

Chief Instructor in Orientation, Camp McClellan, Anniston, Ala., December, 1918. Engagements: Toul and Montdidier Sectors with 6th and 7th F. Arrived in France, June, 1918; made Battalion liaison officer and regimental info. officer and commander of trains for 2nd Bn., 313th F. A.; on detached service in zone of British 1st and 2nd Army Corps in region between Beauvais, Amiens and Abbeville, collecting and shipping horses for all American units. (Squadron A training stood me in good stead on this assignment.) Engagements: Meuse-Argonne Offensive, September 26, 1918. Wounded in action, September 26, 1918, direct hit by German gunner operating Austrian 88mm. in their rear-guard action. Shell hit and exploded under right heel, macerating flesh of leg, but leaving me now almost as good as new. Gunners range was less than 1000m. and I can locate his position on any good map. Went through various hospitals in France and U. S. till discharge. Discharged May 10, 1919.

Second Plattsburg O. T. C.; Camp Dix, 153rd Depot Brigade, December 15, 1917-February, 1918. Major commanding 2nd Bn., 311th Infantry, 78th Div. at Camp Dix, N. J. and in France. Recommended for Lt. Col., but Armistice stopped promotions. Engagements: St. Mihiel Drive; Meuse-Argonne Operations. Discharged December, 1918.

## FREDERICK A. ADLER

Squadron A, Troop B, June 11-October 13, 1917. With 105th M. G. Bn., Co. A, October 13, 1917-April 1, 1919. Corp., April 25th, and Sgt., June 6, 1918. Engagements: East Poperinghe Line, July 9-August 20; Dickebush Sector, August 20-30; Vierstraat Ridge, August 31-September 2; The Knoll, Guillemont Farm, Quennemont Farm, September 27; Hindenburg Line, Bony, September 27-29; Selle River, October 17, 1918. Assigned to the 22nd Aero Squadron, 2nd Pursuit Group, 1st Wing, First American Army, A. E. F. Engagements: with 22nd Aero Squadron, which operated with the First American Army between St. Mihiel and Pont-à-Mousson, and between the Argonne Forest and the Meuse River. Killed near Bar-le-Duc, because of an accident to his aeroplane, October, 1918.]

[1st Lt., Ordnance, U. S. A. Served in the U. S. and with A. E. F. in France, 1917-1918. Died of illness contracted in service, April, 21, 1919.]

Deputy Chief of Utilities until July 12; Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff, Headquarters S. O. S. (at Tours) until July 22, 1918, when ordered to duty with First Section, General Staff, General Headquarters, A. E. F. Appointed Chief of First Section, General Staff and Assistant Chief of Staff to Gen. Pershing, August 1918. Promoted to Brigadier General, General Staff, U. S. Army, October 13, 1918. On duty General Headquarters A. E. F., July 22, 1918-April 27, 1919. United States Distinguished Service Medal, Citation as follows: "For exceptionally meritorious and distinguished services as assistant chief of staff, American Expeditionary Forces. He has rendered most efficient service in connection with the organization and administration of the transportation department of the American Army in France and as deputy chief of utilities in the services of supply. 



[Capt., Co. E, 165th Inf. Awarded Croix de Guerre for gallantry and coolness on the battlefield when his regiment crossed the Ourcq. After his ear drum had been pierced and while suffering excruciating pain, Capt. Baker continued at the head of his men, and in his disposition of them displayed such sound military judgment as to win special commendation. During his cross-

ing to France on a transport an accident occurred in the engine room which loosened a plate below the water line. The pumps could not handle the leak. The water rose to the level of the deck where the mules were stabled and 100 of the animals were drowned. At the risk of his life, Capt. Baker carried out a plan of his own devising which made it possible for repairs to be made. For this he received the formal commendation of the Navy Department. He died July 26, 1918.]

[Entered U. S. Army as Capt., 1917. "In the spring of 1917, advanced to the rank of Major and already a national figure in the work of preparing the U. S. aircraft campaign, he was sent to Europe at the head of a commission to study the aircraft problem in France, Italy and England. His splendid efficiency, enthusiasm and soldierly qualities were quickly rewarded by promotion to Colonelcy, and when his commission had made its report, Gen. Pershing placed him in charge of all matters concerning air service production, supply and training. During the late summer and autumn of 1917, Colonel Bolling, as Assistant Chief of the Air Service, did the work of two men in creating the organization and physical foundations for our flying forces in France. With nothing to start on, he builded so well that his associates and such men as Lord Northcliffe, Lord Rothmere and Paul D. Cravath said no department of the American Army's activities in France had so thorough and intelligent preparation as that over which Bolling presided. 'Bolling was the best we had,' was one of their phrases. In midwinter of 1917-18, Gen. Pershing assigned Col. Bolling to two months study of the actual combat operations of the British and French aviators preparatory to giving him a fighting command in our air forces at the front. Bolling was near the completion of this assignment, when, on March 26, 1918 he started to Amiens in a motor car, driven by his military chauffeur, to his observation duty at the fighting front. This was five days after the Germans had begun their terrible drive of 1918, when trench warfare was for the first time abandoned on a grand scale and the enemy was sweeping forward in some sectors as much as ten miles a day. When Bolling inquired of French and British officers whom he met, as to the distance to the front, he was told that the enemy was three miles away, but he had progressed scarcely a mile before falling into a machine-gun ambuscade. With his car disabled, he commanded his chauffeur to jump, and the two escaped the hail of machine gun bullets by occupying adjoining shell holes. Coolly loading his revolver, Col. Bolling shot dead a German officer who was firing at the chauffeur. At the same instant a second German officer sent a bullet through Bolling's heart. The chauffeur, 'playing dead,' was later captured and taken to Germany. Some three months later a German aeroplane dropped a message in the Allied lines saying that Col. Bolling had been shot through the heart on the date given above, and that his chauffeur was a prisoner. Thus fell the first American officer of high rank to lose his life in the World War—a gallant soldier, a gentleman without fear and without reproach, a far-seeing, patriotic Amer-Decorations: Croix de Guerre (French), Distinguished Service ican." Medal (U. S.). Cross of the Legion of Honor, (April 4, 1919). Le"Le Grand Chancelier de l'Ordre National de la Legion d'Honneur certifie que, par Décret du 4 Avril, 1919, Le Président de la République Française a conféré a M. le Colonel Bolling, Raynal C., Ancien Chef de la Mission Américaine de l'Aviation en France (tué a l'ennemi) la Décoration d'Officier de l'Ordre National de la Légion d'Honneur." Citation: Gen. Pershing. "His services to the United States Aviation were distinguished for an accurate and comprehensive grasp of aviation matters, for a sound and farsighted conception of the measures needed to establish an efficient American Air Service in Europe, for initiative and resourcefulness in attacking the problems of a young air service, for brilliant capacity in arranging affairs with foreign governments, for boldness and vigor in executing determined policies. In all of these he has rendered service of great value to the Government." Killed in action, March 26, 1918.]

"3. The Department feels very strongly that action of this kind is worthy of commendation, more so, because of the difficulties under which you were compelled to work. Immersion, even for such a short period in

icy water while wrapped in heavy water-soaked clothing, is in itself an exhausting experience, but to have willingly braved these conditions in attempting to rescue a fellow officer makes your action very meritorious, and you are highly commended by the Department . . . ."


