for the same as he gave for it I don't know when we shall get our pay we mustered for pay. the last day of June again They are me a 164 dollars we are getting sixteen dollars a month now there is not but for two in the ten new a go young fellow by the name of Joseph Le Bolster There was two men shot on freket last night they are a going to run old Abe for foresident a gain but I think he will not be elected for the seldiers are all down on him that I haved say any thing a bout him you may send me a dollars worth of stamps paper & can get here but it is not very govel I don't know how to long we & hall slay here

I think Morris has got to hugging his gransseathes in right good easnest has Harvy Wove got home I don't know of any thing more to write so good by from your san
