# New York in the Revolutionary War

At the outset, it should be noted that, inasmuch as the Military Museum's collection did not start until 1863, we do not have many primary source documents prior to that time period. If you cannot find information on a particular soldier after reviewing these resources, the best advice is to look for information on the unit where the soldier served. You could also try searching for the unit's commanders, who may have written memoirs or books about the war.

In addition to the above resources, a good place to search is WorldCat, <a href="www.worldcat.org">www.worldcat.org</a>, which is a database of thousands of library catalogs. However, this is more of a discovery database since you will not be able to borrow from it directly.

You might also be able to find unit histories at The Internet Archive.

Other possible resources are the local (to the solider/unit) historical societies and public libraries.
