Finishing Battery for Hamilton Light Artillery
Recruited at Fishing in August Sept. October
1861 after recruited known as
Light Battery L 2nd A. I. P. Battery
Left Fishing for the field December 2nd 1861
With five Officers and 148 enlisted Men.

Recruited
at Lenoir Station East Tennessee Nov 15th 1863
69 fifty nine men out of 71 twenty one present
for duty Recruited as a Veteran Command.

In accordance with Orders No 395 Nov 5th 1863
No 376 Nov 21st Series of 1863 War Department
Washington D.C.

This Veteran Command to be known hereafter as
per Order from War Department No 19. 63 and
from his Excellency the Governor of the State of
New York, No 916 February 14th 1864
as the 34th New York Light Independent Veteran
Volunteer Battery.

and during Service 149 One Hundred & Nineteen ^(Men)

entering their Services during four years War to this
Command 361

Accounted for by name to the War Department as follows
Died of Wounds and other Disease - twenty 20
Discharged for various causes - forty seven 47

Deserters - fifty three 53



Officers and men Honorably Mustered out of Service
 at the close of the War June 24th 1865 at Vicksburg
 Island N. Y. Harbour and sent to their Respective
 homes Passage Paid by the U. S. Government

This Command Participated in 52 fifty two of the
 most sanguine battles which were fought during the War
 and 74 seventy four Officers and men Wounded of which
