In a letter rec^d last eveg. from Edward, Dated near Harrisonburg Va. Sept. 28. – he says – "first of all Frank Tiemann is well, but a prisoner. We have heard from him. Anthony Tiemann is safe." – So far as their safety is concerned this is truly good news. He says his brigade of about 1800 men lost 600 in killed wounded prisoners &c. that they were in the thickest of the fight in both battles and "behaved splendidly"! Ned's Superior officers have again recommended him to the War Dept. for promotion –
