was all fracked up ready to start we look the sleamer and went to bortress monro we staid there all night and in the morning we take the steam boat for bermuda hundred where we arrived a bout sip o clock we went a shore and was ordered to the front when we could could not hear the earnows roar and see the smoke rise but the order was countermanded and we came back a twenty miles they had a fight here on the twenty eight the and they drove them back we expect they will attack us every hour but let them come if they want to we will give thin a warm reception with grafe and canistes you we

are a throwing of up breast works you heard that I was wounded but I am now you must not work a bout me for I have got the sa me fortecter here that I have at home bugent as was quite smart when I left there I have not mutck lime to write now I will write to hellen as soon as I get time I have not got my watch and but I think I shall get it back it is a first rate watch you will have to tel The me of the fiction of the second and toler toler left write hour the store came out this spring I think I shall be at home as soon as this
