Dear friend Seth

I received your very welcome letter last night and was very glad indeed to hear from you and glad to hear you were well I am well and hope this will find you the same Harrison is up home to day Beat is going over there this Summer so I shall be all alone now oh how lonesome I shall be I went down to see Jane yesterday she is as full of fun as ever she thinks I need not be so sober about that piece she showed me in that paper I never saw any one so full of fun as Jane is did you Seth I guess I now who that School man was that wrote that letter for I have heard some things since you went away but I dont know as I have guess right oh Seth Anna

Gewer Beau has got back he has
been exchanged and his Father went
after him and fetched him home
I expect she is happy now I should
think she ought to be at any rate
don't you think she had you said
you heard you was married when
you was home last winter I can't
think how that could happen and
you not know any thing about it
until now oh Seth you say you
have got 6 months longer to stay
I hat thought you did not have
so long as that to stay it seems
as long as year eight to since you
went back and now to think you
have got six long months to stay
yet it don't seem as if it would
ever pass away Seth I was over to
your mothers the other day she has
got your picture you sent her I
think it is real handsome she is

real smart she thinks she is so
lonesome now she can't go out
much she had a letter from Fred
he sent a picture same like yours
Seth I am making ~~face~~ Splint
fans now for 5 cents apiece don't
you think I will be rich in a
short time I think you have enough
to do every day I should think you
would be tired enough when it
comes night if you will send some
of it up here we will help you do
some of it oh Seth I hope this war
is about done we hear some good
news every day if the war should
end I hope you can come home
in less than six months don't you
oh what a happy time it would be
if you could all come home once
more don't you think so when I
was to Saratoga since you went
away I saw a man that was home

on a Purlough he was a getting
him a new uniform and last week
he was buried he was kill in the
battle in front of Petersburgh his
time was out next September and Capt
Oakley was killed the same time they
were in the 77 Oakley tried to get a
Purlough to come home but he could
not get one he leaves a wife and 3
children oh this horrid war how many
homes are made desolate forever when
will it be ended but enough of that
oh Seth how sorry I am to think you
are lonesome you must try and not
feel so you must keep up good courage
and your time will soon be up and
then you will be home again to stay
oh how glad we will all be when you
are all be home again and peace reigns
I write more I don't know but you think
I write very often if you will answer
then as soon as I did this you will do
well if you can read this you will do
well you must write as soon as you
get this for I shall be so lonesome
Bent is gone want you write as soon
as you get this and I will do the same
one set his for Seth and now I will
stop hoping to hear from you again
soe no more this time good by Seth
