I had a letter from Uncle John the 14<sup>th</sup> he was well too but had seen some pretty tough times as well as the rest of you

We are having rather disagreeable weather up at Doranoga now it raining half of the time and the wind

when the wind does not blow and it  
does not rain it is cold as green tan  
to stay the wind blowz and it is  
rather cold I wish it would be  
pleasant part of the time so I can  
have a bean but things always click  
go against me and I guess they always  
will but I do not care very much anyway  
well I guess I have written foolishness  
enough for this time dont you
