heart would break she enjoyed herself
While he was here he did not make
a long stay he only ^{had} ten days to stay

Beth I had my Photographs taken Yesterday
& if you will answer this letter vite off
I will send you one that if they are good
I hope they will be good & then I shall be looking
for one from you It is very lonely here to day
althrough it is a very pleasant day if you where
it would be more pleasant my Sisters &
I are going to the Cemetery to d and I
wish you was here to walk along
O. Beth. My Mother is not here to comfort
us to day as she was last Spring. we
shall go to day where she is sleeping. how
sad I shall feel I presume you feel almost
as bad as I do for you are so far
away from your mother it is almost
like death to have them so far off
but you have hopes that you will
see her yet & I have not

I can not write much this morning
I shall do betwixt time

You must write as soon as you get
this I hope that you will remember

I am sure that I shall you & may it be
that we shall soon meet I hope that you
will be more prompt in corresponding & I will
do the same
