Danville Va. Feby 11<sup>th</sup> 1865

Dear Father –

I was this morning made exceedingly happy by the receipt of two letters from you, one of Jany. 19<sup>th</sup> & the other Jany. 30<sup>th</sup>. I am glad that you have sent me some clothes as mine are nearly worn out & the change will be agreeable. I will write to day to Purcell, Ladd &Co & see if I can make an arrangement with them for my supply while a prisoner. We have every hope & belief in our speedy exchange as every thing appears to be tending that way. I may draw on you for some money as there is a gentleman here who furnishes Confederate funds for drafts on New York. Some boxes have arrived this morning. I hope mine is among them. Tell Harry that Lieut. G.H. Putnam who studied with him in Germany is a prisoner here & has shown himself a friend indeed. Send my regards to Edward & tell him it will be a happy day when I rejoin the regiment. Love to Grandmother. Love to all the rest.
