AN ACT to incorporate the Union Home and School for the education and maintenance of the children of Volunteers.

Passed April 22, 1862.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Corporation

SECTION 1. Mrs. General Robert Anderson, Mrs. Drake Mills, Mrs. Olive M. Devoe, Mrs. David Hoyt, Mrs. Richard Stokes, Mrs. Walter Kidder, Mrs. Sarah Mather Mrs. J. Bagiola, Miss M. F. Hoyt, Miss H. Sherman, Mrs. John Voornis and Miss Kate Counell, and such othersal shall be associated with them, shall be and they are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of The Union Home and School, for the education and maintenance of the children of our Volunteers who are left unprovided for.

Managers.

\$2. The management of the affairs and concerns of the home and school, when the society is not in session, shall be conducted by a board of managers to be from time to time appointed by the society. The individuals named in the first section of this act shall be the first managers of the corporation and shall continue in office until a new election is held. Any number of the managers and officers appointed by the said corporation, not less than five, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

May hold real and personal property, § 3. For the object designated in the first section of this act generally or for any purpose connected with such object, the said corporation shall have power, from time to time, to purchase, take and hold real and personal estate, and to sell, lease and otherwise dispose of the same; provided the aggregate clear annual value of such estate shall not exceed ten thousand dollars.

Certain pa of the Revised Statutes applied. § 4. The corporation hereby created shall possess the powers and be subject to the restrictions and provisions contained in the fifteenth and eighteenth chapters of the first part of the Revised Statutes, as far as the same are applicable and have not been repealed.

§ 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
