

Saratoga Springs Jan: 4th 1865

My Dear Brother

I now set down

to write you a few lines for Mother
She was down here Tuesday and ^{got} the money
all right I suppose 75 dollars express paid
she put 45 in the Bank and kept the
rest she went back home the same day
she wanted me to write and tell you
about it as there was no body up there
now to write for her she said you
must write just the same for you
know she would write if she could
we have not heard a word from Fred
in most four months what has become
of him is more than we ^{know} Mother is all
most crazy about him if she dont
hear from him soon I dont know
what we shall do with her she thinks
he is dead we tell her if he was dead
we should heard of it some way I
think sometimes he is dead but durst

not let her know I think so
you know he is always so easy time
enough yet it ~~had~~ seems as if he went
a purpose to make trouble for as we
did not have enough before

Daniel Leatham is a little better I
believe he has been sick six weeks
with typhoid fever is very low but
the doctor thinks he will get along
now if nothing more sets in I have
not seen him in some time as
I have been sick myself threatened
with a fever and my face is all
swollen up now so I cant but
just see to write most every body
is sick in Saratoga

I hope you will get home this winter
but it will be hard to have you
go back again we shall have the
priviledge of seeing you once more
you say you think I have forgot
I had a brother both but I have not
forgot any of you but I have so much

do and to think of I don't get
much chance to write to you
must excuse me

I wish you a happy new year
and if you come home you must bring
me a photographic album for a present
Johny goes to school I can't think of
any thing more to write this time
so good by write to Ma often
and me when you want to

I expect to see the door open some
night and in step Seth with his
Knickerbocker strap upon his back

once more good by write soon
