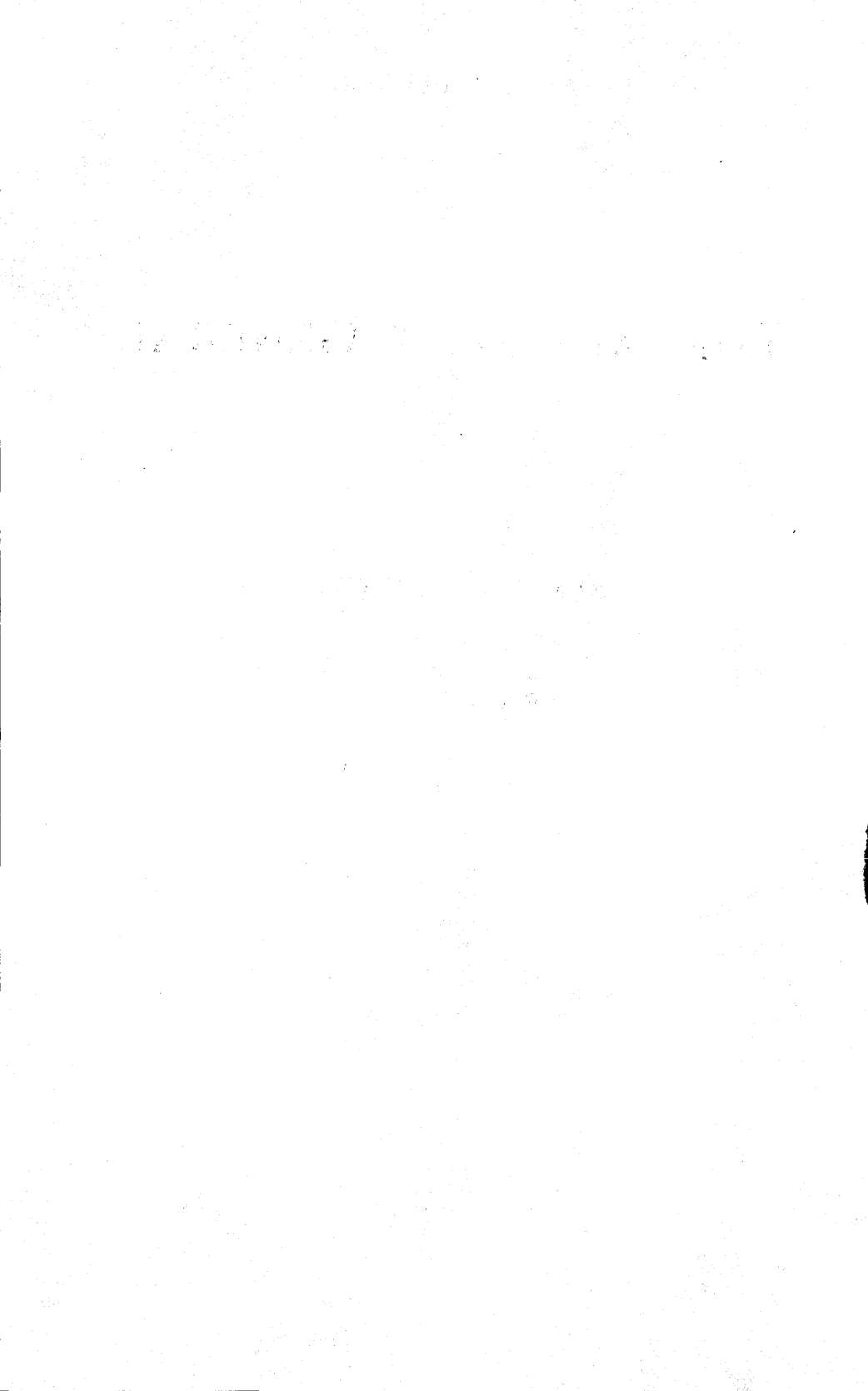

To His Excellency, The Governor of the State of New York:

SIR.—I have the honor to report as follows:

During the calendar year now ending, the land and naval forces of New York have reached a state of discipline and a degree of efficiency beyond any hitherto attained. It has been the aim to make the State service as nearly like that of the United States in merit and fitness as could reasonably be expected, considering the inherent differences which exist between the regular service and that of our State.

As the most populous and wealthy State in the Union, it is but right that New York should in time of peace do her fair proportion towards providing a well organized, equipped and trained force for the defence of the nation in case of need; and, as the greater includes the less, any such force so organized, equipped and trained, will be the more effective in the repression of any internal disorder which may arise.

Attention is respectfully invited to the need of legislation to provide a proper range for small arms and field artillery practice, which is urgently required for the use of the National Guard and Naval Militia stationed in New York City and vicinity, comprising the greater portion of the forces of the State.

The report of the Major General, setting forth in detail the organization, strength and operations of the National Guard, is transmitted herewith as Appendix A.

The report of the Commodore, as commanding officer of the Naval Militia, is transmitted as Appendix B.

The summary of the financial operations of my office is transmitted as Appendix C.

The following report covers the work of the National Guard during the past year:

I. ORGANIZATION.

During the year ending September 30, 1913, the following changes in the organization of the National Guard have been made.

ORGANIZED.

- Battery A, First Field Artillery (Brooklyn), December 16, 1912.
- Battery C, First Field Artillery (Brooklyn), December 16, 1912.
- Battery E, Second Field Artillery (Bronx), May 19, 1913.
- Battery F, Second Field Artillery (Bronx), May 19, 1913.
- Battery B, First Field Artillery (Manhattan), May 19, 1913.
- Companies L and M, Forty-seventh Infantry (authorized), September 17, 1913.
- Company M, Sixty-ninth Infantry (authorized), September 24, 1913.

REORGANIZED.

On October 26, 1912, Battery A, First Field Artillery (Syracuse), was detached from the First Field Artillery and designated Battery A, Field Artillery; on the same date the Second Field Artillery was disbanded and Batteries A (Bronx), B (Brooklyn) and C (Binghamton) were assigned to the First Field Artillery as the First Battalion thereof.

On December 16, 1912, Battery A, First Field Artillery (Bronx), was detached from the First Field Artillery and designated Battery B, Field Artillery; Batteries A (Syracuse), B (Bronx), and C (Binghamton), Field Artillery, were organized into the Second Battalion, Field Artillery; the commanding officer, First Field Artillery, was directed to organize two (2) additional batteries to be designated A and C, respectively.

The Second Field Artillery was organized January 10, 1913, and Batteries A, B, and C, First Field Artillery, and the Second Battalion, Field Artillery, less Battery C (Binghamton), were assigned to the Second Field Artillery; Battery A (Syracuse) being designated Battery E, Second Field Artillery; and Battery B (Bronx) as Battery D, Second Field Artillery; Battery C, Second Field Artillery (Binghamton), was detached from the Second Battalion and assigned on this same date to the First Field Artillery as Battery C of that regiment.

On May 19, 1913, Battery E (Syracuse), Second Field Artillery, was detached from that regiment and attached to the First Field Artillery as Battery A thereof; new batteries, E and F, (both in Bronx), Second Field Artillery, and Battery B (Manhattan), First Field Artillery, were organized.

Pursuant to this reorganization the State now has two complete regiments of Field Artillery.

The Cavalry reorganization was completed pursuant to G. O. 27 and G. O. 28, A. G. O., which leaves in the State one complete regiment of Cavalry, known and designated as the First Cavalry, one Machine Gun Troop, and one separate Squadron, composed of four troops, known and designated as First Squadron, New York Cavalry.

Under the provisions of Circular 8, Division of Militia Affairs, 1913, the National Guard is required to conform in the organization of its units to the organization prescribed for similar units in the Regular Army. This necessitated the reorganization of the Cavalry of the State as above set forth, and will within the time prescribed by the provisions of Circular 8, require the reorganization of the Quartermaster's Department, Commissary Department and Pay Department, into a Quartermaster Corps. Certain changes are also required to be made in the organization of the Coast Artillery troops of the State.

2. STRENGTH OF THE NATIONAL GUARD.

The following is a summary of the strength of the National Guard for all corps, departments, and arms of the service, showing the number of officers and enlisted men at the date of the last semi-annual return, September 30, 1913.

The total strength on September 30, 1912, was 16,519. The difference between the totals of the two years shows a net loss of 39.

3. COURTS MARTIAL.

The following is a summary of the court martial cases during the year ending September 30, 1913.

Private William H. Allen, Battery D, Second Field Artillery. Charge: "Conduct to the prejudice of good order and military discipline." Final result: Dishonorably discharged with loss of time served.

4. SERVICE IN AID OF CIVIL AUTHORITY.

During the period of excessive floods in the Mohawk and Hudson River Valleys, in the month of March, Companies A, C and D, Second Infantry, were called out to aid in the preservation of life and the safeguarding of property. Their service, covering a period of five days (March 28th to April 1, 1913), was satisfactorily performed.

On the 4th day of April, 1913, Company M, Third Infantry, and on the 5th day of April, Company C, Third Infantry, were called out in aid of the civil authorities by the mayor of the city of Auburn to protect certain mill property in that city from possible destruction and to preserve order in the city during the period of a strike by employees of the mills. There was great disorder in the city and some shooting by the disorderly element, which necessitated the calling out of these commands, but with their arrival order was promptly restored. Company M, Third Infantry, was on duty for a period of twenty-one days (April 4th to 17th and April 29th to May 5th, 1913), and Company C, Third Infantry, was on duty for a period of ten days (April 4th to 14th, 1913). In addition to guarding the property men-

tioned, and preserving order, a course of practical military instruction was carried out by Major John B. Tuck, which was of much benefit to the two companies constituting Major Tuck's command.

On the 6th day of May, 1913, the mayor of the city of Syracuse called out in aid of the civil authorities of that city, Troop D, First Cavalry, Company C, Third Infantry, and Battery E, Second Field Artillery, all stationed in that city. The occasion of the call was a shooting affray, the result of the efforts of the local police force to preserve order among strikers and sympathizers. The strike concerned a public street improvement. In the shooting affray several of the police were wounded and others were injured by stones and other missiles. By order from these headquarters, Major Howard K. Brown was placed on duty to command the troops above mentioned. The Cavalry troop and company of infantry patrolled the streets and maintained excellent order, the battery being held in readiness in its armory. All available time was utilized in the training and instruction of the personnel of the several commands. The conduct of the men was excellent and the service of all concerned was efficiently performed. On the 8th day of May, 1913, a fire broke out in the stables of D Troop, but owing to the promptness and gallantry of the officers and enlisted men of the battery and the troop, the flames were confined to a relatively small area, and a relatively small amount of property was damaged. The period of the service of Battery E, Second Field Artillery, terminated on the 10th day of May, 1913, and Troop D, First Cavalry, and Company C, Third Infantry, on the 14th day of May, 1913.

In the month of April, 1913, the employees of the trolley roads in the city of Buffalo were on strike and much railroad property was being damaged and destroyed. On the 8th day of April, 1913, a Justice of the Supreme Court, under the provisions of section 115 of the Military Law, issued an order calling out the command of Brigadier General Samuel M. Welch, in aid of the civil authorities. The brigade commander issued the necessary orders, and with promptness the concentration of his troops commenced. The Sixty-fifth and Seventy-fourth Regiments of Infantry, stationed in Buffalo, were ready within a few hours. The companies of the Third Infantry from their several stations in the western part of the State began their movements promptly, the regiment arriving in Buffalo the following morning. After the arrival of the out of town units of the brigade, the brigade commander soon had the situation in hand, and so disposed his troops that the railroad company was enabled to open up first one line and then another, without serious interference. The difficulties between the employees and the railroad company were finally terminated by mutual agreement, and on the 12th day of April, the troops were relieved from duty. The situation was well handled by the brigade commander. The many and important legal questions which arise in service of this character, and the problems of supply and communication involved in the operations of the brigade, were handled with marked efficiency by the staff of the brigade commander. The discipline of the several commands was good.

The Treasurer of the County of Erie, after the submission to him of bills covering the expense of this service, refused payment on the ground that a Justice of the Supreme Court had no authority to call out troops of the National Guard under the circumstances, and that the provision of the Military Law authorizing him to make such call was unconstitutional. This attitude resulted in much delay in the payment of the bills and embarrassed not only the creditors who had furnished supplies to these organizations, but also the commanding officers of companies in the matter of the payment of their own men for the service rendered. Through the resourcefulness of the brigade commander, arrangements were made for the payment of the troops, while the legal questions involved were fought out in the courts. A mandamus proceeding was instituted to compel payment of the account and an order of the Special Term of the Supreme Court obtained directing such payment. From this order, however, the County Treasurer appealed to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court. The decision of the latter tribunal confirmed the order of the Special Term, whereupon the Treasurer appealed to the Court of Appeals. The result of this appeal was the affirmance of the order by the latter court.

I was personally present and inspected the troops on duty at Auburn, Syracuse and Buffalo.

5. FIELD TRAINING.

In accordance with the policy outlined in the last Annual Report, the Third and Fourth Brigades had each a tour of field service in the month of August, the former at Gleus Falls, and the latter at Farnham, New York. The service was satisfactorily performed. The officers of the First and Second Brigades and of the auxiliary arms were detailed as student officers at the several schools of application, the work at each school being carried out in connection with a provisional unit of the particular arm at war strength. The following are the schools, with the period of their duration:

- School of Application, Infantry, Peekskill, New York, June 1-21, 1913.
- School of Application, Medical Corps, Peekskill, New York, June 15-21, 1913.
- School of Application, Engineers, Peekskill, New York, June 22-28, 1913.
- School of Application, Signal Corps, Peekskill, New York, June 15-21, 1913.
- School of Application, Cavalry, Montauk Point, New York, June 21-29, 1913.
- School of Application, Field Artillery, Long Island, New York, July 3-23, 1913.

The instruction at these schools was carefully prepared in detail during the late winter and early spring of the year by the members of the Academic Board of the School of the Line and Staff, and it is probably a correct statement that no instruction given our officers in any previous school has been so detailed and thorough and produced such marked results. In these schools of application no liquor of any kind or for any purpose whatsoever was permitted to be used by any officer or enlisted man. This rule had a distinct influence for good on the work carried out and in the end proved popular to those affected by its application.

The fundamental principle underlying the work of the schools of application was thoroughness in the essentials which make for efficiency in war. Discipline, sanitation, supply, and the mechanism of the company in combat were therefore subjects to which much time was devoted. The principle of thoroughness of instruction and training in these essentials will continue to be the underlying principle in the extension of the work of the School of the Line and Staff. It is proposed to extend this character of instruction ultimately to include the reinforced brigade, so that officers and men may know the possibilities and limitations of the other arms and develop the proper coordination and team work when the mission involved calls for the use of the combined arms.

SCHOOL OF APPLICATION, INFANTRY.

The school at Peekskill consisted of two parts, first, the work of the provisional company, second, the work of the student officers who were selected to attend the school.

First: The provisional company was composed of 150 enlisted men and 5 officers selected from the different regiments in the city of New York with a few selected from up-state regiments. The men were selected on account of their physical condition and not on account of their military knowledge. The company was mixed as to knowledge and had men with from two recruit drills to a number of years' service in the National Guard. Seventy-five per cent of the men had less than a year's service. For six weeks prior to the commencement of the school at Peekskill, these men were kept at squad drill in the Seventh and Twenty-third Regiment armories three nights a week, until they understood the movements and could execute them properly, both in close and extended order, before they were advanced to larger units. The advantage of this was that individual errors could be detected and corrected at once, whereas if these men had been drilled as a company these errors would not readily have been corrected. To correct individual errors in a company of 150 half instructed men, would have been a much less efficient method of training.

Lieutenant Colonel William H. Sage, U. S. Infantry, Senior Inspector-Instructor, Infantry, in his report to me says: "At the end of the three weeks I consider that the company was in excellent shape; they had received instruction (and had profited by it), that no company in the National Guard and few in the Regular Service had ever received. On account of the instruction and knowledge of fire discipline and control a regiment formed of companies as good as the provisional company could take the field at once. The material in this Company was not better, except physically, than the material in any company in the National Guard."

The use of ball ammunition in the attack and defense was of great benefit as it necessarily made the men more careful and more subservient to discipline and was a great factor in teaching fire control.

Second: The student officers were formed as a company and drilled as such, by Captain G. H. White, U. S. Army, Inspector-Instructor. In these drills no attempt was made to secure uniformity or even approach to it. It was only sought to point out to these officers the errors most commonly made by them in their methods of instruction, and the proper method of executing tactical movements. An attempt was made to have each officer act in all grades, from private to captain commanding a company. The student officers were required each morning to accompany the commanding officer on his daily inspection of the camp of the Provisional Company, and different features of a camp (kitchen, garbage incinerators, messing, different kinds of sinks, etc.), were discussed. Each student officer was considered as commanding the Provisional Company, and was required to submit daily ration returns, sick reports, and morning reports, covering fictitious changes in the company. They also made out a descriptive and individual property account book (descriptive list and individual property account of an enlisted man). This was a valuable course of instruction. Before this, the subjects meant nothing to many of them. The instruction was practical and the main idea was never lost sight of, viz.: that every officer should know the duties pertaining to his office, and know also the duties of his subordinates, so he might properly instruct and correct them. The officers of the Provisional Company were Captain Walter L. DeLamater, Seventy-first Infantry; Captain Henry T. Ashmore, Twelfth Infantry; Captain Edward Hodges, Twenty-third Infantry; Captain Thomas M. Sherman, First Infantry; Captain Timothy J. Moynahan, Sixty-ninth Infantry, and First Lieutenant Arthur H. Snowball, Forty-seventh Infantry.

The work of the student officers and the Provisional Company included marches and bivouacs, and many practical field firing problems. The fire discipline of the company towards the end of its service was such that the fire was under perfect control of the company commander by visual signals, and in the advance of squads and other subdivisions in attack formations, the covering fire of the line was properly accelerated, and delivered to perform its mission. Although at times the line seemed literally to be sending its fire between the squads advancing in its front, so perfect was the fire control and discipline that no accident resulted.

SCHOOL OF APPLICATION FOR OFFICERS OF THE MEDICAL CORPS.

A School of Application for officers of the Medical Corps was established at Peekskill on June 15th and continued to June 21st. This School was primarily designed to meet the requirements of instruction for Junior Officers. A Provisional Regimental Hospital Corps Detachment of twenty-four men was present in camp throughout the school period. The work of the school was of a practical nature. The officers were drilled and administered as a Regimental Hospital Corps Detachment. They were instructed in the Hospital Corps Drill Regulations, being given an opportunity to command the Provisional Detachment, and were also drilled as Hospital Corps men. The course of instruction included practical horsemanship, riding, driving four-line teams, loading of wagons, the use and management of the pack saddle and practical packing. Each officer was required to act as commanding officer of a theoretical Hospital Corps Detachment, and each day prepare and submit the necessary company reports and returns. One practice march was made by the officers of the school and a bivouac established, in which they remained over night, preparing their own food. The school was of great benefit to all officers who attended.

SCHOOL OF APPLICATION, ENGINEERS.

Forty-three officers of the Corps of Engineers were assembled at the State Camp on June 22-28 to pursue a course of instruction in company administration and the details of military engineering. Drills were carried on from 7:40 to 11:30 A. M. and 1:45 to 4:00 P. M., guard mounting and parade at 4:30 and 5:00, and a lecture at 7:00 P. M. Rank was waived in making assignments to duties; the officers were given an opportunity to carry on the minor details of work so that they can better instruct their noncommissioned officers hereafter. The officers attending were divided into classes in ponton bridges, improvised land bridges, sketching, fortifica-

tions and demolition, the schedule permitting every officer to receive instruction in the various classes of military engineering. Bridge work was carried on with heavy and light pontons, portable trestles, piles, and improvised work with spars. Road sketches of the surrounding country, reconnaissances of camp sites and a surveyed map of the proposed alteration of the target range were made. A defensive position was occupied and typical firing trench, parapet, and a splinter proof cover were constructed. Instruction was given in the use and precautions for high explosives, with demonstrations of the effect of military mines and of the methods of carrying out demolitions. A tactical walk (selection of outpost position) and a tactical problem (rear guard action, attack and defense of a bridge) occupied two drill periods. The duration of the school (7 days) was too short to permit thorough instruction in both engineering and infantry work. As the latter can be covered to some extent in armory drills, the camp period was devoted mainly to military engineering. A period of 12 days is needed to carry out a well proportioned schedule of instruction. The instruction at the school was aided by the formation of a provisional company of seven officers and 143 enlisted men. The company officers were Captain Frederick A. Onderdonk, Captain Joseph J. Daly, Captain Charles H. Smith, Captain Daniel R. Lucas, M. C., First Lieutenant Guy Bates, Second Lieutenant Rudolph L. Zimpel, Second Lieutenant Edward C. O. Thomas and Second Lieutenant Peter F. Burns, Corps of Engineers. The company marched to Peekskill in three days. The experience of marching, making camp in the field, subsisting on the march, and caring for the animal transport was of marked value to all concerned. The work of this company was noteworthy and reflects credit on the officers and members of the company. Three officers of the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army, were assigned to duty with this school. A pack train, a company tool outfit, a lithographic outfit, a photographic outfit, and a detachment of thirty enlisted men of the U. S. Engineers was sent from Washington Barracks, D. C. A large amount of engineer equipment and a detachment of six enlisted men were sent from the U. S. Military Academy at West Point. Much assistance was given by the Division of Militia Affairs, War Department, in aiding the instruction at the School. Both officers and enlisted men worked with interest and good spirit at the duties assigned them. The progress shown was most gratifying. It is felt that this school can well be used as a basis for any future camps of instruction.

SCHOOL OF APPLICATION, SIGNAL CORPS.

The School for Officers of the Signal Corps was held at Peekskill for a period of one week during June. A detachment of Signal troops consisting of 27 men, 28 horses and 3 mules, was detailed for service during the School, thereby enabling the student officers to obtain a practical familiarity with the radio sets, laying and recovery of wire, and the operation of the various instruments collateral thereto.

SCHOOL OF APPLICATION, CAVALRY.

The School of Application for Cavalry was held at Montauk Point, Long Island, June 21st to 29th, 1913. The basis of this school was a provisional troop of Cavalry made up of equal sized detachments from each of the sixteen troops of the State, making a troop at war strength. These detachments were composed almost exclusively of non-commissioned officers of their respective troops serving here as privates. The First Sergeant, Quartermaster Sergeant, Stable and Mess Sergeants, and trumpeters were ex-regulars, each man proficient in the duties of his position. The troop was commanded by Captain Lincoln C. Andrews, U. S. A., Senior Inspector-Instructor, Cavalry. The school was attended by practically all of the Cavalry Officers of the State, sixty in all. In the conduct of the school every attention was paid to accuracy and detail in the administration of a troop in the field, to camp sanitation, and stable management, and to discipline. The work done was exclusively such as may not be done at the armories. Except for two short periods of drill the commands were held by National Guard Officers detailed for the purpose. These details were changed frequently so that all officers had an opportunity for command, according to their grade, on several occasions. The entire day was spent in practical work and a school for informal discussion attended by both officers and men was held each evening at six o'clock. In addition to the Cavalry troop a machine gun unit of two guns from the machine gun troop was present as a sepa-

rate unit and under the special instruction of a Regular Army officer detailed for the purpose. The work accomplished at this School was most satisfactory for the enlisted personnel as well as for the officers. It established uniformity of instruction throughout the New York Cavalry as no other method could have done. It was particularly valuable in its practical lessons to the various troop First Sergeants and Quartermaster Sergeants, who learned much from the ex-regulars occupying those positions in the Provisional Troop.

SCHOOL OF APPLICATION, FIELD ARTILLERY.

The object of the school was to train all the officers and as many of the non-commissioned officers as possible in field work and target practice. For this purpose a provisional headquarters detachment at peace strength and a provisional battery at peace strength were organized from the various batteries of the State. These men were selected and carefully examined physically. Certain preliminary training was given these men prior to the commencement of the school. They were assembled at Brooklyn and taken to Floral Park, Long Island, where three days additional training was given them as a unit. The progress shown during this time was remarkable. The officers were taken in two groups, one-half of them reported at Floral Park, Long Island, and were on duty for eight days; the other half reported at Westhampton, Long Island, and remained on duty for ten days. The officers who were present for the first period reported at Montauk, Long Island, for the target practice. For this purpose this provisional unit was considered as a battalion. The field officers with the necessary staff being assigned to the command of this battalion each day, and the necessary line officers being assigned for duty with the Battery. During this period of duty officers were instructed in handling the batteries, in the care of men and animals, and in the care of the matériel. The officers not on duty with the Battalion were instructed in map making, sketching, sanitation, computation of firing data, adjustment and care of instruments and administration. Daily work consisted of a practice march of from eight to twenty miles, with a tactical problem to complete each day's march. In the evening a critique was held on the daily work, in which all the errors made by the officers during the day were pointed out. The target practice was participated in by all officers. It was found that due to the short time and the loss of practically one day, due to rain, the tactical part of target practice had to be eliminated and the school was conducted similar to that at Fort Sill. Each officer was called upon to fire one problem, the targets simulating as near as possible those that are met in war. The target practice as a whole was very successful. While the officers were slow at first, the time of conducting the fire soon showed marked improvement. A total of 806 rounds were fired at this practice. The discipline of the officers and men during the entire school was excellent. The animals used during the camp belonged to the various battery organizations in the State and were satisfactory animals. There were no horses lost during the entire trip of twenty-one days. This is a commentary on the desirability of the State owning or controlling military animals in numbers sufficient to supply schools of this size.

Three Regular Army officers and four non-commissioned officers were detailed for duty with this School. This number was not sufficient. There should have been at least five officers to carry out this work to the best advantage.

A detailed report covering the curriculum of the several schools of application is on file at Division Headquarters.

G. SERVICE OF OFFICERS AT FEDERAL SCHOOLS AND EXERCISES.

The following Cavalry Officers were detailed to Winchester, Virginia, in September, 1913, and served with the Cavalry Brigade at that place:

7. COAST ARTILLERY CORPS.

Other than the service of the officers above enumerated, the Coast Artillery troops of this State had no field training during the summer of 1913, owing to lack of State funds.

The armory training of the 31 companies of Coast Artillery forming the 8th, 9th and 13th Artillery Districts, was as specified in G. O. 166, War Department, 1911. This work was both theoretical and practical and embraced the following: Coast Artillery instruction, infantry drill, guard duty, small arms firing, first aid and signalling. This instruction showed a marked improvement over that of previous years. More time was devoted to artillery work than ever before, and progressive schemes of instruction, superintended by fire commanders were inaugurated. Oral examinations were held for first and second class gunners and there were on April 1st, last, 144 first class gunners and 138 second class gunners in the corps. Written examinations were held twice during the year for rated positions (gun commander, gun pointers, plotters and observers) and there were on April 1st, 1913, the following number of rated men in the corps: Gun commanders 15, gun pointers 11, plotters 16, and observers 15. The service of these men, owing to the comprehensive examinations completed by them, are invaluable during the target practice. The examinations for officers under G. O. 166, W. D. 1911, for the following courses: Basic, Emplacement Officer, Range and Communication officer, Battery Commander, Searchlight Officer, Fire and Battle Commander, have been given twice during the year. While the results of these examinations have been generally satisfactory, there are still remaining a number of officers who fail to take the examinations or whose marks are not satisfactory. The dummy armament furnished by the Federal government has been installed in the armories of the 9th and 13th Districts, and the foundations for the same have been completed in the new 8th Artillery District Armory. In the first two named districts complete artillery drill and practical instruction with the material is now being held, so that, by developing the instruction along progressive lines, the troops of these two districts should go to camp much better prepared in the fundamentals of artillery work than ever before.

An advanced class of officers who have completed at least four courses under G. O. 166, W. D. 1911, has been formed to study advanced coast artillery work, and the subjects of map reading and minor tactics. The class will at an early date be given instruction in the coast defense war game as now played in the United States Coast Artillery School at Fort Monroe, Va. This war game will be also used to instruct all field officers of the corps in their duties as fire and battle commanders. It is proposed to give these officers more responsibility in their respective duties while present at the next camp of instruction at Fort Wright.

8. CORPS OF ENGINEERS.

The officers of the Corps of Engineers and a provisional company attended the School of Application for Engineers, noted above.

On April 19, 1913, the 22d Regiment, Engineers, changed post to its new armory at 168th street and Fort Washington avenue. This armory is located in a residential section of New York City, furnishes comfortable quarters with locker room for 100 men per company, and is well equipped for target practice and physical training, but is not well adapted for engineer troops. The result of the improved location and accommodations is apparent in the increase in strength for the six months ending September 30, 1913, 118 men, and in the stricter selection in accepting recruits. The class of men being accepted for enlistment is very promising. The state of training of the regiment in engineer drill was well demonstrated in the Military Tournament in Madison Square Garden, New York City, during November. A provisional company constructed a serviceable bridge 125 feet long, crossed it, and then destroyed it. Some of the officers of the Corps of Engineers have shown need of instruction in riding. Their service in the field will be mounted. A riding class is being conducted to correct this deficiency. Some provision is needed for training a portion of the enlisted personnel in mounted duties. About one-fourth of an engineer organization needs this training for duty as drivers and in the mounted section of the companies for service in the field. The services rendered by engineer organizations in neighboring States during the Ohio floods of March and April, 1913, exemplify the value to this State of maintaining this organization which can be called on in case of flood or other similar disaster.

9. CAVALRY.

The training of the various Cavalry organizations has progressed during the year satisfactorily in accordance with the course of instruction prescribed by the Academic Board, School of Line and Staff. Interest in the work has been maintained at a high standard and the troops are unquestionably more efficient to-day than ever before. Every organization maintains Cavalry mounts for use in instruction and drill, aggregating in all about six hundred cavalry animals. Excepting the troops stationed in Brooklyn every organization has added voluntary field service at some time during the year. These include Saturday afternoon exercises, bivouacking for the night and returning Sunday afternoon after spending Sunday forenoon in field exercises. Some of the organizations have made frequent occasions to get at least a few of their men out of doors for drill in varied ground. The Buffalo troop was in the field voluntarily for one week, during which time the troop commander conducted daily marches and field exercises, highly beneficial to the troop. This class of training is of the greatest value in making Cavalry and those organizations which have had initiative and ambition to do this work in addition to the regular schedule of work are to be highly commended.

Interest in small arms firing has been maintained throughout the year in all the Cavalry troops. The up-State troops who have access to out-door ranges have improved their privileges in this connection and shown marked progress in shooting. The Syracuse troop, at full strength and with 100 per cent. attendance, winning the highest shooting score of any organization in the State by a handsome margin.

Interest has been aroused in some of the organizations where terrain is available in field firing problems. These problems give real training in troop leadership and practical experience in fire control. They are of great value in training. Such a problem was conducted as one of the exercises at Montauk Point and participated in by all members of the troop, thus disseminating throughout the State a clear conception of what such problems may be made for interest and training. This problem at Montauk was conducted in a manner approaching battle conditions as nearly as could be without the presence of an actual enemy. The high degree of troop leadership displayed by the officers and of fire discipline displayed by the men in the ranks was most gratifying and in marked contrast to the similar exercise held by a provisional troop made up from the New York and Brooklyn Cavalry Troops at Peekskill two years ago; and demonstrated practically the real advance that these organizations have made in efficiency and training.

10. FIELD ARTILLERY.

Since the last Annual Report the Field Artillery organization of this State has been completed and now consists of two complete regiments. Due to the fact that in completing these regiments it was necessary to split up some of the old batteries, the strength of individual batteries was much depleted, but recruiting since this time has been fair and the batteries should soon reach a strength sufficient to allow the proper training. There has been established at Tobyhanna, Pa., by the War Department, a school for the technical training of Field Artillery officers, and the instruction of the various Field Artillery organizations of the Army and the Militia. This school was not taken advantage of last year by any organizations in New York State, due to the fact that the time set for this school conflicted with the school work in this State. The coming year some of our officers will take advantage of the school. The training of Field Artillery should follow practically the lines laid down for the year 1913, but on a larger scale, thus making the scheme of instruction progressive. It is not thought that any of the organizations should participate this year in the field maneuvers. Theoretical training as laid down in G. O. 33, c. s., Division, has been strictly followed by the Field Artillery. It has aroused a great deal of interest and all the officers are working hard. The results of the first examination were excellent.

11. INFANTRY.

The 3d Brigade, made up of the 1st, 2d and 10th Regiments of Infantry, were encamped near Glens Falls from August 2d to 9th, inclusive. A provisional company in each regiment composed of its noncommissioned officers was drilled one hour each morning under the immediate supervision of the Inspector-Instructor on duty with the regiment. The line officers were required to be present as observers, their attention being invited to the most common errors of omission and commission made by instructors. They also received theoretical and practical instruction in combat principles.

The officers of each regiment formed as a company were drilled by the Inspector-Instructor each afternoon for about an hour, going over the same ground covered by the provisional company in the morning. Lectures were delivered in the evening to the assembled officers on various military subjects.

Daily instruction in equitation was given the assembled Field Officers by the Inspector-Instructor of Cavalry. Mounted scouts and orderlies received daily theoretical and practical instruction in their duties by Major William R. Wright, N. Y. Cavalry, First Lieutenant Harry Pfeil, U. S. A., Inspector-Instructor, Field Artillery, and First Lieutenant James L. Kincaid, N. Y. Cavalry.

The Fourth Brigade, composed of the 3rd, 65th and 74th Regiments of infantry, camped at Farnham, N. Y., for ten days in August. The work done corresponded to that of the 3rd Brigade.

12. MEDICAL DEPARTMENT.

The Medical Department has continued, during the year 1913, to make steady progress in education. A School of Application for Junior Officers was held at Peekskill, June 15th to 21st, inclusive, at which the work was of a practical nature and of great benefit to the class of officers for which it was designed. During the year 1913 there was no field service for the Field Hospitals or Ambulance Companies. Since the first of the year a continuous campaign has been carried on to render typhoid immune as many officers and men as possible. At the present time about one-fourth of the commissioned and enlisted personnel have received complete inoculation of the typhoid prophylactic. The importance of the abolition of typhoid fever in the military service cannot be over-estimated. Although this fact has become generally recognized, there is still remaining on the part of certain individuals prejudice against and reluctance to submit to the "typhoid vaccination." It is believed that this prejudice will be overcome and greater interest taken in the matter of typhoid prophylaxis in the future. No cases have been reported in which the reaction caused any trouble beyond that of a temporary discomfort. A new paragraph of the Regulations now requires that each recruit be inoculated with the typhoid prophylactic within fifteen days of the date of the approval of his enlistment. This provision will materially increase the number of typhoid immunes in the service.

13. SIGNAL CORPS.

The requirement of the War Department that the companies should be equipped as field companies has been complied with. In addition, the companies have in their possession a valuable amount of signal property consisting of instruments of various kinds — wire, insulators, lance poles, etc. — not a part of the equipment of field companies, but which is an exceedingly valuable equipment, to enable the Signal Corps to provide for contingencies apt to arise in the State service. The Legislature last year did not amend the Military Law of the State to meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Organized Militia for Signal Corps, and of the Field Service Regulations which provide for a battalion organization, nor to make any other changes in the Military Law to provide for the conditions which now confront the Signal Corps. As last year and the year before, recommendations will be made covering this matter.

14. SMALL ARMS PRACTICE AND TRAINING.

The rifle practice during the season of 1913 was held for the first time under the course prescribed by the War Department for the Organized Militia. It was promulgated in G. O. No. 9, A. G. O., in February, 1913, and the practice started on April 14th at Peekskill for the troops attached to the Headquarters' Division, and the 1st and 2d Brigades, situated in New York City. It is hard to make any comparison with the work of previous years, on account of the difference in the system. I am, however, of the opinion that the course is a good one, and if men will be taught during the coming drill season in the armories what is required of them on the field range, I look for a material increase in the number of qualifications if the course is continued for one or more years. The percentage of attendance at small arms firing, except in the 3d and 4th Brigades, was extremely unsatisfactory, seldom more than 50 per cent. reporting for record practice. The total qualifications with the rifle, including experts, sharpshooters and marksmen, were 2,434 out of 9,943 practicing. The field artillery, sanitary troops and bandsmen practice with the revolver under the old qualification with that arm, as no course with the pistol for the Organized Militia has yet been promulgated. At the Camp of Instruction at Peekskill, during the School of Application for the Infantry in June last, many field firing problems with ball ammunition were carried out. This was the first time that a series of such problems were tried. The accuracy of fire was not that which will be expected after several years of similar practice, but the problems illustrated the need for such training. The enlisted men comprising the Provisional Company were not as a whole even good "target" shots, and had had no previous training as a company in field firing problems. Their accuracy suffered by reason of this lack of training, but would undoubtedly have rapidly improved had the training continued.

Three different problems with ball ammunition were used on stated occasions:

1. An attack on the butt representing an intrenched enemy.
2. The defense of an intrenched line against an attacking force.
3. The attack of a position protected by covering troops.

In the first problem the troops advance covered by an advance guard, the advance guard was fired on (blank ammunition) by kneeling pasteboard silhouettes appearing at one end of the trench, more figures appearing as the advance guard deployed; the entire trench was then occupied by defenders (kneeling silhouettes on 7 foot sticks); after the defenders had gained their position, prone silhouettes on 7 foot sticks, were raised above the parapet, left 5 seconds, withdrawn and immediately appearing somewhere else, this continued until the attack had reached 200 yards where the trench was abandoned by men carrying at double time the kneeling silhouettes above the parapet to the end of the trench.

In the second problem the troops built trenches, and after completion manned them, groups of disappearing targets starting at 1,000 yards appeared at different points in the advance to 300, then retreated to 1,000 yards. Five groups were used in the advance and five in the retreat.

In the third problem the troops attacked as in the first problem, but when they arrived at 200 yards they were attacked on the right flank by a group of disappearing targets 400 yards away. This group covered an intrenched position about 1,000 yards distant. In the attack on this position disappearing targets appeared at different parts of the advance, appearing and disappearing according as the attack lost

or gained fire superiority. After the first exercises the men had an opportunity to see the result of this fire. The result of the fire in the second and third problem was communicated to them. The student officers and the Provisional Company combined in the second and third problems.

Before engaging in battle exercises with ball ammunition the student officers were given a course of instructions in firing at bobbing targets, expert marksmen course, to familiarize them with the use of ball ammunition and picking up disappearing targets.

15. THEORETICAL INSTRUCTION.

During the indoor drill and instruction season the theoretical instruction of officers and enlisted men was carried out under the supervision and control of the Academic Board of the School of the Line and Staff, referred to in the last annual report. The personnel of the Academic Board during the past year follows:

Work of the academic year culminated in written examinations held simultaneously at specified posts throughout the State in May. The result of the written examinations is published in General Orders Nos. 34 and 35, Division, 1913.

The most important function of the School of the Line and Staff was to establish uniformity of methods of instruction in a force aggregating more than 16,000 officers and men. The plans of the Academic Board could not have been effectively carried out except for the loyal co-operation of the regimental and post commanders and the valuable assistance rendered the Board by the local instruction board at each post. It was found by the Academic Board that in the cases of certain regiments progressive and correct courses of instruction had been prescribed and had been consistently followed for a number of years with much benefit to the officers of the command. It was found, on the other hand, that in other commands, and they exceeded in number the former class, the course of instruction was either not adapted to accomplish the best results, or was not attended by the officers or was not consistently and properly carried out. The Academic Board was enabled not only as a result of its own initiative, but by its familiarity with the working plans prescribed within the several organizations, to co-ordinate and stimulate and guide this most important work of providing professional education for the commissioned officers of the Division.

Another important function of the Academic Board is to insure not only the co-ordination of instruction, but the continuity of a policy of instruction. In past years the National Guard of this State has suffered from an application of too many conflicting policies in the matter of instruction. It frequently happened that an officer of the Army detailed as an Inspector-Instructor took charge of the instruction in his own arm of the service, and sometimes of other arms, and proceeded with his policy for a more or less brief period, only to be succeeded by another officer with a different policy. The effect was harmful in many ways. Sometimes the policy instituted by a particular officer represented his own views, sometimes, perhaps, the views of the War Department at that particular period. This lack of

co-ordination and continuity of a policy has been eliminated by the establishment of the School of the Line and Staff and by the work of the Academic Board of that School. The work is not now dependent upon the continuation with the State of any particular Inspector-Instructor, nor upon the plan of any individual, but the policy now in force is that of the school as established by the Academic Board after careful study and consideration. The personnel of this Board in itself is an important factor which made for the success of the school. All the Inspector-Instructors in all the arms of the service on duty with the State are members of this Board. The other members beside the commanding general are one brigade commander, two supply officers, two field officers of infantry and one of cavalry of the National Guard. With such a membership it has been found practicable to eliminate much time in the non-essentials of military training and to concentrate on those factors which are essential for efficiency in the field, and it is believed that the course prescribed and the work being done is all carried out with due regard to the limitations with respect to time which so materially affect the service of the National Guard officer.

16. SELECTION OF OFFICERS.

During the past year the appointive system of selecting officers was adopted in the 47th Infantry. The appointive system is now in force in the following organizations: 1st, 2d, 12th, 14th, 23d, 47th, 71st and 74th Infantry, 1st and 2d Field Artillery, Corps of Engineers, 8th and 9th Artillery Districts, 1st and 2d Field Hospital, 1st, 2d and 3d Ambulance Company. The old elective system of selecting officers is still in force in the following named organizations: 7th, 10th, 65th and 69th Infantry, 1st Cavalry, 1st Squadron, N. Y. Cavalry and 13th Artillery District. The 1st and 2d Signal Companies have also taken up the appointive system.

17. MATÉRIEL AND EQUIPMENT.

The tactical division is now complete with the exception of one field hospital and an ambulance company, the supply train and the ammunition train. The matériel and equipment for the divisional pack trains and field bakeries were received from the War Department, and as hereinabove set forth under another heading, these organizations are now being organized. Wagons, harness and equipment for regimental trains have been received during the past year so that at the present time regimental trains are practically complete. The subject of accountability and responsibility for military property was given much attention during the past year, and there has been a marked increase in the efficiency of officers during the year in respect thereto.

18. HOUSING.

The housing provided for the First Regiment, Field Artillery, less the two batteries at Syracuse and Binghamton, is so inadequate, and the four batteries with regimental and battalion headquarters stationed therein are so crowded that the conditions there were, in December, 1913, the subject of an official communication from the War Department, in which it was pointed out that owing to the insufficient space of quarters provided for these commands in the old armory of the Corps of Engineers at 68th street and Broadway, New York City, 43 limbers and 16 caissons were crowded into the basement, the only exit therefrom being through a narrow doorway and up a flight of stairs, and that within a few feet of this room is a magazine in which were stored more than 500 rounds of shell and shrapnel. It is recommended by the Chief Ordnance Officer at Governors Island, who personally inspected the conditions at this armory, that the State authorities be called upon to provide proper storage facilities for these batteries, calling attention to the fact that the value of the ordnance material alone in possession of these batteries in this particular building is about \$250,000.

An application was made to the Armory Board of the City of New York by the commanding officer of the First Field Artillery for the purchase of a plot of land on the Island of Manhattan for the construction of an armory thereon sufficient for the purposes of the units of this regiment stationed in the City of New York. This communication was later followed by one from these headquarters recommending the purchase of a plot of land sufficiently large to erect a building to accommodate not only the units of the Field Artillery referred to, but also the First Signal Company, an ambulance company, the division pack train, the Quartermaster Corps, and the School of the Line and Staff. If this recommendation is adopted it will ulti-

mately result in the saving of considerable money to the County of New York by reason of the fact that the concentration of these commands and units in the one building will permit the common use and benefit of the utilities which commonly go with the modern armory. This particularly refers to the steam heating plant, electric lighting plant, police of the building, storage and weighing facilities for forage, swimming pool, mess hall, dormitory, kitchen, etc. No action has yet been taken by the Armory Board of the City of New York in connection with this application, but it is believed, in view of the urgency of the matter, that a favorable consideration may be expected.

19. TRANSPORTATION.

In the spring of 1913, 12 horses were purchased under authority of the Governor by the Chief Quartermaster of the Division in accordance with the plan outlined in the last annual report. These animals had almost continuous service during the summer at the various camps and schools and also performed much draft work at Peekskill in connection with alterations and repairs to the buildings at that post. Upon the completion of the summer's work these animals were sent to the Cavalry School at Van Cortlandt Park for schooling and training to render them available as mounts in the Infantry School of Equitation. These horses have about completed the period of their instruction at the school and will shortly be available for use by the mounted officers of infantry and by some of the mounted scout detachments of regiments stationed in New York City. A four-wheel drive, one and one-half ton automobile truck was purchased in the spring of 1913 for the use of the Chief Quartermaster of the Division, and, in general, for the use of troops in the field, and a recommendation has been made to purchase additional motor vehicles of similar capacity in order that the State may gradually accumulate a nucleus of such trucks for military use, not only in the field, but during the drill season by organizations in their terrain exercises. The increasing cost and difficulty of obtaining suitable horses by hire makes necessary and desirable the policy of acquiring a nucleus of motor trucks. This is particularly true when it is considered that when not in use their cost of maintenance is practically nothing.

20. SCHOOL OF EQUITATION — INFANTRY.

The subject of horsemanship has always been a difficult one to properly provide for in the infantry. Many excellent infantry officers whose duties require them on occasions to be mounted have suffered chagrin and have been greatly handicapped in the performance of their functions by inability to ride. As a result of the recently adopted policy of the State of New York of maintaining a nucleus of military animals, it was possible during the post drill season to establish a School of Equitation for infantry officers of the New York City regiments and they have profited by the instruction so provided to the extent of the capacity of the School. The State owns but eleven animals, and this number was augmented by a number of cavalry horses loaned by Colonel Charles I. DeBevoise and Major William R. Wright of the Cavalry. In addition to their use in the School the State horses have been used by the hospital detachments, mounted scouts and mounted orderlies of infantry organizations. This small nucleus of animals should be added to so that similar opportunities may be afforded to the troops in Buffalo and Albany. The cost of horse hire saved the State by the ownership of these animals during the past summer alone exceeded the entire original cost of the animals and their maintenance to date. During the post drill season the horses have been used daily.

The officers in charge of the instruction at this School are Captain David H. Biddle, U. S. Cavalry, and Captain Edward Olmsted, New York Cavalry, and their work has been most satisfactorily performed.

I have the honor to submit the following report concerning the operations and condition of the Naval Militia, N. Y., for the year ending September 30, 1913:

1. In compliance with General Orders No. 19, c. s., A. G. O., the customary annual tour of duty was performed on board the U. S. S. Alabama as follows:

First Battalion, and that portion of the Third Battalion located in Rochester, from July 26th to August 3rd, inclusive.

Second Battalion, and that portion of the Third Battalion located in Buffalo and Dunkirk, from July 12th to July 20th, inclusive.

As the result of conferences with the Navy Department and the Commanding Officer of the U. S. S. Alabama, the plan of the cruises was designed to prepare the Naval Militia of this State to man one or more reserve battleships. The U. S. S. Alabama was ordered out of first reserve to proceed to New York and complete its complement with New York Naval Militiamen. Each officer and man was assigned a definite station with definite duties, with a view of making each one as efficient as possible in his particular station, and at the end of the cruise a battle rehearsal was held and the success of the cruise measured by the result of this rehearsal.

It will be seen by the reports of the Commanding Officers of the Battalions of the Naval Militia concerned, marked Appendices I, II, and III, that these cruises were generally regarded as a decided improvement upon plans and methods of former cruises.

The report of Commander C. F. Preston, commanding the U. S. S. Alabama, upon the efficiency of the First and Second Battalions was highly commendatory. For his report in full, see Appendix IV.

Owing to the Third Battalion being divided and not making the cruise as a whole, it was impossible to predict the time which it would take for this Battalion to make a reserve battleship ready to take her place in line of battle.

Each of these cruises was made to and from Bermuda, and in this connection, I am enclosing, see Appendix V, a copy of a letter from the Secretary of the Navy expressing his appreciation of the conduct of the members of the Naval Militia while on these cruises, together with a copy of an article from one of the Bermuda newspapers on the same topic.

2. In accordance with General Orders No. 7, c. s., Headquarters, Naval Militia, N. Y., the lake cruise specified by the Navy Department was taken part in by a portion of the Third Battalion from Buffalo and Dunkirk, on the U. S. S. Hawk. The Commodore, Commanding Naval Militia, N. Y., was on the U. S. S. Hawk on this cruise, and while it is believed that the duty was beneficial, the value of same is not to be compared with a battleship cruise. For report of this cruise, see Appendix VI.

3. At the request of the Perry Victory Celebration Committee, the U. S. S. Hawk, with volunteer officers and crew from the Third Battalion, performed duty for thirty-six days for that commission. This duty, although of a trying nature, was very creditably performed.

4. In accordance with Special Orders No. 157, c. s., A. G. O., the newly mustered-in Fourth Division, Third Battalion, Naval Militia, N. Y. at Watertown, N. Y., was drilled and instructed for nine days on board the U. S. S. Sandoval. For report of same, see Appendix VII.

5. In addition to the above ordered tours of duty, week-end practice cruises were held on the U. S. S. Wasp, U. S. S. Gloucester, U. S. S. Sandoval and U. S. S. Hawk. The total distances covered by these vessels during the season being as follows:

U. S. S. Wasp.....	460 miles
U. S. S. Gloucester.....	4,702 miles
U. S. S. Sandoval.....	1,359 miles
U. S. S. Hawk.....	3,616 miles
Total.....	<u>10,137 miles</u>

Numerous week-end cruises were made on the launches and small boats attached to the Battalions, the Second Battalion making nearly 2,500 miles on their small vessels.

6. The usual small arms practice returns are attached, marked Appendix VII. The Figure of Merit Prizes for the Naval Militia were won by the Second Division, First Battalion; Second Division, Third Battalion; and Third Division, Third Battalion.

The Inter-Battalion Secondary Battery Match was shot on October 4th on Long Island Sound. This match was won by the First Battalion.

The Inter-Divisional Secondary Battery Match of the First Battalion was shot from the U. S. S. Wasp, the winner being the Sixth Division.

The Inter-Divisional Secondary Battery Match of the Second Battalion was shot from the U. S. S. Gloucester, the winner being the Fifth Division.

The Brigade Match of 1913 was shot at Peekskill on September 22, 1913, the winner being the Second Battalion.

For detail information concerning the Inter-Battalion, Inter-Divisional Secondary Battery, the Brigade Matches, see Appendix VIII.

7. An Engineer Division was mustered-in in the Second Battalion on June 10, 1913, and the Fourth Division, Third Battalion was mustered-in at Watertown, N. Y. on June 18, 1913.

8. The aggregate strength of this command on September 30, 1912, was 1,140, and on September 30, 1913 it was 1,303, an increase of 163.

9. The regular annual inspections of the organizations of the Naval Militia were held as follows: First Battalion, October 4 and 27, 1913.

Second Battalion, October 4 and November 18, 1913.

Third Battalion, October 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17, 1913.

Reports of the above inspections are enclosed herewith, marked Appendices IX, X and XI.

10. The annual reports of the Commanding Officers of the First, Second and Third Battalions are attached hereto, marked Appendices XII, XIII and XIV.

11. As a result of this year's annual tour of duty on the U. S. S. Alabama and the recommendation of the Commanding Officers taking part in same, the Navy Department has been asked to designate two reserve battleships for the First and Second Battalions; to send these ships here early in the spring, at least three months before the annual cruise, so that the officers and men may drill aboard them during that period in order to derive the greatest possible benefit from the short tour of duty afloat later in the season. The ultimate idea being that the Navy Department may be assured of an efficient crew for each of their reserve battleships on the shortest possible notice in time of need.

12. The problem of properly training the Third Battalion is a more difficult one than that of the First and Second Battalions on account of the wide separation of its various units, the difficulty and expense of getting them together, and their distances from tide water and battleships. The Navy Department has been asked to detail an instructor for the separate units of this Battalion to prepare them to perform the same functions as the First and Second Battalions. It would be a great help if, in addition to the Naval Instructor, an officer from Headquarters, Naval Militia, N. Y., could be detailed with pay, subsistence, etc., to help in the instruction of these units. It may be advisable upon the completion of the Barge Canal, to evolve a scheme for training the units of the Third Battalion for the crews of reserve torpedo boats and destroyers.

13. It is believed that the opportunity given by the Navy Department to officers of the Naval Militia to go to sea on the ships of the Atlantic Fleet and be assigned to regular duty is the most important step that has been taken for training the Naval Militia officers. Officers of the Naval Militia should be encouraged to undertake this duty with State pay and subsistence until each officer has had at least one tour of duty afloat under service conditions under his present commission. Duty performed in this way where an officer is entirely relieved of the responsibility of caring for the men in his Naval Militia command, is of much greater benefit than the annual cruise duty. Lieutenant-Commander E. C. deKay, Signal Officer on the staff of the Commodore, Lieutenant j. g., R. R. Riggs, Ensigns F. L. Rupp and C. A. Moore of the First Battalion, have performed duty of this character on the battleships of the Atlantic Fleet during the past year. This duty was of great benefit to them and will be ultimately to the men under their instruction.

14. At the beginning of the present year, a new scheme of drill and instruction was started in the Second Battalion by Commander Kingsley L. Martin. The idea being to have a progressive scheme of drill and instruction covering a three years enlistment, and thus eliminate some of the monotony of instruction as usually carried out. This plan has worked successfully and, during the coming drill season will be adopted by the other battalions as modified to meet their local conditions.

UNITED STATES SHIP ALABAMA, NORTH RIVER,

NEW YORK, July 20, 1913.

To: Secretary of the Navy (Aid for Personnel).
Office of Naval Militia.

SUBJECT: Cruise of the U. S. S. Alabama with the Second Battalion of the New York Naval Militia (23 officers and 316 men), and the First, Third and Fifth Divisions of the Third Battalion of the New York Naval Militia (8 officers and 111 men).

Enclosures:

- (a) The Ship's Organization and Administration Book;
- (b) Record of orders and instructions issued during the cruise;
- (c) Report of the Senior Engineer Officer.

1. In the afternoon of July 12th, these naval militia came alongside in a navy yard tug, from the Second Battalion Armory and embarked, except six officers and fifty-four men of the Second Battalion who were transferred the next morning at 9.30 A. M. to the Alabama from the Gloucester on which vessel they had just completed target practice at Gardiner's Bay.

2. The embarkation was the most orderly and seamanlike one that I have ever seen in my experience in the navy. The men came on board, stowed their bags and hammocks and went to their respective parts of the ship quickly and quietly. There was no talking and absolutely no noise of any kind. The militia officers had instructed their men previous to embarking and each man had been given his station billet.

3. Every officer and man had also been furnished with a copy of the Ship's Organization and Administration Book, which the Naval Militia had printed at the expense of the State of New York. A copy of this book is enclosed, marked "A"; the fact that each individual had been carefully instructed in advance contributed greatly to the success of this cruise.

4. The Alabama got underway at 9.40 A. M., and proceeded to Bermuda, arriving at that port at 5.18 P. M., the 15th instant.

5. During the stay at Bermuda, all drills and exercises were suspended and "all hands" were given shore privileges.

6. At 5.31 A. M., on the 17th instant, the Alabama got underway and proceeded to New York, anchoring off 97th street, North River, at 5.30 P. M., the 19th instant.

7. The Third Battalion (First, Third and Fifth Divisions) at their own request, disembarked on the evening of the 19th instant; the reason for the request to disembark a day ahead of scheduled time was because this battalion wished to take a train leaving New York at 2 A. M., the 20th instant.

8. The Second Battalion disembarked at 10.10 A. M., the 20th instant. The disembarkation was accomplished in a most orderly and seamanlike manner.

9. Forwarded herewith, marked "B," is a record of the orders and instruction issued during the cruise which indicate the work accomplished. There was quite a little sea going across the gulf stream both enroute to Bermuda and also while returning to New York, which caused some seasickness among the Naval Militia; it was necessary to batten down forward and aft at times.

10. The Naval Militiamen were incorporated in the ship's Watch, Quarter and Station Bill in such a manner as to break down the identity of regular and militiamen. In my opinion the officers and men, as a whole, showed commendable interest in the work, but the accomplishment of the great amount of work done during this short cruise of this organization is largely due to the zeal, personality and ability of the Commanding Officer of the Naval Militia on this cruise, Commander K. L. Martin, who deserves the greatest amount of credit for what he has done in his patriotic effort to prepare his men to help defend our country in case an emergency should arise; this matter is really taken seriously and earnestly.

11. The enlisted personnel are both physically and mentally well qualified to perform the duties required of them in time of war. The order of intelligence is high and they adapted themselves surprisingly quickly to ship life.

12. It cannot be expected that militia officers should perform successfully all the duties on board a battleship corresponding to their respective rank in the Naval Militia. However, it is believed that if each officer were assigned some specific province in accordance with his natural inclination and previous experience, he could specialize and thus fit himself for the duties he would be called upon to perform when called out for actual service.

13. Attention is specially requested to the record of time taken during the battle rehearsal on the last day of the cruise, which indicates the smoothness and efficiency with which this exercise was performed.

14. The report of the Senior Engineer Officer of this vessel marked "C," on the two battalions assigned to duty in the engineer's department, is herewith attached.

15. Judging from the results of this cruise, it is my opinion that the discipline, previous training and esprit de corps of this particular militia organization is such that a two weeks period of uninterrupted preparation would suffice to make the ship ready to take her place in line of battle.

SUBJECT: Cruise of the U. S. S. Alabama with the First Battalion of New York Naval Militia (28 officers and 385 men), and the Second, Fourth and Sixth Divisions of the Third Battalion of the New York Naval Militia (8 officers and 80 men).

Enclosures:

- (a) Record of orders and instructions issued during the cruise;
- (b) Report of the Senior Engineer Officer.

1. In the forenoon of July 26th, these Naval Militia were transported from the Granite State, in Naval Militia boats, to the Alabama at anchor in the North River off 96th street.
2. The militia officers of the First Battalion had instructed their men previous to embarking, and each man had been given his station billet. The embarkation would have been facilitated if the Naval Militia of the Third Battalion had followed this procedure.
3. Every officer and man had been supplied with a copy of the Ship's Organization and Administration Book a week before the embarkation, which greatly expedited the shaking down work.
4. The Alabama got under way at 10.47 A. M., and proceeded to Bermuda arriving at that port at 4.50 P. M., on the 28th ultimo.
5. During the stay at Bermuda, all drills and exercises were suspended, and "all hands" were given shore privileges.
6. At 5.10 A. M., on the 31st ultimo, the Alabama got under way and proceeded to New York, anchoring off 97th street, North River, at 2.30 P. M., on the 2nd instant.
7. The militiamen disbanded at 10 A. M., on the 3rd instant.
8. Forwarded herewith, marked "A" is a record of the orders and instruction issued during the cruise, which indicate the work accomplished. The sea was smooth and except for a few rain squalls, the weather was pleasant throughout the entire trip.
9. The naval militiamen were incorporated in the ship's Watch, Quarter and Station Bill in such manner as to break down the identity of the "regulars" and militiamen.
10. In my opinion, the officers and men, as a whole, showed commendable interest in the work and commendable zeal in its accomplishment.
11. The enlisted personnel are both physically and mentally well qualified to perform the duties required of them in time of war. The order of intelligence is high and they adapted themselves very quickly to ship life.
12. It cannot be expected that militia officers should perform successfully all the duties on board a battleship corresponding to their respective rank in the Naval Militia. However, it is believed that if each officer were assigned some specific province in accordance with his natural inclination and previous experience, he could specialize and thus fit himself for the duties he would be called upon to perform when called out for actual service.
13. The report of the Senior Engineer Officer of this vessel, marked "B," on the two battalions assigned to duty in the engineer's department, is herewith attached.
14. Judging from the result of this cruise, it is my opinion, that the discipline, previous training and esprit de corps of this particular militia organization is such that a three weeks' period of uninterrupted preparation would suffice to make the ship ready to take her place in line of battle. (This achievement would, of course, be impossible, unless the prescribed reserve crew of regular officers and men were also on board).

NOTE.—The work done by the divisions of the Third Battalion indicates a discipline and previous training considerably behind that of the First Battalion.

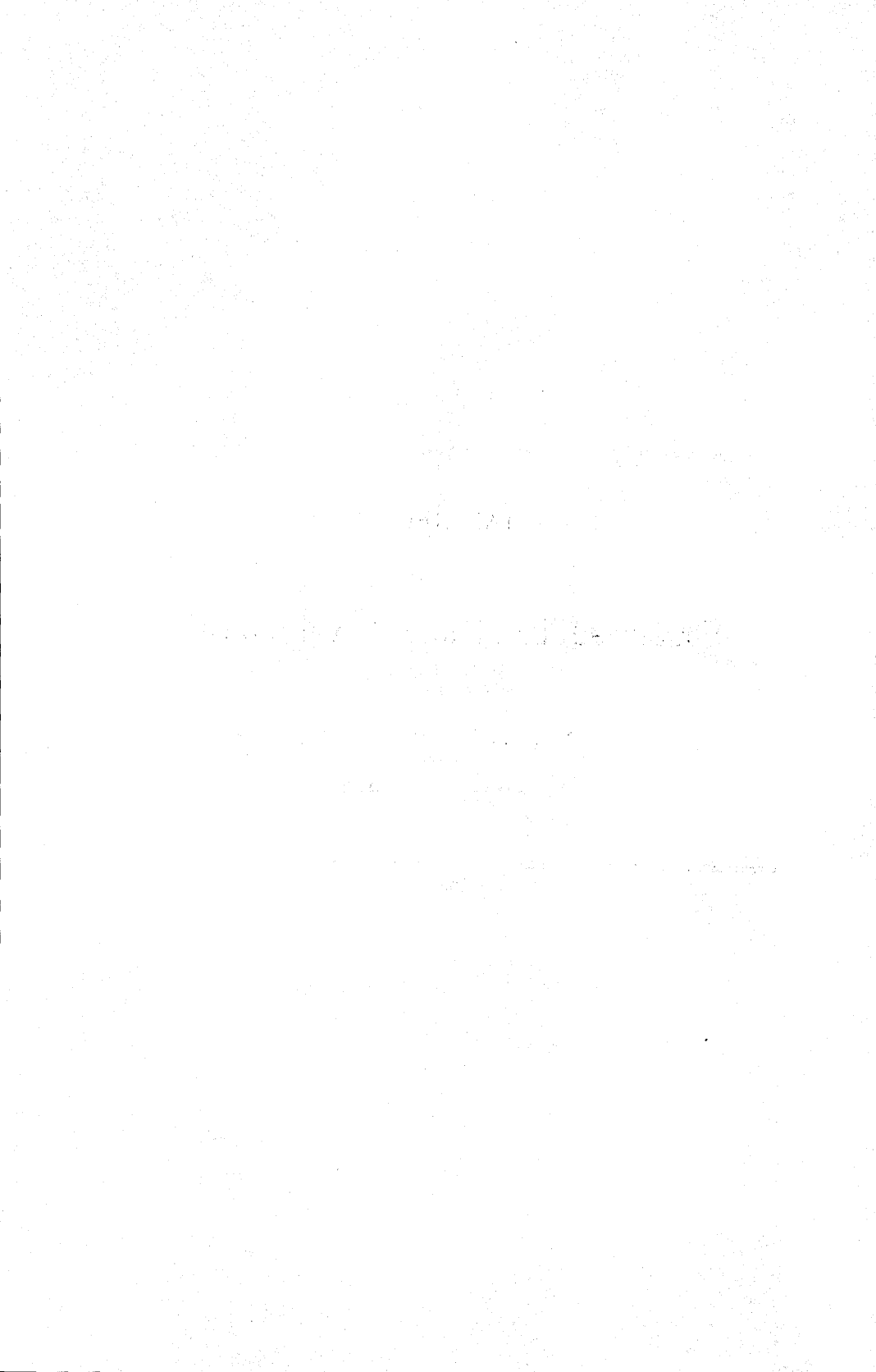

This regiment was organized in April, 1861: it entered the United States service May 28, 1862, for three months, and was mustered out September 5, 1862, having been stationed at Washington, D. C., and later forming part of the garrison at Harper's Ferry, Va.; June 18, 1863, it was again mustered in the service of the United States for thirty days, and was mustered out July 24, 1863. In 1867 the regiment took up rifle practice as part of its drill, and in 1871 it established for itself a rifle range and system of practice which was in 1873 adopted by the National Rifle Association. Co. G was disbanded March 22, 1878, and new Co. G organized April 30, 1879. Co. F was disbanded October 10, 1890, and new Co. F organized January 8, 1891. Co. I was disbanded October 10, 1890, and new Co. I organized October 6, 1892. May 7, 1898, it was authorized to be temporarily consolidated into eight companies, and four companies of the 13th Regiment were attached to it, preparatory to entry into the United States service, into which it was mustered on May 24, 1898, as the 22d Regiment, Infantry, N. Y. Vols., and it was mustered out November 23, 1898. February 20, 1902, the regiment was constituted a regiment of engineers and designated 22d Regiment, Engineers.

By the law of May 7, 1908, the 22d Regiment became a part of the Corps of Engineers, and on Nov. 10, 1908, Companies L and M were authorized, completing the three battalion organization.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On the National Color.—Harper's Ferry, 1862; Gettysburg Campaign, 1863; Sporting Hill, Pa., June 30, 1863; Carlisle, Pa., July 1, 1863; Spanish-American War, 1898.

On the State Color.—Draft riots, 1863; Orange riots, 1871; Buffalo, 1892; Brooklyn, 1895.

On March 11, 1912, the 2d Regiment of Cavalry was organized by General Orders No. 11, A. G. O., by detaching Troops C, H, I, K and M from the 1st Cavalry, which were thereupon designated Troops A, B, C, D and E, respectively. Troop F, located at West Brighton, was added April 23, 1912, and Troop G, located at Utica, on June 21, 1912.

On November 5, 1913, General Orders No. 27, A. G. O., transferred Troops B, D, H and I of 1st Cavalry to the 2d Cavalry as Troops B, D, H and I. Troops B and D, 2d Cavalry, were changed to Troops K and L by G. O. 28, A. G. O., December 10, 1913. Troop M was authorized to be organized by G. O. 27, A. G. O., November 5, 1913, and the designation of 2d Cavalry was changed to 1st Cavalry by the same order. Troop P of this regiment performed duty at strike riots, Syracuse, May, 1913.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On the National Color.— Spanish-American War, 1898; Porto Rico, 1898; Coamo, August 9, 1898; Asomanta, August 9 to 12, 1898.

On the State Color.— Croton Dam, April, 1900.

The 1st Squadron was formerly known as Squadron A. It was first organized as Troop A on April 3, 1889, and performed duty at Buffalo during the switchmen's strike in August, 1892, and at Brooklyn during the motormen's strike in January, 1895. It was divided into two troops, to be known as Troops 1 and 2, and these organized into one squadron, designated Squadron A, February 9, 1895. November 27, 1896, Squadron A was divided into three troops, to be known as Troops 1, 2 and 3. Troop 4 was added May 2, 1907. The squadron was on duty at the strike at Croton Dam, April, 1900. One troop (Troop A), made up of members of the three troops of the squadron, was in United States service from May 20, 1898, to November 28, 1898.

This squadron was assigned to 1st Cavalry December 28, 1911 (G. O. 60) and the numerical designation of troops was changed January 18, 1912 (G. O. 2) to letter designation, viz.: Troops A, E, F and G.

Troops A, E, F and G, 1st Cavalry, were detached and organized as a separate squadron by General Orders No. 27, A. G. O., November 5, 1913. On December 10, 1913, the designation of Troops E, F and G, 1st Squadron, Cavalry, was changed to Troops B, C and D, respectively, by General Orders No. 28, A. G. O.

The squadron has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On the National Color.— Spanish-American War, 1898; Porto Rico, 1898; Coamo, 1898; Asomanta, 1898.

On the State Color.— Buffalo, August, 1892; Brooklyn, January, 1895; Croton Dam, April, 1900; Cocymans, May, 1906.

On August 30, 1911, the 2d Battalion, Field Artillery, composed of Batteries D, E and F, was organized by General Orders No. 31, A. G. O., from the 1st Battery, previously detached from the 1st Battalion, Field Artillery.

The late 1st Battery was organized April 3, 1867, as Battery K, 1st Regiment of Artillery. The regiment was disbanded December 10, 1869, but the battery retained as Separate Battery K, which designation was changed December 17, 1881, to 1st Battery. The battery was on duty during the railroad riots in July, 1877, and at Brooklyn during the motormen's strike in January, 1895. The armament of the battery consists of four 3-inch field guns, model 1902.

The First Regiment, Field Artillery, was organized from the 2d Battalion, composed of Batteries D, E and F and Separate Battery A, May 28, 1912, by G. O. 33, A. G. O. October 26, 1912, Battery A was detached and carried as a separate battery by G. O. 64, A. G. O. On the same date the headquarters 1st Battalion and Batteries A, B and C of the late 2d Field Artillery were transferred to the 1st Field Artillery to be known as the 1st Battalion and Batteries A, B and C of that regiment. Battery C was detached and designated a separate battery, November 26, 1912, by G. O. 70, A. G. O. The new Battery A was detached and designated Separate Battery B by G. O. 74, December 16, 1912. General Orders No. 74, authorized the organization of two additional batteries from Battery B, 1st Field Artillery, to replace Batteries A and C, detached.

On May 19, 1913, Battery E, 2d Field Artillery, was detached and transferred to 1st Field Artillery as Battery A, 1st Field Artillery, by G. O. 16, A. G. O.

A new battery, known and designated as Battery B, was organized May 19, 1913.

BATTERY A, FIRST FIELD ARTILLERY.

(Formerly Battery E, 2d Field Artillery.)

Organized August 31, 1911, by General Orders No. 33, A. G. O. On May 28, 1912, it was assigned as Battery A, 1st Field Artillery, by G. O. 33, A. G. O., October 26, 1912. It was detached from the 1st Field Artillery and designated Separate Battery A, Field Artillery, by G. O. 64, A. G. O. On December 16, 1912, the battery was assigned to the 2d Battalion, Field Artillery, as Battery A, 2d Battalion, Field Artillery, by G. O. 74, A. G. O.

On May 19, 1913, the battery was changed to Battery A and transferred to 1st Field Artillery, by G. O. 16, A. G. O. The battery performed duty at strike riots, Syracuse, May, 1913.

BATTERY C, FIRST FIELD ARTILLERY.

Organized February 23, 1908, by General Orders No. 7, A. G. O., and composed of the 1st, 2d and 3d Batteries.

On August 30, 1911, the battalion was reorganized by General Orders No. 31, A. G. O., the 1st Battery being detached, and the 6th Battery assigned. The 2d, 3d and 6th Batteries composing the battalion, were thereupon designated as Batteries A, B and C, respectively.

Organized as a regiment from the 1st Battalion, Field Artillery, composed of Batteries A, B and C, and designated Batteries A, B and C, 2d Field Artillery, May 28, 1912, by G. O. 33, A. G. O. On October 26, 1912, regimental headquarters was disbanded and the 1st Battalion and Batteries A, B and C were transferred to the 1st Field Artillery by G. O. 64, A. G. O.

General Orders No. 5, A. G. O., January 10, 1913, organized the 2d Regiment as follows: 1st Battalion of Batteries A, B and C of Brooklyn; 2d Battalion consists of Battery D of Bronx; Battery E of Syracuse, and Battery F, unorganized. General Orders No. 16, A. G. O., May 19, 1913, transferred to 1st Field Artillery Battery E, and authorized the organization of Batteries E and F.

BATTERY D, SECOND FIELD ARTILLERY.

(Formerly Second Battery.)

Armory, Franklin Avenue and 166th Street, Bronx, New York City.

Organized February 4, 1833, as Washington Gray Troop, Horse Artillery, part of 3d Regiment, New York State Artillery. July 27, 1847, the designation of the regiment was changed to 8th Regiment, and of the troop to Co. I; January 22, 1867, the troop was formed into a battalion of cavalry, which in 1870 was consolidated into one troop. In 1879 the troop was reorganized as Battery E, which designation was changed to 2d Battery, December 17, 1881. Designation changed to Battery A, 1st Battalion, Field Artillery, August 30, 1911. Designated Battery A, 2d Regiment, Field Artillery, May 28, 1912, by G. O. 33, A. G. O.; transferred as Battery A to the 1st Regiment, Field Artillery, by G. O. 64, A. G. O., October 26, 1912; detached from that regiment and designated Separate Battery B, Field Artillery, by G. O. 74, A. G. O., December 16, 1912. Attached to the 2d Battalion as Battery B, December 16, 1912.

The organization rendered service to the State and City of New York at the abolition riot, July 14, 1834; stevedore riot, February 24, 1836; Croton water riots, April 22 and 23, 1840; great fire, July 19, 1845; Astor Place riot, May 10, 1849; quarantine riots, September, 1858; draft riots, July, 1863; Orange riots, July 12, 1871; railroad riots, July, 1877; motorman's strike, Brooklyn, January, 1895. It was in the United States service for three months, from April 18 to July 20, 1861, and for thirty days, from June 29 to July 23, 1863; and was in action near Annapolis, Md., and Fairfax Court House in 1861; at Carlisle, Shippensburg, Scotland, Chambersburg, Oyster Point and Kingston in 1863. Armament, four 3-inch field guns, model 1902.

On the 4th of April, 1786,* the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, was formed in New York city into a brigade of artillery, and was to consist of the 1st and 2d Regiments and a battalion. In April, 1807, the 3d Regiment of New York Artillery was organized by including this battalion and other troops. July 27, 1847, the designation of the regiment was changed to the 8th Regiment. In December, 1893, it was reduced to a battalion of four companies. It was reorganized, as a regiment, February 14, 1896. New companies were organized for the battalion as follows: On July 8, 1895, Co. A; on October 30, 1895, Co. E; on January 27, 1896, Co. H, and on February 14, 1896, Co. G, when it was reorganized as a regiment. April 28, 1898, it was authorized to be organized as a twelve-company regiment to enter the service of the United States. It was in the service of the United States from September 15 to December 15, 1812; from April 23 to August 2, 1861; from May 29 to September 9, 1862; and from June 17 to July 23, 1863. It was mustered into the United States service as the 8th Regiment Infantry, New York Volunteers, May 14, 17 and 19, 1898, and mustered out of such service November 3, 1898. Companies L and M were disbanded December 22, 1898. December 10, 1906, Companies A, C and E were disbanded and the regiment reduced to a battalion of seven companies and designated the 8th Battalion. January 18, 1908, Co. A was reorganized and on January 21, 1908, the battalion was again constituted a regiment under its original designation. January 23, 1908, a coast artillery corps was organized, the 8th Regiment being constituted coast artillery and the companies respectively designated as the 25th, 26th, 27th, 28th, 29th, 30th, 31st and 32d Companies, Coast Artillery Corps, constituting the 8th Artillery District. November 10, 1908, an additional company was directed to be organized and attached to the 8th Artillery District, as the 33d Company, Coast Artillery Corps. November 11, 1911, authority was given to organize an enlisted band, to be designated the 8th Band, Coast Artillery Corps.

Authority has been granted to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On the National Color.—Fort Gansevoort, 1812; Fort Greene, 1812; Washington, April, 1861; Bull Run, July 21, 1861; Yorktown, 1862; Gettysburg campaign, 1863; Spanish-American War, 1898.

On the State Color.—Fleur riots, 1826; stonecutters' riot, 1835; great fire, New York city, 1845; Astor Place riot, 1849; police riot, 1857; Dead Rabbit riot, 1857; Sepoy riot, 1858; Camp Corcoran Legion, 1862; draft riots, 1863; Orange riots, 1871; Syracuse, 1877; Brooklyn, 1895.

By virtue of an order from Governor John Jay to Brigadier-General James Miles Hughes, New York, N. Y., dated Albany, June 24, 1799, the preliminary organization of the 6th Regiment, New York State Infantry, of which this regiment is the successor, took place, by transfer of four companies from the 1st Regiment, three companies from 2d Regiment, five companies from 3d Regiment, two companies from 4th Regiment, all organized March 4, 1786; three companies from the 5th Regiment, organized May 11, 1789, and the Independent Rifle Co., organized August 28, 1798.

The 6th Regiment, New York State Infantry, was permanently organized with 16 companies, under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel Commandant Jacob Morton, on March 8, 1800. This regiment was changed by General Orders, Adjutant General's Office, Albany, to the 2d New York State Artillery, March 27, 1805, and to the 9th Regiment, New York State Artillery, June 13, 1812; it was reduced to a battalion, December 13, 1813, and became a regiment again, by orders of Council of Appointment, June 6, 1816. By orders from Adjutant General's Office, the state was divided in division, brigade, regiment and company districts, May 13, 1847. Three of the regiment's companies were transferred to the 8th Regiment, New York State Militia, May 27, 1850; some of the officers and men elsewhere, but Colonel B. Clinton Ferris retained command of the 9th Regiment, as reorganized May 29, 1850. It was again partly disbanded May 31, 1858, but the district of the 9th Regiment, New York State Militia, was kept intact, under Colonel Lucius Pitkin, and once more the regiment made — anew, June 25, 1859.*

Under this title it entered the service of the United States, May 27, 1861, and was mustered in at Washington, D. C., June 8, 1861. A further change was made in numerical designation; it became known as the 83d New York Volunteers, December 7, 1861, by which title it was mustered out of the United States service, June 23, 1864.

Under orders from the authorities of the State, the 9th District was retained for the regiment during its three years of war service, and formally retook position in the National Guard of the State as the 9th Regiment, National Guard, State of New York, June 13, 1864, which was continued until 1898, when the title was changed to the 9th Regiment Infantry, New York Volunteers, May 2, 1898. It was redesignated the 9th Regiment, National Guard, New York, January 12, 1899.

April 28, 1898, it was authorized to be organized into a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to entry into the United States service, into which it was mustered as the Ninth Regiment Infantry, New York Volunteers, May 17, 19 and 20, 1898, and mustered out November 15, 1898. Companies L and M were disbanded December 22, 1898.

To conform to the Military Law (1908), General Orders No. 7, Adjutant General's Office, dated Albany, January 23, 1908, reorganized the 9th Regiment Infantry, as Coast Artillery and made it a part of the Coast Artillery Corps, National Guard, New York, as the 9th Artillery District, and the designation of companies from letters A to K, to be the 13th to 22d Companies, Coast Artillery Corps, respectively.

The regiment was authorized to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

This regiment was organized July 5, 1847; there were changes in the organization a few years later, again in April, 1859, and in 1860. It was disbanded May 7, 1898, except one battalion of four companies which had volunteered to enter the United States service, and authority was given to reorganize it May 15, 1898, November 28, 1898, such portion of the regiment as had been organized was disbanded, and authority was given to re-establish the regiment, the battalion which was in the United States service forming the nucleus of the new organization. Companies L and M were organized March 11, 1899; February 8, 1900, it was constituted a regiment of heavy artillery and designated 13th Regiment of Heavy Artillery of the National Guard, New York. This designation was changed to Coast Artillery, September 1, 1906. The regiment was in the service of the United States for three months from April 23, 1861, and was mustered out August 6, 1861; again from May 28 to September 12, 1862, and for the third time from June 20 to July 20, 1863, for thirty days; it was in the State service during the draft riots in July and August, 1863; the Orange riots, July 12, 1871; the railroad riots, July, 1877; the switchmen's strike at Buffalo, August, 1892; the quarantine disturbances at Fire Island, September, 1892, and the motormen's strike at Brooklyn, January, 1895. The battalion which volunteered to enter the United States service as part of the 22d Regiment, New York Volunteer Infantry, in the war with Spain, was mustered into such service May 24, 1898, and was mustered out November 23, 1898. January 23, 1908, the Coast Artillery Corps was organized; the companies of the 13th Regiment, Coast Artillery, becoming Companies 1 to 12 inclusive, Coast Artillery Corps, and constituting the 13th Artillery District.

April 27, 1898, the Governor directed the commanding officer of the Third Brigade to organize two regiments of such portions of his command as desired to volunteer for service in the United States Volunteer Army. The Second Regiment was composed of the 6th, 7th, 9th, 12th, 18th, 21st, 22d, 31st, 32d, 36th, 37th and 46th Separate Companies, the companies being designated as A, B, I, C, K, D, L, G, M, E, F and H, respectively. It entered the service of the United States, May 16 and 17, 1898, and was mustered out of such service: Companies A, B, C and D on October 25, Co. M on October 26, Co. L on October 27, Co. I on October 28, Co. K on October 29, Cos. E and F on October 31, Cos. G and H on November 1, and the field and staff on October 31, 1898. On its re-entry into the State service it was, on November 19, 1898, continued as a twelve-company regiment, composed as in the volunteer service as stated above. The 31st Separate Company was detached from this regiment on November 9, 1900, and assigned to the 4th Battalion. The 19th Separate Company was organized November 9, 1900, at Gloversville, N. Y., and assigned to this regiment as Co. G. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted scouts by Special Orders, No. 73, March 25, 1912.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On the National Color.— Spanish-American War, 1898.

On the State Color.—Buffalo, 1892; Albany, 1901; Hudson Valley, 1902; Corinth—South Glens Falls—Fort Edward, 1910.

COMPANY A, SECOND INFANTRY.

The Troy Citizens' Corps was organized September 23, 1835, and chartered by act of Legislature May 20, 1836; at the beginning of the War of the Rebellion the members of the company practically all joined the United States forces, and the company was compelled to suspend all action as an organization. February 3, 1877, the company was reorganized, and February 20, 1877, was mustered into the State service as the 6th Separate Company, 10th Brigade. Its designation was changed to 20th Separate Company, December 8, 1877, and to 6th Separate Company, February 4, 1878. Under the orders of the Governor of the State the company aided the civil authorities in December, 1839, in quelling resistance by the anti-renters; again in 1844, under the order of the mayor of Troy; in 1850 it assisted in suppressing a riot in the northern part of the city of Troy, and in July, 1877, during the railroad riots, it performed duty in West Albany. It was on duty at Buffalo during the switchmen's strike in August, 1892; at Albany during the street railway strike, May 16-18, 1901; during Hudson Valley strike, 1902, at Corinth in April, 1910, and at Troy, March, 1913, Hudson River flood. In the United States service as Co. A, 2d Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, from May 17, 1898, to October 25, 1898.

Companies A, B, C and D were organized during the excitement created by the firing of British at American vessels off Sandy Hook in April, 1806, as the first, second, third and fourth companies, and June 25th they were officially recognized by the State as part of the uniformed militia of the State, and attached to the battalion of artillery commanded by Major Andrew Sitcher. April 5, 1807, the battalion, in the organization of the 3d Regt. of New York Artillery, became its 2d Battalion. When war with England became imminent in 1807, these four companies, with other volunteers, were temporarily organized as a regiment, commanded by Colonel Peter Curtenius, and remained thus detached until April 20, 1809. In 1812 the 3d became the 11th Regiment of Artillery, the four companies remaining the 2d Battalion. August 25, 1824, the battalion was named "Battalion of National Guards" (its distinctive name until, in 1862, the Legislature appropriated it for the uniformed militia), and in December, 1824, the fifth company was organized and Captain Stevens' company of the 11th New York Artillery transferred to it as the sixth company. In January, 1825, the battalion was transferred to the 2d New York Artillery. October 1, 1825, the battalion was detached and organized as a separate and independent battalion, and during the month the seventh company was organized. May 4, 1826, the organization of the eighth company was completed, and May 6th the battalion was admitted to the regiment, the 27th Artillery. April 17, 1838, a troop of cavalry was admitted to the regiment, which, in 1861, became the ninth company. In 1843 the State furnished the regiment with arms, it having heretofore provided them itself. July 27th the designation of the regiment was changed to 7th Regiment. In April, 1849, an engineer corps was organized which, in 1861, became the tenth company. May 11, 1909, the regiment received authority to organize a new company to be known as Company L. December 2, 1910, a new company, to be designated Company M, was authorized to be mustered in. The regiment was frequently ordered to hold itself ready for service, and did active service for the United States, the State and New York city, as follows: In United States service from September 15 to December 15, 1812; from September 2 to December 2, 1814; from April 19 to June 3, 1861; from May 26 to December 5, 1862; from June 17 to July 21, 1863. In support of State or municipal authority: Execution of James Reynolds, November 19, 1825; at the election riots, April 10, 1834; abolition riot, July 11 to 12, 1834; great conflagration in New York city, December 17, 1835; stevedore riot, February 24, 1836; flour riots, February 6 and March 6, 1837; anti-rent war, December 9 to 10, 1839; Croton water riots, April 22 to 23, 1840; fire in New York city, July 19, to 21, 1845; Astor Place riot, May 10, 12 and 14, 1849; police riot, June 16, 1857; Dead Rabbit riot, July 5, 1857; quarantine war, January 3, 1859; preserving order at camp of Spinola Brigade, September 12 to 19, 1862; draft riots, July, 1863; Orange riots, July, 1871; labor riots, July, 1877; motormen's strike, Brooklyn, January, 1895; and at strike, Croton Dam, April, 1900. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted scouts by Special Orders No. 66, A. G. O., March 15, 1912, and a machine gun platoon by Special Orders No. 168, A. G. O., July 3, 1912.

The 10th Regiment was organized on December 29, 1860, by General Orders No. 50, A. G. O. of that year, Captain Ira W. Ainsworth's company of the 25th Regiment being detached from that regiment and assigned to the 10th as the nucleus of the new regiment; Captain Ainsworth subsequently becoming the first colonel of the 10th Regiment with rank from May 27, 1862.

On May 17, 1881, the 10th Regiment, with the exception of Companies A, B, D and K, was disbanded and these companies retained in the service as the 10th Separate Battalion. On October 1, 1884, the designation of Company K was changed to C.

April 28, 1898, the 1st Regiment was organized preparatory to entry in United States service and Companies A, B, C and D of the 10th Battalion became Companies A, B, C and D of the 1st Regiment. On the disbandment of this regiment on March 15, 1899, these companies resumed their former designations in the 10th Battalion.

The battalion organization of the 10th Battalion was disbanded on May 1, 1905, and Companies A, B, C and D constituted separate companies, designated respectively, as the 26th, 35th, 38th and 45th Separate Companies. On the same date the 10th Regiment, composed of separate companies, was reorganized and its headquarters established at Albany, and the 26th, 35th, 38th and 45th Separate Companies attached to it as Companies A, B, C and D, respectively. In addition the 16th, 23d, 4th, 11th, 17th, 15th and 14th Separate Companies were assigned to the regiment and designated respectively as E, F, G, H, I, K and M. May 28, 1907, the 49th Separate Company was mustered in at White Plains, and assigned to the 10th Regiment as Company L. On December 1, 1910, Company A was mustered out, and a new company mustered in, on the same date, and designated as Company A, 10th Infantry (26th Separate Company).

The 10th Regiment was mustered into the service of the United States as the 177th New York Volunteers, November 21, 1862, and was mustered out September 10, 1863. Companies A, B, C, D, K and M were mustered into the United States service as Companies A, B, C, D, K and M, 1st New York Infantry, May 20, 1898, and were mustered out February 20, 1899. The 10th Regiment was on duty in aid of the civil authorities in the Helderbergs in 1865, during the anti-rent war; during the railroad strike at West Albany in 1877; the 10th Battalion at Buffalo during the switchmen's strike in 1892; at Albany during street railway strike in 1901; and a portion of the 10th Regiment at Coeymans during a strike in May, 1906. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted scouts by Special Orders No. 66, A. G. O., March 15, 1912.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

Organized July 4, 1854, as an independent company, the "Washington Continentals;" joined the militia as a company of light artillery, August 28, 1856, and was attached to the 76th Regiment; was assigned to the 29th Regiment, December 26, 1860; to the 10th Regiment, as Company B, December 29, 1860; became Company B, 10th Battalion, February 17, 1881; was constituted a separate company, designated the 35th Separate Company, and assigned to the 10th Regiment as Company B, May 1, 1905.

The company was mustered into the service of the United States as Co. B, 177th N. Y. Vols., November 21, 1862, and mustered out September 10, 1863; was again mustered into the United States service May 20, 1898, as Co. B, 1st N. Y. Infantry, and was mustered out February 20, 1899. During the War of the Rebellion the company furnished sixty officers to the volunteer armies of the United States.

The company was mustered into the United States service as Co. C, 1st N. Y. Infantry, May 20, 1898, and was mustered out February 20, 1899.

This regiment was organized as the 11th Regiment by a general order dated June 21, 1847, and was of eight companies, viz.: Light Guard of 106th Regiment; Benson Guard, of 125th Regiment; Independence Guard, of 264th Regiment; Italian Guard, of 252d Regiment; Monroe Blues, of 235th Regiment; Tompkins Blues, of 21st Regiment; Independent Tompkins Blues, of 222d Regiment, and LaFayette Fusiliers, of 85th Regiment. By a general order dated July 27, 1847, the designation of the regiment was changed to the 12th. A new company, under command of Captain Henry Johnson, was organized and attached to the regiment, April 25, 1849. Co. H of the 3d Regiment was transferred to the 12th Regiment, April 25, 1849. Co. D was consolidated with Co. C, June 5, 1849. A new company under Captain Adolphus I. Johnson, was organized April 15, 1850. Co. I was transferred to the 11th Regiment, May 3, 1858. On March 16, 1859, Cos. A and C, B and H, and G and E were consolidated, and the consolidated companies, with Co. D, transferred to the 10th Regiment. On June 29, 1859, these transferred companies were disbanded. On November 16, 1859, five companies (A, B, C, D and G) were organized in the Twenty-second Regimental District. On November 22, 1859, Co. F was organized and an election ordered for field officers of the 22d Regiment. These companies were composed principally of former members of the old 12th Regiment. The designation of the 22d Regiment was changed December 19, 1859, to 12th Regiment. Co. H was organized January 28, 1860, and Co. F, February 2, 1860. Co. C was consolidated with Co. E, March 21, 1861, and Co. K was organized May 8, 1861. Co. I, 23d Regiment, was transferred to 12th Regiment as Co. I, April 2, 1861. New Co. C was organized December 31, 1861. Co. K was disbanded February 12, 1862, and new Co. K organized September 22, 1862. Co. C was consolidated with Co. H, January 12, 1876. Co. I was consolidated with Co. G, January 12, 1876. New Co. I was organized February 21, 1876. Co. D was consolidated with Co. E, March 11, 1876. New Co. D was organized July 16, 1884, and new Co. C was organized June 3, 1885. The regiment performed duty during the Astor Place riots in 1849. April 21, 1861, the regiment entered the United States service for three months; July 12, took part in a skirmish near Martinsburg, and July 15, near Bunkerhill, W. Va.; August 5, 1861, it was mustered out of service at New York city. May 27, 1862, the regiment again entered the United States service for three months, during which they were engaged in the defense of Harper's Ferry, and were present at the surrender, although their services expired August 27, 1862, having volunteered to remain in service until October 15, 1862; September 16, the regiment was paroled; October 8, it was mustered out, and January 11, 1863, declared exchanged. June 20, 1863, the regiment re-entered the service of the United States for thirty days, serving in Pennsylvania and Maryland, and in suppressing the draft riots at New York city; it was mustered out by companies between July 20 and 25, but remained in the service of the State until September, 1863. The regiment was on duty during the Orange riots in July, 1871; during the railroad riots in July, 1877; during the switchmen's strike at Buffalo, in August, 1892; and at Brooklyn during the motor-men's strike in January, 1895. April 28, 1898, the regiment was authorized to be organized as a twelve-company regiment to enter the United service, into which it was mustered as the 12th Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, May 13, 1898, and mustered out April 29, 1899; Companies L and M were disbanded April 24, 1899. December 2, 1910, the regiment received authority to muster in a new company to be known as Company M. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted orderlies by Special Orders No. 167, July 2, 1912.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

This regiment was organized in 1847. It entered the service of the United States for three years in May, June and July, 1861; June 1, 1864, those entitled to discharge were mustered out, and the re-enlisted men and recruits transferred to the 5th New York Volunteers. During this service the regiment was also known as the 84th New York Volunteers. April 28, 1898, it was authorized to be organized as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to entering the service of the United States, into which service it was mustered May 13, 1898; it was mustered out of such service October 27, 1898. December 6th, the regiment was continued as a regiment of the National Guard composed of twelve companies. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted orderlies by Special Orders No. 167, July 2, 1912.

The regiment has authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

The regiment was organized in 1848. Cos. K and I were disbanded, the latter in 1845. A new Co. I was organized in 1879, and Co. E was consolidated with Co. H the same year. In 1880 Co. B was consolidated with Co. A, and Troop D, Cavalry, Eighth Division, was reorganized as a company of infantry and attached to the regiment as Co. E. In 1881 Cos. D and E were disbanded. A new Co. B and a new Co. D were organized in 1885. It entered the service of the United States June 19, 1863, and was mustered out July 30, 1863. In October, 1864, practically the whole of this regiment, as part of the 187th Regiment, N. Y. Volunteers, was again mustered into the United States service for one year and mustered out July 1, 1865. April 28, 1898, the regiment received authority to organize as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to entry into the United States service, the 13th Separate Company becoming for the time one of the additional companies. It was mustered into the United States service May 17, 1898, as the 65th Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, and mustered out of such service November 19, 1898. Cos. K, L and M were ordered disbanded May 31, 1899. June 10, 1907, the 13th Separate Company was attached to the 65th Regiment as Co. E. July 9, 1909, the regiment received authority to organize a new company to be known as Company K; Companies L and M were authorized to be organized December 2, 1910. This regiment performed duty at the street car strike, Buffalo, April, 1913.

Co. E of this regiment, the 13th Separate Company, is quartered in the State Armory, South Main street, Jamestown. It was organized August 22, 1875, as the 1st Separate Company, 31st Brigade. Designation changed to 4th Separate Company, December 8, 1877, and to the 13th Separate Company, September 4, 1882. Became Co. G, 3d Regiment, March 30, 1907, and Co. E, 65th Regiment, June 10, 1907. It was in the State service in Buffalo during the switchmen's strike in August, 1892, and the street car strike, Buffalo, April, 1913. In United States service, as Co E, 65th Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, from May 17, 1898, to November 17, 1898.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On October 12, 1851, a number of independent, uniformed military companies in the City of New York were organized into a regiment under the command of Colonel Charles S. Roe, and designated in General Orders No. 489, A. G. O., dated November 1, 1851, as the 69th Regiment, New York State Militia. In 1853 the regiment was reorganized as a regiment of artillery doing duty as infantry.

The regiment was mustered into the United States service on May 9, 1861, at Washington, D. C., for three months, during which service it participated in the battles of Blackburn's Ford and Bull Run, and was mustered out on August 3, 1861.

Immediately after its muster out and return practically the whole regiment, including the officers and enlisted men who had served in the three months' campaign, volunteered for three years, or the war, and the offer was accepted by the War Department in a letter to the commanding officer of the regiment under date of August 30, 1861, the regiment being mustered into the United States service on November 8, 1861, as the 69th Regiment, New York Volunteers. Its appellation of "militia" was changed to "volunteers" for the reason that the term for which the regiment volunteered exceeded the period of time established by the State of New York for which its militia regiments, to be recognized as such, could serve without the State. But its numerical designation, however, was, by authority of the State, retained in order to preserve and maintain the regiment's identity with the militia organization. During this service the regiment was attached to the Army of the Potomac, forming part of the Irish Brigade (2d Brigade — 1st Division — 2d Corps). It was recruited in 1863 and again in 1864 and finally mustered out of the United States service at New York on June 30, 1865.

The militia organization, having in the fall of 1861 been again reorganized and recruited, re-entered the United States service for three months on May 26, 1862, and on its return from this service the major part thereof entered the service of the United States for three years, being mustered in on November 17, 1862, as the 69th Regiment, New York National Guard Artillery, which designation was, to avoid confusion, changed on March 19, 1864, to the 182d New York Volunteers and mustered out of the United States service under that designation on July 15, 1865. During its term of service this organization was one of the units in the brigade of New York regiments known as the "Irish Legion," officially designated as the 4th Brigade (afterwards 2d Brigade), 2d Division, 2d Corps, Army of the Potomac.

The militia regiment having been again reorganized, was mustered into the service of the United States on June 25, 1863, for thirty days, and was mustered out on July 25, 1863. Again for the fourth time, the militia organization was, on July 6, 1864, mustered into the United States service for three months and was mustered out on October 6, 1864.

The regiment has rendered service to the State during the quarantine riots in 1858; the draft riots, 1863, and the quarantine disturbances in 1892. It was reduced December 6, 1893, to a battalion of five companies, A, C, D, I and K. The battalion was on duty at Brooklyn during the motormen's strike in January, 1895. New companies were organized for the battalion as follows: Co. B, June 5, 1894; Co. G, June 10, 1895; Co. E, June 11, 1895, and Co. F, September 7, 1900. The battalion was reconstituted a regiment September 4, 1895. April 23, 1898, the regiment received authority to organize as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to its entry into the United States service, into which service it was mustered May 19, 1898, as the 69th Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, and mustered out January 31, 1899. The regiment formally re-entered the service of the State on March 15, 1899. Companies L and M were disbanded April 12, 1899; Co. F, February 8, 1900, and Co. B, March 5, 1900. Co. F was reorganized and mustered in May 31, 1900. New Co. B was organized January 4, 1906. New Co. L was mustered in July 14, 1911. Co. M was mustered in December 29, 1913.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

The regiment was organized in August, 1852. The American Rifles, a battalion of four companies, formed the nucleus of the regiment. September 21, 1870, the 37th Regiment was consolidated with the 71st Regiment, Cos. E, D, H, A, G, K and B of the 37th Regiment being consolidated with Cos. A, C, D, E, F, G and K of the 71st Regiment, respectively. In 1861 it entered the United States service for three months, from April 19 to July 30; in 1862 it re-entered the same service, May 29, for three months, at the expiration of which it volunteered to remain, and remained until September 1; in 1863 it was mustered into the United States service for thirty days, and served from June 17 to July 22. April 28, 1898, it received authority to organize as a twelve-company regiment, preparatory to its entry into the United States service, into which it was mustered May 10, 1898, as the 71st Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, and mustered out November 15, 1898. December 8, 1898, it was reorganized as a National Guard regiment, composed of ten companies, Cos. L and M being disbanded. Co. M was mustered in January 8, 1907. On November 10, 1908, an additional company was directed to be organized and attached to the 71st Infantry, as Co. L. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted scouts by Special Orders No. 66, March 15, 1912. The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

In June 1854, the organization of the regiment commenced. Co. D of the 65th Regiment forming the nucleus. Co. B was organized in August, and Companies C and E in September, 1854; Co. A was formed in May, 1855; and these five companies constituted the regiment until February, 1858, when two companies, one of cavalry (R) and one of rifles (L) were organized and attached to it. In 1860 Companies F, G, H and I were organized, and the designation of Co. L was in 1865 changed to Co. K. Co. R was disbanded in 1863, Co. H in 1868; Co. I was consolidated with Co. B in 1870, and in 1882 Companies E and K were disbanded. Co. E was reorganized in 1886, and Co. H in 1891. New Co. I was organized January 4, 1906. In May, 1861, nearly the whole of Companies B, C, D and F joined and formed four companies of the 21st N. Y. Volunteers. June 19, 1863, the regiment was mustered into the service of the United States for thirty days, and mustered out August 3, 1863; it was remustered into the United States service November 16, 1863, for thirty days, and mustered out December 16, 1863. During the War of the Rebellion the regiment furnished to the country nearly 300 officers and over 1,000 men, who received their military instruction while members of it. Companies L and M were authorized by G. O. 84, A. G. O., November 10, 1908, to be mustered in. The regiment was authorized to organize a detachment of mounted scouts by Special Orders No. 89, April 11, 1912. The regiment performed duty at the street car strike, Buffalo, April, 1913.

Co. K of this regiment, the 25th Separate Company, is quartered in the State Armory, at Tonawanda. It was organized May 29, 1891. Was assigned to 1st Battalion as Co. G, December 22, 1898; and to the 74th Regiment, as Co. K, March 30, 1907. On duty at Tonawanda to suppress a riot in June, 1892; at Buffalo during the switchmen's strike in August, 1892, at Tonawanda again in June, 1893, during a strike at that place and at the street car strike, Buffalo, April, 1913. In United States service, as Co. G, 3d Regiment, N. Y. Infantry, from May 17, 1898, to December 7, 1898.

The regiment has received authority to place silver rings on the lances of its colors, engraved as follows:

On the National Color.—Gettysburg campaign, 1863; Buffalo, November and December, 1863.

On the State Color.—Draft riots, 1863; negro riot, 1864; Fenian invasion of Canada, 1866; Hornellsville, 1877; Buffalo, 1892.

September 29, 1891, the Second Separate Battery, Naval Reserve Artillery, was mustered in the service of the State in the City of Rochester. Its designation was changed on June 25, 1892, to Second Separate Naval Division, which designation was again changed on October 16, 1900, to Second Separate Division, Naval Militia.

This Division performed duty for the United States during the Spanish-American War in the U. S. Navy, and in the U. S. Auxilliary Naval Force aboard the "Franklin" and other vessels.

July 27, 1907, the Third Separate Division, Naval Militia, was mustered in the service of the State in the City of Buffalo.

January 25, 1910, a separate signal division was organized in the city of Rochester, and on February 14, 1910, the Third Battalion, Naval Militia, was formed of the Second and Third Separate Divisions, and the separate Signal Division, above mentioned, with headquarters in the State armory in the city of Rochester. On June 1, 1912, the First Division was mustered in at Dunkirk, N. Y. The Fourth Division was mustered in at Watertown, N. Y., June 18, 1913.

NOTE.—The National Guard shall not be less than 18,000 nor more than 18,000 enlisted men in time of peace; in case of war, insurrection, invasion, or imminent danger thereof the Governor has the power to increase the force beyond 18,000 and organize it as the exigencies of the service may require.

The strength of the Naval Militia in time of peace is not to exceed 2,000 men. but in time of war, invasion, insurrection, or imminent danger thereof, the Governor has power to increase it beyond 2,000 enlisted men and organize it as the exigencies of the service may require.

NOTE.—The staff of the Governor consists of: The Adjutant General, of the grade of Brigadier General; one Military Secretary, of the rank of Major or Lieutenant Commander, and sixteen Aides-de-Camp, detailed from the commissioned officers of the National Guard and the Naval Militia in active service and who shall not thereby receive higher rank. The officers thus detailed shall not be relieved from duty with their respective organizations except when actually on duty with the Governor.
