a balance due - a few para - some  
did not nor will not pay - \$250

Hamington - shoe maker - on  
 Staten island - a poor man -  
 balance of bill for shoes - when  
 my men were transported \$65-00  
 a rigged harbor - for Navy - and  
 cutting my men here - a sanitary  
 precaution - a balance - I will  
 do not know how much can be  
 be over \$100 - TC Burns - can tell  
 you whether it is to be paid -
