Corporate

§ 13. The corporate name of the said company shall hereafter be the Watervliet Turnpike and Railroad company.

§ 14. This act shall take effect immediately.

## Chap. 234.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of certain moneys expended in equipping the twentieth regiment of New York State militia.

Passed April 15, 1862; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Treasurer to pay not to exceed \$12,000. SECTION 1. The treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay out of moneys in the treasury raised in pursuance of chapter two hundred and seventy-seven, of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, on the warrant of the Comptroller, a sum not exceeding twelve thousand dollars for moneys loaned and advanced in April, eighteen hundred and sixty-one, by the banks located in the town of Kingston, for the purpose of equipping the then twentieth regiment of New York State militia now in the service of the United States; the moneys hereby appropriated, to be paid only on the presentation of proper vouchers showing the loan and advance of said moneys, and the proper application thereof to the purposes above stated.

Auditing Board. § 2. The Inspector General, Judge Advocate General and Quartermaster General are hereby constituted an auditing board to audit such claims as may be presented under the provisions of this act.

Governor to present secounts to U. S. Government.

§ 3. It shall be the duty of the Governor of this State to cause to be presented to the proper officers of the United States, accounts setting forth all payments made under the provisions of this act, with the proper vouchers thereof, and to effect the reimbursement of the same, and to pay into the treasury of this State all sums received in settlement for the same.
