Mar the 28th 1865.

Dear Mother

few lines to let you know that
I am well and hope this will find
you the same I have sent to
you A Record of my Co and
I will now send you \$5 dollars
to get a frame for it and fit it
up nice for it shall think a
good deal of it you will see
the names of my Co & the
number of Battles the number of
Killed the number of Discharged
and the ^{number} of Deserters &c &c
I think it is worth framing
will Mother hear it no news
from but hear it good news
from Grant & Sherman we
will have this thing nifled out
before our time expires i think

So at least and hope
So far i would like
To have Peace Reign over
our...and Happy Land then me
can go to our dear homes then
we will see who stands
The Best City Citizens those
cavards that has stade at
Home and done nothing the Soldiers
who has fought for the the
last 4 years and ~~but~~ it is
My Honest opinion that it
is the Soldiers who will
be remembered and i dont think
we ~~will~~ need wait til the
conflict is ended i think
the Soldier is all right now
in the estimation of the most
of our northern People all the
i talk is about the Soldiers
and a good deal they went to
know if the Soldiers must come
from intemperat and rough well
there is some that it rough at
Home or abroad but i know some
men in my regt that was perfect saty
when they came out that were sober
men and also church members
