

THE RED RIVER EXPEDITION.

Official Report of Gen. Banks.

To the Secretary of War.

Sir: While engaged in earnest efforts to effect the capture of Galveston, with a view to the general operations contemplated for the winter campaign...

Having made known my plan of operations on the coast, and fully stated at different times the difficulties to be encountered in movements by land in the direction of Alexandria...

Applied to this dispatch on the 23d of January, stating that, "with the forces proposed," to wit: Gen. Sherman and Gen. Steele, and my own disposable force...

In order that the inherent difficulties attending the proposed campaign, which, in my opinion, was the most likely to gain attention, I directed Major D. C. Houston, Chief Engineer of the Department...

On the 4th of April, Col. O. P. Gooding, commanding a brigade of cavalry, engaged a party of 100 men north of the Red River...

The fleet was directed to Segoy Bayou, opposite the mouth of the Red River, where a communication was established with the land forces...

The disposition of the enemy's forces at that time, according to the best intelligence obtained, was as follows: Macruder had about 20,000 men of all arms...

To meet these forces of the enemy it was proposed to concentrate in some general plan of operations 15,000 troops under command of Gen. Steele...

Having been charged by the President with duties not immediately connected with military operations but which were deemed important and required my personal attention...

On the 13th of March, 1864, the cavalry of the Sixth Army Corps, under Brig. Gen. Mower and one division of the Seventeenth Corps, under Brig. Gen. Kirby Smith...

Smith landed at Simmsport, on the Atchafalaya, and proceeded at once toward Fort De Russy, carrying it by assault at 4 o'clock on the afternoon of the 14th...

Gen. Lee of my command arrived at Alexandria on the morning of the 10th. The enemy in the meantime continued to occupy the town of Alexandria...

While at Alexandria, on the 21st inst., a movement was made against the enemy posted at Henderson Hill, 25 miles in advance. The expedition consisted of three brigades of Gen. A. J. Smith's command...

On the 4th of April, Col. O. P. Gooding, commanding a brigade of cavalry, engaged a party of 100 men north of the Red River, in which the enemy was defeated with considerable loss...
