

Tonda June 14<sup>th</sup> 1863

Dear and absent Friend

I now seat myself down  
to answer your kind letter of late & was  
glad to hear that you was well & I am  
the same at present. With the 4<sup>th</sup> is near  
at hand & we are going to have a ~~deliberately~~  
day then I presume we shall have a pleasant  
time that day I wish all Soldiers could  
be home to spend the fourth of July  
but dont suppose that can be so dont you  
wish it could. I am sure I do for I have  
a great many friends and relatives in the  
Army and I should like to see them all  
& felt it makes me so angry when I think

of this war but that does not do any good  
but I wish that I had a rope around old  
Abes neck I would give him a choke I wish  
that some one could get-hold of him that did  
not like him and found him good the old  
retch that he is. Well it is very quiet here  
you would think there was no trouble down  
south I do not see much difference than  
there used to be for the people here are the  
same as always <sup>they are</sup> just as proud as ever &  
same day this week Doty and I are going  
to take a fine ride in the woods we are  
going to Albany to stay a few days I  
hope we shall have a nice time we are  
going to start Tuesday & stay until  
Friday if nothing happens I wish that you  
could meet us there.

There was a Regiment of Soldiers past  
through here yesterday about 10 o'clock  
they where invited to Little Falls.

they had a grand reception for them  
when they got thru: they went back last  
night to New York to get mustered out  
of service & they will return to their homes  
next week.

P.S. We have delightful weather here now  
and enjoying our selves we attended the  
Concert Thursday night it was not very  
good they where the Glee Club of Spudan.  
We had plenty of ice cream that was  
splendid I wish you could had some too  
I presume you have every thing good  
down South or you would not stay so  
long.

I can not write much more now  
you must excuse this bad looking sheet  
of paper it is all I had in the house  
to day & being Sunday I could not  
send and get others I shall have better  
news ~~soon~~

I am going over to see mother across  
a little while she says I must give  
her love to you and she says she hopes  
you will soon return home  
give regards & my respects to Capt. Sh<sup>e</sup>  
no more at present
