Dear Brother

I Received
your Letter of the 27th of
New years Night and Was
Glad to hear from you and
hear that you Was Well
it found as in Good health
and We are the same yet
I have Not Begn to Meeting
since you Was here But
have been burly once
I Was over to the mill
Drawing on Logs and She
come out to the mill
She is a Gay Girl
I have been to see mother
she has Been verry Sick
But is Better now She
Got up and put on her
dress the Day that I Was

there that was Friday
I went Down Thursday Night
I Come Back on Friday
She thinks you will have
forgotten her as you dont
write they have wrote
two or three Letters to
Christopher And had not
heard from him when
I Come from there
We have had some Snow
since you went from
here the Sunday after
you left it fell two
feet deep and the next
Sunday it Rained and
the Snow almost went off
And then the next Thursday
- it Began to Snow and
it Snowed until Saturday
Noon the Snow fell
some where near three
feet deep so we have had

About five feet of Snow
in two Weeks And it Snows
Now But I hope it
Wont Come more than
five feet this time
