# New York in the Spanish-American War

There were three types of units in the Span-Am War, excluding the Navy and Marines. These were regular US Army units, Volunteer units raised by the states, and state militia/national guard units. The museum only has information regarding the Volunteer units.

There is a <u>name index</u> for soldiers who served in the New York Volunteer regiment during the war This will give you the regiment, volume and page number for the soldier. Once you have that information you can go to the <u>unit rosters to get</u> <u>personnel information</u>.

Please note that, if you cannot readily find information as to a particular soldier, the best advice is for you to look for information related to the specific unit the soldier served in. Another possibility is searching for the unit's commanders, who may have written memoirs or books about the war.

In addition to the above places a good place to search is <u>WorldCat</u>. WorldCat is a database of thousands of library catalogs. This is more of a discovery database since you will not be able to borrow these directly.

You might also be able to find unit histories at <u>The Internet Archive</u>.

Other possible resources are the local (to the solider/unit) historical societies and public libraries.

Additionally, there are also two great newspaper databases: NYS Historic Newspapers
