### ACTIVITIES REPORT

- 1. The information contained herein, as best can be determined, is based on the activities of this unit for the past year. Little is known of the history of this unit due to the turn-over of key personnel.
- 2. This band has been carrying on classes in military and musical subjects including: first aid, map reading, military sanitation, scouting and patrolling, transporting sick and wounded, military courtesy and discipline, school of the soldier, domestic disturbances, interior guard and sentry duties, combat duties of bandsmen, tent pitching, camouflage, music fundamentals, pitch discrimination, and sight singing. The band received a Superior rating on an inspection by the Chief of Army Bands Branch, Washington, D.C. held at Fort Sill, Oklahoma in May 1951.
- 3. The band has played honor guards for visiting dignitaries from various foreign countries including: Minister of War, Bolivia; Chief of Staff, Italy; and Chief of Staff, Cuba. The dance band played for the 176th Anniversary (estimated) of the US Marine Corps held in the ballroom of the Ft. Sill, Officers' Mess.
- 4. The strength of this organization has been fairly consistant. The main factor that effected the attendance to rehearsals, classes, and formations is the handling of our own administration; thus necessitating the excusing of certain personnel to handle the volume of paper work. This intailed long hours of reading regulations etc. in order to correctly prepare the necessary reports and forms. This also has resulted in numerous and frequent expenditures of time after normal duty hours in an effort to keep abreast with these requirements. In addition, this requires duplication of training to include the men who formerly missed training while doing administrative work.
  - 5. It is suggested that:
    - a. T/0&E 20-107N be revised to include additional personnel for administration.
    - b. Change 2, AR 250-5 be revised to authorize local procurement of music to insure more current popular music and better selecting power.
