Our Colonel is making arrangements to have his Reg. take the lead on Corps review which is to come off in a few days.

Burch and Tyler are all right except John is rather depressed in spirits on the account of his not hearing from home in a long time. If you see any of his friends tell them that John is anxiously looking for news from home. He wants to know how wife Morley is getting along if you have any means of knowing write in regard to it to satisfy his longing curiosity & let me know how the people of the Hill get along.
