May 23, 1864

Dear Mather,
We got here yesterday at 12 o'clock and event into camp
on the bank of the Mississippi. We left alexandria on the
12 th and got to Simsport on the 17 th and stayed there
until the 19 th and we marched 25 miles down the river
where we are now encamped.

The weather is very, very warm here. We have new patatoes, peas, lettuce, beets, and all kinds of garden goods. We have marched 600 miles since the 15th of March and have done some fighting in the bargain. We have had a pretty hard march. One day coming from Grandecore to alexandria we marched 40 miles. Our fighting is over for the present. There is no face of rebs very near here.
