THURSDAY NAY F 1864

This sorting the there routed out at 4 oclock and the thought we never going to make on without meeting the enemy, but soon found the troops were forming for battle. Our division formed on the road that sums east and west about moon they commenced fighting and kept it up for 3 or 4 bours. On our left the firing and kept up till dark. We have got to sleep to night without blankets.

FRIDAY 6

Firing we commenced as soon as daylight and has kept up for an hear or two , then there was only a little skirminghing .iboutsoon the rese threw in some shells that came unpleasantlynear our party and one was recorded and one braised Just before dark the recognades a sudden attack on our right and came near turning it .

After dark the whole of our force fell mack behind their breastworks.

SANGRAT 7

This morning the rebs came out through the moods and our artillry opened on them and afterwards me charged on them and draws them back through the woods . There has been some skirmigh firing all day . Quite a number of the 16 th Nich were wounded.

Just at dark me went to the hospital and loaded up all the sick and started for Chanceforville

SURDAY 8

We arrived at Chancelerville about 8 5this serning staid there till daylight and then marched along the Fredricksburg pike to within 8 siles of that place, then we took a hyeroad and marched in the direction of Spettsylviania 6 8. We got to the lines a little after dark . Our regt and the 83 Pa had been in a hard fight this morning and lost severely . We bunted all around but could not find the regt so we laid down and went to sleep.

HONDAY 9

Found the regt this morning . They have been resting to day , there has been but little firingto day . Our regt lost meverely yesterday Cousin Willis is mounded and missing. The regt has lost LES killed wounded and missing since we promed the Rapidan . Our skirmish liming/backedhjust before dark and there was some pretty sharp firing but it has died away and I think we will have a change t to sleep to night

TUESDAY WAY 10 1884

There has been some heavy lighting this afternoon and severe cannonading .Our brigade has ordered to the front and expected to charge but the order has counterlanded .Our boys here glad enough of it .Gen Rice was carried o'll the field shot through the knee.

Had a light shower this afternoon. The rebs made an attack on our right and droye it back as it was held by heavy artillery . But our sen rallied and droye them back , taking some prisoners.

PRIDAY 20

The pickets in our front have been very friendly this morning exchanging papers &c. It has been pleasant and dry so far . Went up to the train this afternoon . Vent to the Sth for a short time and say Bell.

SATURDAY 21

all was very quiet this forenoon but a little afternoon we began to fall back . The rebs followed up our skirminhers rappidly . We marched till we came to the RR and followed it down a ways then turned southward and marched till 9 colock and went into c camp . SUMDAY ??

To day we started about 10 our brigade in advance , there was so skirwishing .5 of our regt were wounded my a shell. We went into camp a little before dark

MONDAY WAY 23 1884

Started early this morning ,we marched with the train .

About 8 the first brigade was advancing when the rebs sade a fierce attackbut were repulsed our loss 100 was small but think theirs was greater as our batteries had a good chance and theirs had none

THESDAY 24

Lay behind the breastworks which we threw up untill late in the afternoon when we moved a mile to the right and encamped. There was some heavy firing during the day aparently 8 or 10 miles down the river but all was quiet where the there.

WENSDAY 25

This morning we moved a mile or two along the SR towards the ; junction. There has been some skirminhing along the little river in front of us . The troops have been engaged in tearing up and destroying the railroad.

TRUBSDAY 28

Our regt was on picket last night, there were none of thecohurt though there was some firing. Had a shower this morning and this forences and again this evening, after dark we fell back across the North anna. I stopped at the train and we are to follow the troops as soon as they get across.

FRIDAY 27

We did not get started till daylight and then we went only a mile before we stopped and got breakfast. We then started andwhent rappidly 6 or 8 miles when we balted again a little before noon. This afternoon we marched slower but made good progress. We did not get into camp till nearly 11 oclock though the troops were in earlier.

Collector Temper 28

Started early this morning 4 of us went ahead foraging and succeed ed in capturing a pig.We finally turned off to the Panunkey along which we have been parching for two days and crossed it .Took, our attentions and went to the regts .Found the troops encaseded along the top of a hill a mile from the river and through a breastmorks, they here to stop doing it this evening and the boys think is will move in the morning.

SUNDAY MAY 29 1864

NONDAY 30

To day our division advanced about ? miles . The Pa reserves on left were driven back and before the reserves could form the rebs were upon them and drove them back . However the 2nd 4th divisions formed along the road and thren up breastworks and sent heavy lines into the woods the remels at tacked them but were repulsed, do not know whether they regained the ground the reserves lost not. A brigade of the 9th corps releived our ?nd brigade .

TURSDAY 31

Our regh was releived about noon and our division moved to the left into the woods ,a nice shady place .There has been heavy firing on the left and right

WENSDAY JUNE 1

Our brigade remained in the woods where we came yesterday till a little after noon . When no advanced going around the swame in front of us . Our regt commenced throwing up breastworks . Our exirmishers were on a little rise about 30 rods in front of us. Thout 6 seleck the rebs advanced driving in our skirmishers they advanced to the top of the hill but could not come over though they kept their colors flying . At dark we received reinforcements but they were so seared that they fired into our regt willing one wan, and wounded one otherwo carried off these men only one of them from our regt. There was heavy firing on our left that continued untill after dark.

THIRSDAY 2

We remained in the breastworks untill 3 PN when we soved out "remains and the mickets" had not gone more than half a mile we when the pickets on the right came in eaying they were driven. We went a little farther and found the 9th corps forming in line of battle at right angles to our former one. Pretty soon the rebbs attacked but were repulsed. Half an hour after they attacked again and the firing was kept up untill after dark when we had a chance to make coffee. Soon after noon we had a sharp shower and this evening it is drizzleing

FRIDAY JUNE 3 1884

This morning the pickets were close up to us 500 yardsback of an where the line was last night . Soon after daylight a line was formed in the field and advanced to the woods, the artillery throwing shells directly in front of thes. Directly a rebel battery on our left opened on ours the shell bursting in front of the breastworks in which us lay and lengthways of them . One of got was killed and several others on the right of the regt. Our batteries then turned on them and after a while nearly silenced them. Then the 2nd and 3d brigades awong around into the field to straighten the line. One man in our regt was killed and 6 or 7 wounded. Just at night a man on the picket line was wounded Sig and I went out to get him but he died soon after me got him in. There was heavy firing way on the left this evening.

SATURDAY JUNE Z

This morning the rebs were all gone from in front of us and our boys ment into their breastworks. If dead horses lay about where their guns were yesterday, and large numbers of small ares. About noon we moved out of the breastworks and we thought we were going off to the left ,but there was some mistake and we were ordered back . It is raining some this evening.

X SUMBLY 5

To day we have lain behind the breastworks. There has been come sicket firing but no wounded it dusk there was some very heavy firing on the left and the picket firing ran along the line down to us . We expected an attack but there was none made . He shall move out before morning.

MONDAY 5

We moved to the church about 11 colock but did not go any farther untill nearly daylight. We then ment some 3 miles farther and encamped. We have had a good resting dayand have drawn shoes and socks. also got a sail.

THESDAY 7

This morning we nere routed out as soon as daylight and 2 division of our corps started .We thought we nere going on some sort of a reconnoisance , but we must only some 3 or 4 miles and went into easp. one of the regts from each brighte going on picket on the obiokahominy.

X WENSDAY 8

We are takink it wery easy to day . The rebs threw a few shalls

TENSOAY JUNE 8 1864

We are taking it easy these days . The rebs threw a few shells be but only made a noise and twated their augunition.

This morning they fired at a crowd around the butchers and succeeded in scaring the butchers away but the boys came near carrying away all of the meat before they left.

TRUESDAY 9

all has been quiet here to day . Our regt laid out camp and not up tents. We came back to the train half a mile from the regt and out up a tent.

WRITING 10

This morning the 9th Kass left for the White House on their way home. It has been quiet . Some think we are to make another move to the left . It is reported that we are taking up the RR and reshimping the stores.

SATURDEY 11

all has been very quiet to day. The other two divisions of our corps it is said have sowed to the left on the Chickshominy.

SUNDAY 12

Everything new yeary quiet to day .In the afternoon Gen Grant and Meade passed .Just after dark we started on the march keeping along down the river.After marching till 1 colock me stretcher carriers have stopped to wait till serning. I suppose the troops will go on and cross the river

HOMENY 13

after an house walk this sorning me crossed the river and came up with our division. We stopped and made coffee . Our corps moved on a mile or so farther and stopped for the day. There is a line of battle formed for the protection of the crossing of the rest of the troops. Started a little after dark and marched till 2 o clock.

Started on the march again this morning .arrived at charles city court house about 10 30 and stopled for coffee. This afternoon we marched ? or 3 miles and ememy ed near the river. The 2nd corps is being sent up the river as fast six possible. Went down to the river just at night and had a fine bath.

To day has been very varu. The trains are being shipped there are mone besutiful fields of clover oats and theat here the wheat is almost fit to cut but little of it will be of any use to the sowers I fear . It is said that our division is to remain here till every thing else is shipped

This morning early no nent down to the river. To mere ferried ac across about I colockand ment up the bank a mile or two and balted till 3When we started and marched rappidly untill lloclock when my companion and myself fell out pretty well tired out It is reported that the first line of works has been captured at Petersburg, and we must get up in supporting distance.

FRIDAY 17

Care up with the troops amout sunrise . The 2nd corps is in front of us . We have been lying all day where the division stopped last night. There has been some heavy firing on the left. There is a long line of north near us that were captured last night.

RATURDAY IS

This sorning our division moved to the front . We lay a little to the left of some breastworks taken last night by the 9th corps One of our boys counted 70 dead rabels . I did not go near till a good many were buried but I may 25 or 30 about moon we moved up farther into some breastworks. At dark we moved up close to t the skirminhers and not more than 250 or 300 yards from the breastwork and ment to work throwing up works . The 1st and 2nd brigades are in front of up and expect to charge

SUNDAY 19

for some reason there was no charge made last night .4s soon as it was light the rebs began proping at every head that showed it self above the breastworks . Three of our regt were instantly killed before 9 oclock .ifter that the moys were more careful and no more were hit. In the afternoon two morters were opened in the rear of our regt which dropped shells very nicely into the rebs! works . The rebs opened on them with shell and cannister which came yery near us but none of us were hit

pe have laid all day mented the corks . One of our boys who wask, who a mile behind the regt after mater was wounded through the calf of the leg my a stray ball . That was the only one of our regt wounded to day. The 16th Mich and 83 Pa on our left had several wounded

TURBDAY 21

This morning we moved about 2 miles to the left and ment into the woods ,and he thought we mere going to lay off for a mile. but pickets were thrown out and in the evening we advanced and throw up hreasthorks. One of our boys has killed on picket this eyening.

WENSDAY 22

To day we have lain in the trenches which we threw up last night. Our regt and one or two others are in the 2nd line .It has been quite phiet during the day except a little cannowading. untilexametlers when some sharp musketry and some shelling broke out on the left of us It did not last 5 minutes but it is reported that the raps made the attack and captured some cannon. Ifter half an bour it broke out again and kept up untill dark. It seems to be an attempt to advance the pickets.

THURSDAY 23

This morning and this eyening there was considerable firing bet tween the pickets but during the day it was so warm the pickets seemed to prefer to lie still . This eyening there was quite a ruspus kicked up but it did not shount to such.

PRIDAY 24

This pointug there was a beary cannamade on the right .It acres. red that they were shelling the city .After a little the rebu commenced to three shells eyer it; and kept it up quite lively f for half an hour our batteries readying .Only one man in our brigade was hit.

SATTIEDAY 25

Went muck to the hospital to day for some rations . It has been a yeary hot day though there was some breeze .

SURDAY #8

To day has meen quiet along here. In occasionall discharge of artillery to the right of us. This evening it clouded up , there was some thunder and it looked as if no should get rain but it proved to me only mind. Trote a letter bose.

Last night was very cool . To day has been quiet and not very hot. One of our boys who has been down on the right says the rebel sharpshooters keep up a continual fire and also throw so mortar shelds into our works . Our wen are mining a fort there.

Every thing goes on the same . the neather hot .our boys are digging wells.

SATURDAY ?

To day went over to the 2nd corps and saw Dell . Found it very he hard and dusty walkings. Received a letter from home and answered it SUNDAY 3

To day there has been the usual amount of cannonading and ploket firing .wut all quiet here.

To day there has smen a breeze blowing so it has not seen so hot the result have smen throwing some shells but have not done such burt . This evening our sorters have been at work, the shells lighted by the fuses make meantiful ourses.

This morning as such as daylight started to go to the train found it cool and pleasant walking and it has been cool and pleas ant all day . The rebs have out the RB between Fiedment and Washington . There is considerable excitment and a such for papers.

PRIDAY JULY 15 1884

To day our upn a little to the left of us baye come throwing mortar shells quite lively into the rebal works. The reba have t thrown a few shells over us but have not done such harm this Eyening it is reported that the rebel raid has resource the

Potomac and that Custer has captured their train.

THURSDAY- 16 To day has meen thuist . Our mortars on the right have been at work some . This is a besutiful moonlight evening . The 183 Po are enjoying it they have a violin and flute player on the breastworks and are dancing in the street.

SUNDAY 17

To day has been quiet nothing of interest going on .Wrote : letter home . This evening the regts were all in arms on account of the reports of the pickets that the enemy seemed to be formig in the hollow

HONDAY 18 last night passed off quietly . To day has upon very quiet though a few morter shells were thrown not far from here . There is more or less of that going on every day a little to the right of us , but we have mesons so accustomed to it that we hardly notice it .

TURSDAY 19 To day we have been having a fine rain .it commenced in the night and has been raining all day . To night it looks like clearing off

WENSDAY 20 To day sunshine and clouds . Went up to the big fort at the left Found the 104th in it . Had a short wish with George Stryker.

TRUBSDAY 21

This morning with and Jack came to the front and Sig and I went back to the train . It is more confortable than when we were here last the dust does not fly so.

PRIDAY 22

There was some heavy firing in the \$th corps this afternoon but don't know what it amounted to

SATURDAY 23

To day had inspection of the train . Wrote a letter home.

It is reported that the 2nd corps captured 4 guns and 1000 prisoners at Malvern hill, this morning. It is sprinkling this evening and looks like rain.

This morning Sig and I came out to the front and Smith and Jack went back found some change . There has meen a deal of digging the past week.

PRIDAY 29

To day 8 8 inch mortars were put in position behind our regt. This evening the 6th wass battery case up to the right of our regt. It is thought an attempt will be made to carry the rebel works tomorrow.

SATURDAY 30

This morning a rebel fort in front of the 9th corps was blown up and immediately all the 50ms and mortars along our line opened fire. A charge was made and the rebel line carried where the fort was mileve up. The rese tried to retake it fut were repulsed. The firing pretty much ceased at moon. We had a good view as me were at the left of the line and mut few shots came any others near us. About moon the rese again pade a charge and recaptured the fort. Since all has been quiet. Our pickets went out and our not fired on.

SUBDAY 31

This morning the mortars in rear of us were removed .4 flag of truce was sent out for permission to remove the wounded and bury the dead .The matter meens to pe pending and nothing done yet.

NUMBAY ANG 1

This morning the wounded were removed and the dead suried . I have heard a report that our loss was only foo but think it must use weater. The paymenter is around and think us will get our pay tomorrow or next day.

TURSDAY 2

This morning went me to the 104th to see George and learned he had lost a thumb my a piece of shell when on picket.

The reds were throwing shalls over this way all night at intervals . Though none came dangerously near us their shrelking was not conductve to sleep.

PRIDAY 12

We are having beautiful moonlight evenings now but small chance to enjoy them .Although not a mile from the cockade city none of us have yet visited it ,and it looks as if it would be a long time yet before we shall have an opportunity . Heceived a letter from home this eyening.

SATURDAY 13

Nothing of interest going on .Sunday .Trote a letter home.

This morning early me were releised by the Tth corps and our corps went to the rear and biscuscked. Sig and I what to the train as our 5 days mere up. We had a very hard thunder shower this PK

TURSDAY AUGUST 18 1884

This morning was pretty cool but the sun came out warm in the aftermon . Was detailed for police duty.

WENSDAY 17

Last night were awakened at 10 and told to pack up everything. Laid down after it was done and got a little map. Were awakened at 2 and ordered to hitch up .Got breakfast as we expected to move out at once. and then laid down and slect till daylight . are in camp yet .It is raining this evening.

THURSDAY 18

He were roused at one colock to pack up and be ready to more about 2 AM a heavy cannonade opened along the line .No did not start till daylight .Noved down the plank road p miles then marched to the right about a mile , then went in line of battle a mile when we came to the P dW BR and commenced to tear it up about 2 pm beavy musketry opened upon the BR We were moved in line of battle in that direction but after a little moved off by the flank .and ment down paralell to the RRand threw up breastworks. A good deal of rain has fallen this PM

FRIDAY 19

This has been a rainy day .All was quiet untill 3 Pm when heavy firing commencedupon the right of the SH. The rebs appeared to be driving our men .Our brigade was moved and our rest got opposite corps headquarters when Gen Warren ordered us to go into some breastworks there. The brigade did not go such farther but returned to their old places as our men had stopped the programm of the enemy without our help.

SATURDAY 20

there has been no fighting to day . We have had one hard shower . We remained by corps headquarters untill afternoon then we took our place on the left of the brigade. Received a letter from home this morning.

SUNDAY 21

This morning were ordered to pack up and we thought we were got ing to maye but we seen found the rese were esout to attack. Which they did and were repulsed with heavy loss of killed mounded and primarers and colors. Also the whole corps train was sent off loaded with recel wounded.

This morning our brigade stretched out and releived the 2nd which hair gone on the other side of the RE and gone to building breastworks, facing to the rear. I suppose it is for the purpose of shortening the lime and protecting the flank is: case of an attack.
