings, decisions, findings and sentence of a Brigade Court-martial, convened by Special Orders, No. 4, Head-quarters Twenty-fourth Brigade, National Guard, S. N. Y., May 8, 1869, and from the order of the Commanding General of the Twenty-fourth Brigade, approving the proceedings, findings and

sentence of said Court-martial, and also, from the order and decision of said Commanding General of the Twenty-fourth Brigade, dismissing appeal made to him in said case, having been referred to the Judge-Advocate-General in accordance with the provisions of section 280, Military Code, and returned to the Commander-in-Chief with the following opinion :

GENERAL.—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your communication, transmitting for my examination and report the appeal of Captain Asa C. Jones, Fifty-first Regiment, National Guard, S. N. Y., from the decision of a Brigade Court-martial, convened by order of the General Commanding the Twenty-fourth Brigade, N. G. S. N. Y., on the 7th day of June, 1869. I also acknowledge the receipt of the inclosures referred to in your letter, as well as your letter of the 13th instant.

I have carefully examined the record and other papers submitted in this case, and in reply to your queries have the honor to submit the following :

I. I am clearly of the opinion that the appeal of Captain Jones should have been made, in the first instance, to the Commander-in-Chief, and not to the General Commanding ; and

II. That inasmuch as no appeal was made to the Commander-in-Chief *within twenty days* after the decision appealed from was made known to the appellant, as required by section 202 of the Military Code, the appeal cannot now be entertained. The papers submitted with your letter show conclusively that more than twenty days had elapsed after the decision appealed from was made known to Captain Jones, before any appeal was taken to the Commander-in-Chief, or notice thereof given. The fact that there appears indorsed on the notice of appeal "Due and personal service of a copy of the within notice of appeal is hereby admitted," does not in my opinion, relieve the case of this objection. The admission of service by the members of the Court and the Judge-Advocate was purely an act of courtesy, and can neither prejudice nor advance the rights of the accused. If the appeal had been taken within the time prescribed by law, and the officers of the Court and the Judge-Advocate had declined to admit service, the accused would not, in consequence thereof, be estopped from proving the date of *the actual service* of the notice of appeal. Indeed, in this case there appears, among the papers submitted by the accused an affidavit of John C. Bennett, that the notice of appeal was served August 16th, 1869. It is clear to my mind that the fact not being in accordance with the admission the indorsement of "Due service" ought not and cannot be construed into an extension of the time provided by law for the taking of an appeal.

The papers inclosed in your letter are herewith returned.

I. In conformity with the provisions of chapter 778 of the Laws of 1869, and of the Military Code (chapter 80 of the Laws of 1870), requiring a reduction of the force of the National Guard, the following named regiments will be reduced to battalions of six companies each; the respective commandants of the same designating the companies to be mustered out to make such reduction. The several Colonels, Lieutenant-Colonels and Majors will remain in commission in accordance with the provisions relating thereto in section 19 of the Military Code, viz. : The Twenty-sixth Regiment Infantry, Twenty-first Brigade, Utica; Thirty-third Regiment Infantry, Twenty-first Brigade, Rome.

II. So much of General-Orders No. 17, current series, as directs that the Thirty-seventh Regiment be reduced to a battalion of six companies, is hereby revoked.

III. The Thirty-seventh Regiment National Guard is hereby consolidated with the Seventy-first Regiment, the combined force to be designated and known as the Seventy-first Regiment National Guard, S. N. Y. The several companies of these regiments will be reorganized and officers assigned thereto as follows :

Company A, of the reorganized regiment, will be formed by consolidating Company E of the Thirty-seventh, with Company A of the Seventy-first, with Samuel W. Osgood as Captain, Samuel B. Jackson as First Lieutenant and Thomas W. Love as Second Lieutenant.

Company B, will be Company B of the Seventy-first as at present constituted, with Charles W. Swift as Captain, Charles F. De Borst as First Lieutenant and Stephen Curtis, Jr., as Second Lieutenant.

Company C will be formed by consolidating Company D of the Thirty-seventh, with Company C of the Seventy-first, with Alfred Spear as Captain, Alfred P. Vreedburgh as First Lieutenant and John R. Davenport as Second Lieutenant.

Company D will be formed by consolidating Company H of the Thirty-seventh with Company D of the Seventy-first, with John H. Youmans as Captain, — as First Lieutenant and George C. Freeborn as Second Lieutenant.

Company E will be formed by consolidating Company A of the Thirty-seventh, with Company E of the Seventy-first, with James S. Turner as Captain, Gilbert W. Knight as First Lieutenant and Charles E. Brown as Second Lieutenant.

Company F will be formed by consolidating Company G of the Thirty-seventh, with Company F of the Seventy-first, with Charles H. Leland as Captain, Henry K. White as First Lieutenant and Beverly Ward as Second Lieutenant.

Company G will be formed by consolidating Company K of the Thirty-seventh, with Company G of the Seventy-first, with Abraham L. Webber as Captain, James T. Brinkerhoff as First Lieutenant, and Lewis R. Post as Second Lieutenant.

Company H, will be Company H of the Seventy-first as at present constituted, with Amos L. See as Captain, — as First Lieutenant and John R. Riggins as Second Lieutenant.

Company I, will be Company I of the Seventy-first as at present constituted, with Joseph A. Wise as Captain, Wm. A. Elmer as First Lieutenant and Theodore V. Smith as Second Lieutenant.

Company K will be formed by consolidating Company B of the Thirty-seventh, with Company K of the Seventy-first, with Wm. H. Cox as Captain, Sanford A. Taylor, as First Lieutenant and John C. Rice as Second Lieutenant.

The present field officers of the Seventy-first Regiment, viz. : Colonel Harry Rockafellar, Lieutenant-Colonel Geo. D. Wolcott and Major Eugene Eunson, will retain their respective positions in the consolidated regiment, together with such regimental staff officers as shall be designated by the Colonel.

All officers of the Thirty-seventh and Seventy-first Regiments, whose names do not appear on the foregoing roster of the consolidated regiment, are hereby rendered supernumerary.

Duplicate muster rolls of each of the consolidated companies will be made, showing the date of enlistment and muster-in of each officer and enlisted man ; one copy of which will be forwarded to these head-quarters, and the other retained by the commandant of the company.

All arms, uniforms and equipments, together with such other State property as may be in possession of the Thirty-seventh Regiment, or of any individual member thereof, will be immediately turned in to Brevet Major-General Wm. H. Morris, Chief of Ordnance, State Arsenal, New York city.

IV. The First Regiment of Infantry, now attached to the First Brigade, will be transferred to the Third Brigade.

In preparing the rolls of non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates, required to determine the amount of money each regiment, battalion and separate troop, or battery will be entitled to receive under the provisions of section 113,* Military Code, the following rules will be observed:

The name of each non-commissioned officer, musician and private who has paraded, fully armed and equipped, according to law, the number of times and on the occasions named in said section, will be entered upon said roll; non-commissioned officers according to grade, and privates in alphabetical order. Opposite each name, in the first four columns, which will be headed "Regimental" or "Battalion," will be given the date on which the several regimental or battalion parades were made. The three remaining columns will be headed according to the nature of the parade, and opposite each name will be entered the date on which said several parades occurred. Copies of the orders for each of the regimental or battalion parades will be attached to these rolls.

The letter of the company and the number of the regiment or battalion will be filled in on the blank line at the head of the roll and in the indorsement on the back.

Commandants of regiments or battalions will carefully examine these rolls, and, if satisfied of their correctness, will fill up and sign the form of certificate provided for that purpose. The company rolls will then be fastened together, the certificate

*§ 113. In lieu of uniforms being furnished by the State to non-commissioned officers and privates, as heretofore provided by law, there shall annually be paid by the State to the military fund of each regiment, battalion and separate troop or battery, for the purpose of aiding the non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates of said organizations in procuring their uniforms, a sum equal to five dollars for each of its non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates, who paraded during the year preceding, fully uniformed, armed and equipped, according to the provisions of this act, at least seven different times, four of which shall have been on the occasion of regimental, battalion, separate troop or battery parades. And in order to determine the amount of money to which each regiment, battalion and separate troop or battery will be entitled under the provisions of this section, the commandant of each regiment, battalion and separate troop or battery shall transmit to the Adjutant-General, during the month of December, and prior to the fifteenth day thereof in every year, a roll, giving the name and description of each non-commissioned officer, musician and private in his command, who paraded at least seven different times, as herein above specified, stating the occasions, during the year next preceding the said month of December, which roll the said commandant shall certify to on honor. And for the purpose of paying the said sums of money the Comptroller shall draw his warrants upon the Treasurer in favor of the county treasurers, in the same manner as is provided in section 178 of this act, on the certificate of the Adjutant-General and Inspector-General, approved by the Commander-in-Chief, showing the amount that each regiment, battalion and separate troop or battery is entitled to. The said money thus appropriated for uniforms shall be held sacred and inviolate for such purpose, and shall not, in any event, be expended for any other, provided, however, that the uniforms required, prior to the first day of October, 1870, may be furnished under the provisions of the laws in force at the time of the passage of this act.

In cases of separate troops or batteries, the dates of the seven different parades required to be made will be entered opposite each name; the parades which have been made under orders emanating from the commanding officers of the division or brigade to which they may be attached, will be so headed, and copies of such orders appended to the roll. It will then be transmitted to the Adjutant-General in the manner and time above specified, with the certificate of the division or brigade commander as to its correctness, attached thereto.

Great improvement has been attained by the officers and men of the National Guard during the year past.

The reduction rendered necessary by the enactment, in March last, of the existing Military Code, which fixes the maximum number of non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates, has had the effect of elevating the character of the force, by necessitating the disbandment of weak and inefficient organizations.

The *personnel* of the National Guard is excellent. I do not hesitate to say that no organization of militia has ever attained a higher state of discipline; and in proficiency of drill, many of the regiments compare favorably with carefully trained regular troops.

I think, however, that any further reduction of the National Guard would be unwise. The necessity for the maintenance of a reliable military force to sustain the civil power, in cases of great emergency where such aid is absolutely necessary to its enforcement, is fully appreciated by our citizens, and care should be taken to keep

the force large enough to render it available at short notice, which can be done only by a proper distribution of its numbers in different localities. An efficient, well-disciplined National Guard, armed with serviceable weapons, and properly equipped, not only saves a large expenditure for police purposes, but obviates the necessity, and removes the pretext, for the employment of the federal military power, which should not be permitted to interfere arbitrarily with the internal affairs of the States.

My experience induces the belief that the benefits derived from encampments hardly compensate the trouble and expense. If encampments could be held remote from cities and large villages; if the men could be induced to remain during the entire period assigned, and would discharge their duties as soldiers faithfully, and with a sincere desire to improve in martial exercises, I have no doubt encampments could be made highly beneficial to the service; but, with the liberal extension of furloughs, which is the practice, and the restlessness under the restraints of discipline, which unfortunately manifests itself, particularly in organizations outside of the larger cities, I doubt whether much benefit is derived. Frequent field-days and constant target practice are better calculated to promote the efficiency of the National Guard than encampments.

I have no further suggestions to make. The new Military Code is admirably adapted to the government of the National Guard, as is evident from the fact that no amendments seem to be required. The exchange of the condemned muzzle-loading arms for breech-loaders has become an absolute necessity, and I presume that no suggestion is required to prompt the proper authorities to afford the means for the change, which can be deferred no longer with safety.

My assistant, Colonel John F. McQuade, has discharged the duties assigned him satisfactorily.

REPORT OF THE PAYMASTER-GENERAL.

To His Excellency, JOHN T. HOFFMAN,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

SIR.—I have the honor to report the disbursements made through this department during the year 1870.

The total amount disbursed was six thousand two hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$6,275), of which amount four thousand dollars (\$4,000) was paid from the general fund for the support of the National Guard, for the expenses of the encampment of the Twenty-eighth Brigade at Binghamton, in August.

The number of claims for bounties were about 400, of which but thirty-one were allowed and paid. Thus it will be seen that the larger share of the claims are worthless, and that the duties of this department are not to pay out money simply, but to pay those claims only which, after a thorough and patient search of the muster rolls and records, are found to be valid.

This department has furnished information, from time to time, as regards reimbursements of bounties under chapter 29, Laws of 1865, to many town and county officials, also to the Auditor's department at Washington, as to reinlistments and bounties paid, all of which has required considerable time and careful examination of the records.

I take pleasure in commending my assistant, Colonel John B. Leverich, for the promptness and care with which he has discharged all the duties of his office.
