General:

On referring to the case of Mr. Henry Bischoff it appears that he was re-appointed last winter and acting under a mis-apprehension most likely he has failed to qualify under the second appointment presuming it may be that it was not requisite. As Mr. Bischoff's appointment was strenuously urged and his application is unusually strong, the Governor deems it due to Mr. B. that he be instructed to qualify. If he should omit to do so, it would then be proper to displace him. The Governor will be glad to give Mr. Casey a commission as Notary Public.

The Governor had spoken to Mr. Casey in regard to procuring the signatures of contractors to the acknowledgments of payments in full of the respective contracts previous to my sending the contracts to Genl. Arthon, although I was not aware of it at the time. Perhaps the General

would desire Mr. Casey's aid in procuring the
signatures now. Will you request Mr. ^{Casey} to make
that enquiry.
