

Saratoga Springs August 27<sup>th</sup> 1865

Dear Uncle Seth -

It is with great pleasure  
that I now seat myself to answer your  
kind and welcome letter which I received  
a few days since and hasten to reply  
before you think I have forsaken you  
entirely for you say you have written  
three letters to me and received no answer  
in return but I never received one of your  
letters but the one I am now answering  
so I thought I must answer this because  
you said I would get rate when you  
came home We are all well  
at present and hope this will find

you the same which I wrote - it will  
Uncle Theodore and his wife and  
one child are here among us at present  
a week ago tomorrow who should come  
along but them and took us completely  
by surprise I wrote to him but in  
stead of answering my letter with frank  
and proper thought - he would answer  
it - in person and we were right glad  
to see him I best don't you believe it

I received a letter from Greatly  
quite a while ago he was well and  
was then at Alexandria VA he  
did not seem to think he would get  
very soon what do you think about it  
do you think you or him either will  
get home before your time expires

Well Uncle Leth - I wish you  
were going to be here to attend the  
fair which comes off next week and  
I suppose we shall have a grand  
affair for such we are anticipating  
now and I hope we will

We are having a very dry time about now and dusty you never know Camp Meeting commences tomorrow if that does not bring rain I do not know what will I guess we shall not have any until after the fair If that does not bring rain for it seldom fails if it is ever so dry

The season at Paraloga is about at a close and it seems to me to be as if it had been a very short summer but we have had a great many visitors the week of the races the Union Hotel dined over thousand two hundred and the Congress one thousand and the other hotels in like proportion so we were pretty full

I do not think of much more this evening so I guess I will stop and get off to bed for tomorrow will be working day if it ever comes and I shall have to help mother wash before I go to school

so I will close by bidding you  
good night and pleasant dreams.
