Dear Brother

We recued your
most wilcom lctr one week ago yesterday
it found us all well and very glad
to hear from you once more i had
thought you had forgot you had any
friends in Syracuse we was very glad
to hear that you had been home
this winter and we shall be glad
when your time is out and you can
be to home with Mother and we
shall look for you and she out here
in the fall if nothing hapend.
Daniel is well and sends his love to
you and all of the other boys he
is a conductor now he runs from here
to Rochester and back Christy's wife
has been out here on a visit she
was well if you see Thardore tell
him i would like to have him
awnder my decty that i wrote him
last fall i have writen two lctrs
to Mother since i came home from there
but didnt recie no reply to them
and i think she dont wanto hear
from us but if she cant write i

happo excuse her we shall lack
for you and her out here next
fall with out fail if nothing
happens to you all and i hope you
all will be spared to come home
but were it hard i have tunded
a courrels servants farm to day and it
was a very sad thing to see
it was a big turnant he wis
killed in the last battle with
a shell Seth when you write tell
me if i direct your letter write
to yo and pleas write soon to
us for we feel ancheard to hear
from you all and write all of the
news to us when you write
our love to all none the less
