## Dear All,

Research continues apace on the 169<sup>th</sup> New York State Volunteer Infantry Regiment, and I thought you may be interested in reading a newspaper article that appeared in the Albany *Times Union* on Presidents' Day, this past Monday, that describes the search for the stained glass memorial window to the regiment, the only known memorial specifically dedicated to the 169<sup>th</sup> N.Y. As we approach the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the formation of the 169<sup>th</sup>, the thought has occurred to me that it would be a good idea to start sending a bi-monthly update about interesting developments concerning research of the regiment, and you are reading the inaugural edition!

"When will the history of the 169<sup>th</sup> be published?" With the explosion of data concerning the 169<sup>th</sup> being made available by Google Books and other sources on the Internet, as well as a continuing robust level of inquiries from descendents of the soldiers and other interested parties, I think I still have another 3-5 years to go, but it is hard to say. The history of the 169<sup>th</sup>, along with

the biographies of Colonel and Brevet Brigadier-General John McConihe, and Brigadier-General Alonzo Alden, will be about 2,000 pages each, far larger in scope than the average regimental history or biography of a regimental commander, principally due to the fact that these books will be self-published in a digital format.

One of the goals of the bi-monthly updates will be to ensure that everyone is equally up-to-speed in terms of general information about the regiment. Hopefully, this information will provide you with a good overview of the 169<sup>th</sup> as I continue my task.
